MINUTES

LOUDON COUNTY SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL COMMISSION

June 15, 2023

The Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission met on June 15th, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. at the Loudon County Annex Building. The commission was represented by Chairman Mr. Adam Waller, Ms. Pat Hunter, Mr. Larry Rowland, Mr. Gary Busch, Ms. Monty Ross with Mr. David Hall absent and not in attendance. Other attendees included Republic Services representatives; Mr. Mike Classen, Mr. David Hollinshead, and Ms. Taylor Bobich. Additionally, the commission's appointed attorney Ms. Elizabeth Murphy was present.

Chairman Mr. Adam Waller called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m.

Chairman Mr. Adam Waller opened the floor for items of public concerns – comments:

Public Comments:

- Richard Anklin of Tellico Village -
 - regarding last meeting's minutes adjustment. Point on C2 and C4 cells closure if brought up to final closer of the expansion cells would then close out in 2036 & 2038. Could Republic clarify why this is not being shown in latest closure estimates and confirmation.
 - Why all the MOTIONS made don't include the vote and final status, will be updated in future.
 - O Mr. Hall not here, Contract statement while Republic is managing landfill and any cell that gets closed, they are responsible to post-closure cost estimates. Discussion on Bond total amount. Does not want to see any language in audit report that absolves Republic of any post closure cost care while operating landfill including cells C1, 2, 3, 4 up to 2038. Once closed it will be Loudon County responsibility. Republic Post closure cost doesn't become Loudon County responsibility until total landfill is closed and handed over.
 - Discussion of language in 2nd Amendment vs. Audit Report, contact financial assurance to review language and clarify. Pg 18 last sentence "In addition the Amended Contract requires ..." LCSWDC was supposed to fill that our, follow up needed.
 - Ms. Hunter The Audit verbiage needs to be approved by end of July, recommendation to establish audit committee and work with Lawyer to address language vs. Amendment to contract to be voted on in July meeting.
 - Mr. Anklin concern is the State could come in and raise their post closure costs from the current levels from \$13m up to something closer to \$20m for inflation.
- Ms. Gingrich raised concern related to back door being locked to support ADA requirements.

Roll Call Ms. Hunter, Ms Ross, Mr. Waller, Mr. Busch, Mr. Rowland present

MOTION: Chairman Mr. Waller asked for a motion for Nomination of Secretary –Mr. Rowland, Nominated Gary Busch, vote & motion carried - Unanimous

MOTION: Chairman Mr. Waller asked for a motion to approve March & April minutes as rewritten by Pat Hunter – Mr. Busch made motion, seconded by Mr. Larry, Vote taken approved - Unanimous

MOTION: Chairman Mr. Waller asked for a motion to approve May Minutes – Ms. Hunter had a number of changes, Mr. Waller requested that Ms. Hunter make the necessary changes and resubmitted for review and approval – tabled until next meeting.

Chairman Mr. Waller – Stated that there were no approvals for expenses tonight

- Ms. Hunter brought up a request for LCSWC to approve license for her Outlook account, only given partial license limiting her access. Not able to use laptop, wants to know what's involved with getting full license – Mr. Waller will discuss with IT
- Ms. Hunter also identified payment to Mr. Steven former attorney bill outstanding Mr.
 Waller: saw payment going out should be take care of.

Chairman Mr. Waller brought up Workshops & Committee Meetings – committee discussion on necessity of workshops.

- Ms. Hunter brought up she would like to see them continue, identified the permit part
 2 status & financials as example, County Commission has workshops, we should
- Mr. Busch recommends focused agendas and working sessions to get the work done
- Mr. Rowland only if it's necessary every month.
- Ms. Hunter brought up the current budget status
- Mr. Waller budget doesn't need a budget committee, just a workshop

Chairman Mr. Waller - Financials: submitted in the package, Ms Hunter raised issue that this commission needs to establish the budget for submission by end of July.

Chairman Mr. Waller – raised the need for administrative assistant to commission,

- Ms. Hunter brought up recommendations, handed out list previously made by Mr. Field
 of job scope she would like to see included within this role.
- Ms. Hunter brought up concerns having someone help with collection of data to meet contractual 25% recycling requirements which county may be falling short of

Chairman Mr. Waller raised the Drop Box status and noted that it is set up and will forward an email link out to all committee members.

Chairman Mr. Waller – Raised questions regarding workshop budget and next meeting.

- Mr. Busch made a Recommendation to hold Workshop next month focused on three topics, Budget, 10yr plan, and audit. July 13th
- Commission will then vote on the budget and any changes at the July 20th Commission meeting.

