Opening of Meeting:

BE IT REMEMBERED That the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Committee convened in regular session in Loudon, Tennessee on the 18th day of April 2024.

Committee Chairman Waller called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. eastern time.

Roll Call:

Upon Roll Call, the following committee members were present: Gary Busch, Monty Ross, David Hall, Adam Waller. Not present Larry Rolen,

Also present from Republic Services were representatives - David Hollinshead, Mike Classen and Teresa Fox.

General Public Comments:

Committee Chairman Mr. Waller called to the floor those who had any General Public Comments related to topics on the agenda. The following people spoke:

- 1.) Pat Hunter requested information at the last meeting and would like follow up;
 - a. Information on the landfill height
 - b.
 - c. Kimberly Clark clarification of information on the \$12 tipping fee when 2nd amendment states that no vendor or customer is to receive a tipping fee lower than stake-holders
 - i. Mr. Hall stated "unless approved by this Commission" which it was
 - d. Would like Ms. Elizabeth to address that issue
 - i. Mr. Waller Ms. Murphy should be in attendance at the Workshop
 - e. Also another issue of some fee being assessed that were not approved, sent out a month
 - f. Mr. Hall resigned asked why he was present.
 - g. Asked to turn on camera

NOTE: Video Camera was on and recording, at this time camera was unknowingly turned off per Ms. Hunter's request to turn camera on. Remainder of minutes are based on notes taken at time of meeting.

2.) Question regarding when the meeting notes – agenda is published and could it be published no later than Monday each month the week of voting meeting.

- 3.) Bryan Viars talked about the road, it was doing better and all of a sudden it went bad again for a period of time. Talked to Teresa and she stated that the site switched dump site location. What can be done as a better resolution? What's the long term solution and adding rock doesn't appear to be the answer.
- 4.) Brad Buttermore lives in Matlock Bend, questioned if it is our decision to just make the landfill as big and cheap as possible.

Loudon County APR

Committee Chairman Mr. Adam Waller requested an update on the APR from the ETDD representative on hand Mr. Loomis.

Mr. Mitch Loomis of East Tennessee Development District (ETDD) provided the following update:

- 1. One thing we are accountable for annually is to hit 25% recyclable, this year we have now hit 44% partially tied to Kimberly Clark material being approved into the site. He also Provided a breakdown of the top contributors by tonnage into Loudon County landfill to attain the state requirement.
- 2. Mr. David Hall asked a question that he heard the state is looking into increasing the goal in the future, Mr. Loomis was not aware of anything at this time.

Chairman Mr. Waller requested a motion to approve to submit the APR to the state

Committee member Ms. Monty Ross made the motion to send the APR

Committee member Mr. Dave Hall seconded.

Upon Voice Vote the motion PASSED Unanimously (4-0)

Approval of March 21st Minutes:

Committee Chairman Mr. Adam Waller requested that the March 21st 2023, Loudon County Solid Waste Committee meeting minutes be accepted.

Committee member Ms. Monty Ross made the motion to accept the minutes as written.

Committee member Mr. Gary Busch seconded the motion.

Upon Voice Vote, the motion PASSED unanimously (4-0).

Financial Assurance:

Committee Chairman Mr. Waller discussed that the state issued a new inflation adjustment increasing from \$13m to \$14m and the mayor's attorney is reviewing and that it will be signed off by the County soon.

Audit Update:

Committee Chairman Mr. Waller informed there has been a delay in the audit statup because of personal issues of the auditor. I will be started soon.

Invoices & Reimbursements:

Committee Chairman Mr. Waller noted that the invoices for this meeting was the pay sheet for tonight and an invoice from Ms Murphy for December 2023, January 2024, and March 2024. Mr. Hall made motion to approve the invoice, Ms. Ross seconded, vote taken and was approved 4-0.

Engineering Consultant Update:

Mr. David Hall made a motion to hire Canon & Canon local firm in town came recommended as the LCSWD engineering consultant, Mr. Gary Busch seconded the motion, vote taken, passed 4-0

Chairman Mr. Adam Waller raised the issue that one part of the 2007 agreement was 3.3 commission responsibilities, Ms. Murphy, the Commission attorney, would like to explore with Republic as covering this expense, Chairman Mr. Adam Waller will reach out to Canon & Canon tomorrow.

Chairman Mr. Adam Waller noted that there were some deficiencies noted in the report, they were addressed, and the updated report sent to TDEC. It is now under review.

Opening of Meeting:

BE IT REMEMBERED That the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission convened in regular session in Loudon, Tennessee on the 16th day of May 2024.

