NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission that the Zoning Resolution of Loudon County, Tennessee be amended as follows:

That in subsection C. <u>Uses Permitted as a Special Exceptions</u> add the following section:

14. High Density Block Chain Data Centers (Crypto Currency Mining) Facilities. Note: Facilities must use immersion systems only.

WHEREAS, the Regional Planning Commissions, in accordance with <u>Tennessee</u> <u>Code Annotated</u> §13-3-401 through §13-3-411 and §13-4-301 through §13-4-309, may adopt and amend regulations governing the subdivision of land; and

WHEREAS, subdivisions must be conceived, designed, and developed in accordance with the sound rules and proper minimum standards as established in the <u>Regional and Municipal Subdivision Regulations</u> to protect the interests of the entire community; and

WHEREAS, subdivisions of land become a public responsibility in that public services customary to urban areas must be provided and the welfare of the entire community is thereby affected in many important respects; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Planning Commissions strive to cooperate with local authorities by conforming to consistent guidelines of community development; and

WHEREAS, a notice of public hearing and a description of the resolution appeared in the Loudon County newspaper, the <u>Daily Edition</u> on January 16, 2023, consistent with the provisions of <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, §13-7-105, and

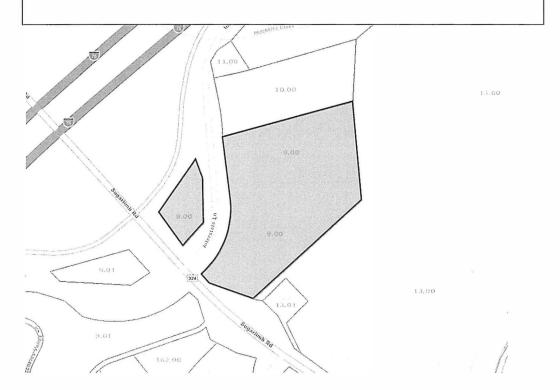

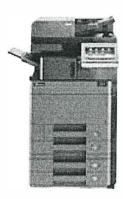

WHEREAS, The Public Building Authority of Sevier County, Tennessee (the "Authority"), has previously issued its Local Government Public Improvement Bonds, Series IV-H-1 dated October 25, 2001 (the "Original Bonds"), the proceeds of which were loaned to Loudon County, Tennessee (the "County"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority entered in an interest rate swap arrangement (the "Swap Agreement"), which presently serves as an interest rate hedge for The Public Building Authority of Sevier County, Tennessee's Local Government Public Improvement Bonds, Series E-3-C Bonds (the "Bonds"), which Bonds refunded bonds issued by the Authority to refund the Original Bonds; and

WHEREAS, payments under the Swap Agreement are paid on behalf of the Authority by the County through a loan agreement between the County and the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that it is advisable due to current interest rates to terminate the Swap Agreement, and the County desires to request that the Authority terminate the Swap Agreement; and

WHEREAS, in connection with such termination, certain amendments to the Swap Agreement may be necessary to facilitate such termination and to comply with certain requirements under the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the "Dodd-Frank Act"); and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the foregoing, the Board desires to: (i) approve the termination of the Swap Agreement, (ii) authorize any and all amendments to the Swap Agreement as are necessary to facilitate the termination and to comply with the Dodd-Frank Act, and (iii) authorize such other actions as are necessary to accomplish the termination and compliance with the Dodd-Frank Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commission of Loudon County, Tennessee, as follows:

Section I. Amendment and Termination of the Swap Agreements. The County hereby approves and requests the termination of the Swap Agreement, at the request of the County, and authorizes such amendments to the Swap Agreement, if any, as are necessary to accomplish the termination and compliance with the Dodd-Frank Act. The County Mayor is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver such amendments and termination agreements in the name and on behalf of the County as shall be necessary or appropriate to accomplish the termination of the Swap Agreement and compliance with the Dodd-Frank Act. In connection with the execution and delivery of such amendments and termination agreements, the County Mayor of the County is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to execute all such documents, instruments, and/or certificates and to do all such acts and things as may be necessary or appropriate to terminate the Swap Agreement and to ensure ongoing compliance with the Dodd-Frank Act in connection therewith. The County is furthermore authorized to make a termination payment relating to the Swap Agreement at the current market value thereof less any discount offered by the counterparty thereto.

Section 2. Further Actions. All acts and doings of the officers of the County which are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this Resolution and in furtherance of the termination of the

WHEREAS, The Public Building Authority of Blount County, Tennessee (the "<u>Authority</u>") has previously issued its Local Government Public Improvement Bonds, Series E-3-C, dated July 31, 2008, as reissued for federal tax purposes on June 7, 2013 (the "<u>Series E-3-C Bonds</u>"), pursuant to an Amended and Restated Indenture of Trust, dated as of June 1, 2008, the Series E-3-C Supplemental Indenture of Trust, dated as of July 1, 2008 and the Series E-3-C Second Supplemental Indenture of Trust dated June 1, 2013 (collectively the "<u>Series E-3-C Indenture</u>") for the purpose of making a loan to Loudon County, Tennessee (the "<u>Borrower</u>") pursuant to an Amended and Restated Loan Agreement dated June 1, 2013 (the "<u>Series E-3-C Loan Agreement</u>"); and

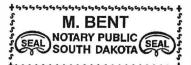
