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A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL AND REGIONAL SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS OF LOUDON COUNTY, PHILADELPHIA, GREENBACK AND THE PLANNING REGIONS OF LENOIR CITY AND LOUDON, ARTICLE III, GENERAL REQUIREMENTS AND MIMINUM STANDARDS OF DESIGN, C. LOTS

WHEREAS, the Regional Planning Commissions, in accordance with <u>Tennessee</u> Code Annotated §13-3-401 through §13-3-411 and §13-4-301 through §13-4-309, may adopt and amend regulations governing the subdivision of land; and

WHEREAS, subdivisions must be conceived, designed, and developed in accordance with the sound rules and proper minimum standards as established in the Regional and Municipal Subdivision Regulations to protect the interests of the entire community; and

WHEREAS, subdivisions of land become a public responsibility in that public services customary to urban areas must be provided and the welfare of the entire community is thereby affected in many important respects; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Planning Commissions strive to cooperate with local authorities by conforming to consistent guidelines of community development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Regional Planning Commissions that the Subdivision Regulations be amended as follows:

Section 1. Article III., General Requirements and Minimum Standards of Design, C. Lots, subsection 2. Arrangement, be amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

2. Arrangement

Insofar as practical, side lot lines shall be at right angles to straight street lines or radial to curved street lines. Each lot must front for a minimum of fifty (50) feet upon a public street or permanent (B. 15) private easement, this width to be maintained continually from the street until reaching the building setback line, except in special instances such as cul-de-sacs, in which case each lot must have frontage of at least forty (40) feet.

Section 2. Article III., General Requirements and Minimum Standards of Design, C. Lots, subsection 3. Minimum Size, a., be amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

a. All lots served by public water and sanitary sewer systems shall not be less than seventy-five (75) feet wide, (or as required in the zoning district) at the building setback line nor less than seventy-five hundred (7500) square feet in area.