Chairman Mr. Waller – raised matter regarding client records from previous attorney –

• Ms Hunter – asked Mr. Waller if all have been scanned, not complete yet. Ms. Hunter to send what she needs.

Chairman Mr. Waller – raised matter regarding Published Greens agreement

- Ms. Hunter made a records request to get 10yr agreement, it isn't signed, not sure where county is regarding adoption of document.
- Ms. Murphy material received indicates Mr. Stevens had looked at it and clear statement that commission didn't have contract of operational responsibility. Would like to get the rest of the information to ensure County isn't responsible & liability with the money.

Chairman Mr. Waller – raised the matter of prior statement related to Regional Waste Authority, noting he misspoke at last meeting, that we have to have update of 10 yr plan to approve Part 1. We can approve Part 1 to get process started and convene within 90days as RWA to address and hold public hearing to address SW expansion either in July or Aug

- Chairman Mr. Waller Public notification via New Hearld 30 days in advance, whole list of requirements to be followed via TDEC
- Ms. Hunter Requested notice to residents with adjoining property, Mr. Waller requested list to send out personal notification notice
- Ms. Murphy notice requirements refers back to Title 8 chapter 44
- Chairman Mr. Waller Has worked with Ms. Murphy addressing Jackson Law language. Read two main concerns with outstanding Part 1.

MOTION: Chairman Mr. Waller asked for a Motion to approve part 1 application to TDEC – Motion made by Mr. Rowland, seconded by Mr. Busch, vote taken 4-1 in favor, no vote Ms. Hunter

Chairman Mr. Waller requested a review of cell closure modules from Republic

Mr. Classen responded and walked through the elements associated with cell closures.
 Currently working on Module J as active cell, surveys done on quarterly basis. Republic to provide last survey done in March along with latest survey along the laying out for all the closure grades on the final topography survey to allow lawyer to incorporate.

Chairman Mr. Waller requested review of Operations report by Republic – Ms. Bobitch went through packet provided by Mr. Hollinshead

- Airspace Utilization Report discussion & questions addressed and updated in June
- Ms. Hunter questions on Host & Security Fees Letter Tipping fees discussion tied to CPI May 2022 – May 2023, Ms Hunter requested information on the other fees including gate fee breakdown to be provided.
- Mr. Claussen addressed the CPI number could have a slight adjustment since number not release, May number came out earlier in the day and to be reflected in July report.

Ms. Hunter – regressed to approval of part 1, raised question if all the areas of concern were included into the draft that the commission approved. Mr. Hollinshead responded that all changes were incorporated into the packet submitted to Mr. Waller. Ms. Murphy asked Ms. Hunter if reason for no vote, Ms. Hunter confirmed, Ms. Ross raised procedural request to raise any questions by commission members prior to vote in future to help clarify potential no votes.

Ms Murphy – raised questions regarding airspace model to justify projections. Mr. Claussen responded regarding reporting periods varying resulting in large swings in volume on report.

Chairman Mr. Waller – asked question regarding to Annual PI Letter, packet has May & June 6th updates, Mr. Hollinshead answered

- TDEC Inspection Reports Ms. Hunter raised concern that April finding of leached found at site was not submitted to the commission prior to today. Mr. Hollinshead stated it was an error on their part and will address going forward.
- Mr. Claussen responded that all findings are being addressed and findings from April
 have been rectified. Stated communication with Mr. Hall prior to May, commission not
 update at commission meeting.
- Ms. Ross raised concern regarding the equipment fire on site, Mr. Claussen responded actions taken and part of ongoing operational PM program.

Chairman Mr. Wallen – raised a matter related to the Payment Options at Landfill – stating it was a citizen concern about use of a credit card, this was handled directly with Republic.

Chairman Mr. Wallen - Operating Contract 5.1 -

 Ms. Hunter requested that everyone on LCSWDC will be kept informed and apprised of any issues we need to be informed of.

Chairman Mr. Wallen request to Ms. Murphy LCSWDC attorney if any technical advisor updates

 Ms. Murphy, has someone ready as soon as the Part 2 is ready. Mr. Claussen has it ready, large pdf file, can provide file in format LCSWC will need the documents transferred. Mr. Wallen to add Part 2 into Dropbox. Mr. Claussen to send email with timing to Ms. Murphy. Mr. Claussen stated that the Hydro GO study is done & will also send final version. • Ms. Murphy – clarification of jurisdictional streams question raised by Ms. Hunter's motion request for drone aerial before & after views. Mr. Claussen responded that all requested is part of permit application requirements to be included into Part 2 of the application. Ortho Photos already done and can be provided.

Ms. Hunter raised question on approval of attorney expenses.

- Chairman Mr. Waller In favor of making a motion to approve a continuance retainer.
- Ms. Ross & Ms. Hunter believe the monthly stipends should be automatically approved if in the approved budget.
- Ms. Murphy requested that the LCSWDC work on a motion to that will address the Lawyer monthly stipends and additional charges in upcoming workshop and based on budget no need for monthly commission votes going forward.

Chairman Mr. Waller – stated the Agenda for next Workshop July 17 – LCSWC Budget, 10yr plan and Audit

Ms Hunter – raise question if anything heard from Mr. Byers related to Chairman Mr. Waller stated Mr. Byers drove by landfill, noted hydraulic leak, was being cleaned up, doing great job!

MOTION: Chairman Mr. Waller asked for a Motion to adjourn meeting 7:51pm – motion passed unanimously



Santek Environmental, LLC (Santek) has prepared this letter to provide an update to the CAP action items submitted to TDEC on March 15, 2023. The CAP identified action items and a schedule for reducing sediment track-out onto Highway 72, establish the appropriate stream buffer, and install and maintain effective erosion prevention and sediment control measures on-site to minimize the potential for sediment discharge to the unnamed tributary of Watts Bar Reservoir. Below details the corrective actions taken and completed for the items during the months of June, ongoing into July per the CAP. Action items per the CAP completed during the months of March, April, and May were communicated in a separate memo delivered on June 15, 2023, which is also attached.

June:

Sediment Pond Improvements

- Santek contracted Hunt Environmental Specialists (Hunt) to perform services in relation to the
 improvements for Sediment Pond #2 as detailed in the CAP. Work related to this began on Tuesday,
 6/14, and was completed by Saturday, 6/18, which is in advance of the June 30, 2023, timeline
 detailed in the CAP. Services included the following below:
 - Cutting a path down to the pond on the culvert side.
 - o Locate and remove sediment from the compromised culvert section.
 - Remove enough sediment and debris to install a sheet metal repair.
 - Use the sediment around the culvert to make a berm to pour the concrete into to incase the culvert and the riser.
 - Once the culvert and riser are repaired, cut and weld a nipple to the existing riser.
 - o Build per the design specifications, a floating skimmer.
 - Attach the floating skimmer to the riser pipe using the nipple and flex hose.
 - o Install a galvanized pipe surrounded by rip rap to guide the skimmer.
 - Cut and clear a path on the going away side of the culvert for inspection.

July:

Pond #2 Sediment Removal

- Santek contracted Promus Engineering, LLC (Promus) to complete an engineering evaluation of Sediment Pond #2 which was provided to Santek on March 31, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule. The evaluation is attached below. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine what repairs/improvements could be implemented. Recommended structural modifications were completed by June 18, 2023, in advance of the June 30, 2023, timeline from the CAP.
- From analysis, the pond appears to be adequately constructed to safely route larger storm events through the existing riser and emergency spillway. Per the CAP, the Facility needs to remove sediment from the pond by July 31, 2023. The Facility is planning to perform this work in-house during the month of July. The pond will be dewatered using a 6-inch pump and an excavator and dump truck will be utilized to remove approximately 2-4 feet of accumulated sediment from the outside edges and basin of the pond. The removed sediment will either be taken to the active waste working face for disposal or utilized for daily/intermediate cover. This work is expected to be completed by July 28, 2023, in advance of the July 31, 2023, timeline from the CAP.

Dear Mr. Hollinshead:

Santek Environmental, LLC (Santek) has prepared this letter to provide an update to the CAP action items submitted to TDEC on March 15, 2023. The CAP identified action items and a schedule for reducing sediment track-out onto Highway 72, establish the appropriate stream buffer, and install and maintain effective erosion prevention and sediment control measures on-site to minimize the potential for sediment discharge to the unnamed tributary of Watts Bar Reservoir. Below details the corrective actions taken and completed for the items during the months of May, ongoing in June, and into July per the CAP. Action items per the CAP completed during the months of March, April, and May were communicated in a separate memo delivered on May 18, 2023, which is also attached.

May:

Install Sediment Controls on the East Slope

 A stormwater diversion berm and two 24-inch down drainpipes have been installed on the Eastern slope of the Facility as of May 4, 2023. Seeding and temporary stabilization of the slope have been implemented per our stormwater management plan as of May 31, 2023. The timeline for completion of these items per the CAP is June 30, 2023, so the Facility has done so well in advance.

June:

Sediment Pond Improvements

- Santek has contracted Hunt Environmental Specialists (Hunt) to perform services in relation to the
 improvements for Sediment Pond #2 as detailed in the CAP. Work related to this began on Tuesday,
 6/14, and is expected to be completed by Saturday, 6/18, which is in advance of the June 30, 2023,
 timeline detailed in the CAP. Hunt is providing updates and communicating daily to make sure that
 the work is completed expeditiously. Services include the following below:
 - O Cutting a path down to the pond on the culvert side.
 - Setting up a pump to lower the water level.
 - Locate and remove sediment from the compromised culvert section.
 - Remove enough sediment and debris to install a sheet metal repair.
 - o Construct a concrete chute to get the mix down to the pond.

- Use the sediment around the culvert to make a berm to pour the concrete into to incase the culvert and the riser.
- Once the culvert and riser are repaired, cut and weld a nipple to the existing riser.
- Build per the design specifications, a floating skimmer.
- Attach the floating skimmer to the riser pipe using the nipple and flex hose.
- o Install a galvanized pipe surrounded by rip rap to guide the skimmer.
- o Cut and clear a path on the going away side of the culvert for inspection.

July:

Pond #2 Sediment Removal

- Santek contracted Promus Engineering, LLC (Promus) to complete an engineering evaluation of Sediment Pond #2 which was provided to Santek on March 31, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule. The evaluation is attached below. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine what repairs/improvements could be implemented. Recommended structural modifications are being implemented as mentioned above and are anticipated to completed by June 18, 2023, in advance of the June 30, 2023, timeline from the CAP.
- From analysis, the pond appears to be adequately constructed to safely route larger storm events through the existing riser and emergency spillway. Per the CAP, the Facility needs to remove sediment from the pond by July 31, 2023. The Facility is working with Promus to determine the extents of sediment removal needed and is working with third-party companies to develop quotes/scope of work to complete this work. The Facility expects to have these decisions finalized and contractor selected to implement this work by the end of the week of June 26th.

Santek Environmental, LLC (Santek) has prepared this letter to provide an update to the CAP action items submitted to TDEC on March 15, 2023. The CAP identified action items and a schedule for reducing sediment track-out onto Highway 72, establish the appropriate stream buffer, and install and maintain effective erosion prevention and sediment control measures on-site to minimize the potential for sediment discharge to the unnamed tributary of Watts Bar Reservoir. Below details the corrective actions taken and completed for the items during the months of March, April, and ongoing in May per the CAP.

March:

Install Rock Checks Downgradient of the Tire Wash

Santek installed the rock checks downgradient of the tire wash prior to March 31st in accordance
with the CAP schedule. The rock checks are inspected after each rain event to confirm proper
functionality.

Sediment Pond Engineering Evaluation

- Santek contracted Promus Engineering, LLC to complete an engineering evaluation of Sediment Pond #2 which was provided to Santek on March 31, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule. The evaluation is attached below. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine what repairs/improvements could be implemented. Below is a summary of the evaluation and recommended modifications which are scheduled to be completed by June 30, 2023.
 - Plug the opening in the bottom of the riser to enable the pond to retain a greater volume of stormwater.
 - Install a floating skimmer to provide extended detention to increase hydraulic residence time.
 - Install a sediment gauge in the pond that will mark the sediment.
 - Continue regular pond maintenance to include, but not be limited to, mowing the slopes, removing trees and brush from the inside slopes and outer berm, regularly removing sediment from the pond, and removing blockages in the skimmer.

From analysis, the pond appears to be adequately constructed to safely route larger storm events through the existing riser and emergency spillway.

April:

Construct New Access Road to Active Area

- A new landfill access road has been constructed as of April 30, 2023, following the placement of
 the initial lift of waste across the active cell in accordance with the CAP schedule. The access road
 was installed in accordance with the operational waste fill plan for the Facility.
 - In addition, stone is regularly refreshed along the roads leading to and from the active filling areas to help prevent mud/sediment tracking prior to the tire wash and traffic controls are actively enforced to restrict vehicle to stabilized areas.

Evaluation of Tire Wash by Manufacturer

- Santek reached out to the tire wash manufacturer, Moby Dick, to perform an evaluation of the
 functionality and sediment removal issues of the tire wash. Moby Dick conducted a site visit and
 provided their evaluation on April 28, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule.
 - From calculations based on the trucks received per day, Moby Dick evaluated that there is adequate water capacity for the tire wash but that it needs to be regularly cleaned and maintained. Moby Dick provided a maintenance agreement to Santek on May 1, 2023, and the tire wash has since been cleaned out with a vacuum truck and floc system maintenance on May 5, 2023. Santek will continue cleaning and maintaining the tire wash monthly and will likely utilize Moby Dick for the services following processing of the maintenance agreement.

Stabilize Disturbed Area near the Tire Wash

 The stabilization of the disturbed areas around the tire wash was completed before May 1, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule. Santek placed seed and strawing in the affected areas to help minimize erosion and sedimentation in the area.

Remove Sediment and Install Sediment Controls Downgrade of the Scale House

- Accumulated sediment had been removed and straw wattles were installed downgrade of the scale
 house as of April 10, 2023, in accordance with the CAP schedule. The straw wattles help trap
 sediment and minimize migration to the outfall point, SO-2.
 - In addition, regular sweeping either by hand or with the pavement sweeper occurs daily in this area to help minimize sediment accumulation.

May:

Install Sediment Controls on the East Slope

 A stormwater diversion berm and two 24-inch down drainpipes have been installed on the Eastern slope of the Facility as of May 4, 2023. Seeding and temporary stabilization of the slope is currently underway per our stormwater management plan. The timeline for completion of these items is the end of May 2023 which should meet the CAP timeline of June 30, 2023, required well in advance. 



Dear Mr. Haney:

In response to the Notice of Violation (NOV) dated February 16, 2023, and in accordance with the corresponding Corrective Action Plan (CAP) prepared by Promus Engineering, LLC (Promus) dated March 15, 2023, we have conducted an evaluation of existing Sediment Pond #2 at the above-refenced facility. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine what repairs/ improvements can be implemented to improve sediment removal efficiency.

EXISTING POND CONDITIONS

At the time of our March 3, 2023 site visit, which was subsequent to approximately 2 inches of precipitation over the previous 36 hours, the water elevation in the pond appeared to be relatively low. The bottom portion of the riser was submerged at the time of the site visit. As noted in the CAP, Sediment Pond #2 does not appear to be detaining influent stormwater for a time period that is adequate to promote settlement of the suspended solids. Design guidelines for sediment removal require that ponds slowly release a specific volume of water to allow time for suspended solids to settle to the bottom of the pond. Following is a summary of the observations of the as-built pond condition:

- The bottom of the pond was submerged at the time of the site visit, but it appears there is an orifice near the bottom of the riser that is causing short-circuiting in the pond.
- The pond appears to have been constructed to provide an adequate storage capacity to provide extended detention time for smaller, more frequent storm events. The current riser configuration does not appear to allow the pond to make use of this volume. To the extent possible, the proposed modifications in the following summary

items will maximize the storage capacity used and will provide extended detention time. These modifications should result in improved sediment removal efficiency.

RECOMMENDED MODIFICATIONS

We conducted an evaluation of the pond using Hydraflow Hydrographs, which is a software that uses various industry-standard and government agency design methodologies to analyze surface water hydrology, stormwater conveyance features, and sediment/detention ponds. The purpose of the evaluation was to determine what repairs/improvements can be implemented. Following is a summary of our evaluation and recommended modifications:

- We recommend plugging the opening in the bottom of the riser to enable the pond to retain a greater volume of stormwater.
- We recommend installing a floating skimmer to provide extended detention to increase hydraulic residence time.
- We recommend installing a sediment gauge in the pond that will mark the sediment depth at which pond cleaning should occur.
- We recommend continued regular pond maintenance to include, but not be limited to, mowing the slopes, removing trees and brush from the inside slopes and outer berm, regularly removing sediment from the pond, and removing blockages in the skimmer and riser as necessary.


Based on our preliminary analysis, the pond appears to be adequately constructed to safely route larger storm events through the existing riser and emergency spillway, therefore we will likely not recommend modifications to the spillway. We have included drawings of the proposed outfall structure modifications as Figures 1 & 2.

LIMITATIONS

This evaluation is based only on the aerial topography from December 15, 2022 and visual observation of the outfall structure. Republic should notify Promus prior to beginning work on the pond modifications so that we can verify existing pond conditions and modify our design if necessary. We recommend contracting with a surveyor to prepare a survey of the current pond conditions. The survey should include, at a minimum, existing pond grades, outfall structure detail with pertinent elevations and inverts, and emergency spillway geometry.