Commission Chairman Waller called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. eastern time.

Roll Call:

Upon Roll Call, the following commission members were present: Gary Busch, Monty Ross, Gary Hendricks, Adam Waller. Not present Larry Rolen,

Also present from Republic Services was representatives - Teresa Fox.

General Public Comments:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller called to the floor those who had any General Public Comments related to topics on the agenda. The following people spoke:

- 1.) JJ Cox Lenoir City Street and Sanitation Superintendent would like to know a phone number for the LCSW Landfill because he has truckload of tires (approx. 250 tires) and current line goes into a automated service, Teresa Fox provided the following phone number 865-458-2651 direct line to steel house for public use. It appears to go into an automated system, Teresa Fox will investigate this.
- 2.) Pat Hunter Follow up, still waiting to hear the current elevation of the landfill, Commission Chairman Adam Waller has the latest file from March, that shows the elevations, will email file to Ms. Hunter.
 - Raised the issue regarding the minutes that had Mr. Hall voting on after he
 had resigned, stating Mr. Hall should not have been allowed to vote.
 Commission Chairman Mr. Waller responded that Mr. Hall had an
 arrangement with the City of Loudon Mayor, and it should be taken up with,
 the mayor. Ms. Hunter indicated that she was going to take this matter up with
 the Comptroller.
 - Want to check on the environmental fees, when and where fees were submitted to the solid waste commission. Ms. Hunter stated that she hasn't seen anything and would like clarification if the fees are being assessed to only individuals or all.
 - She, also questioned, the tipping fees with Kimberly Clark being lower than the local stakeholders. Commission Chairman Mr. Waller gave response that

- the fee was approved by the Commission and validated by Commission's lawyer Ms. Murphy. Ms. Hunter requested to Commission Chairman Mr. Waller for a copy of the document from Ms. Murphy.
- Ms. Hunter received copies of the mud issues from Mr. Viars and wanted to know the status of the long-term solution. Commission Chairman Mr. Waller replied that he spoke with Ms. Murphy and that it appears the site is doing what it needs to do in accordance with the agreement.
- Questioned how tires are being handled, Republic representative Ms. Teresa Fox responded on status and length the issue existed.

Appointment of LCSWDC New Vice Chairman:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller requested nominations for New Vice Chairman open seat. Floor opened for nominations; Commission member Mr. Busch nominated Commission member Ms. Monty Ross, no other name submitted.

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller asked for a motion, Commission member Mr. Busch made the motion to elect Commission member Ms. Ross as the LCSWDC New Vice Chairman, Commission member Mr. Hendricks seconded, vote taken – approved unanimously (4-0)

Approval of April 18, 2024 Minutes:

Commission Chairman Mr. Adam Waller noted that the minutes from the April meeting were still being worked on and will be voted on at the June 20th meeting.

Financial Assurance:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller announced that finance has everything from the commission, and by Tuesday or Wednesday of next week, the commission should have the updated bond from Republic which will be kept at the finance department in the county operations building.

Audit Update:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller updated that Ms. Murphy and current auditor have discussed a few items in the audit and should have that submitted to him along with a few items from the previous auditor that was received today. The Commission should be able to vote on this at the June 20 meeting.

Invoices & Reimbursements:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller noted that there weren't any financial invoices for approval at this meeting.

Environmental Fee & Fuel Surcharge:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller this has been addressed

Kimberly Clark Tipping Fee:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller stated this has also been addressed.

Engineering Consultant Update:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller mentioned that the engineer is still learning everything they need to know about the Loudon County landfill they need to know and hopes to have an update by next meeting June 20th.

Part II Update:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller is in the final tech and peer reviews, small things that shouldn't require NOD, then public hearings, TDEC will make decisions after that happens.

Ms Hunter made a request from the floor for the amount of the bond, Commission Chairman Mr. Waller provided \$14,029,344.09 and the \$1m Performance Bond would be separate.

Republic Report:

Operations:

Report provided nothing specifically noted.

Commission member Ms. Ross commented on the daily log, it would be good to see how often something happens each month, it would also be good to have how long it took to resolve the issue included in the report. Ms. Fox noted that it could be added.

Commission member Mr. Busch raised a question on the leachate report regarding an outbreak, what was the breakout and how it was addressed. Ms. Fox responded to this specific outbreak, and it was immediately addressed. Two additional pumps were added outside the landfill and a request to make them permanent is under consideration.

Host & Security Fees:

Nothing noted

Airspace Utilization Report:

Commission member Ms. Hall raised a question Matlock Bend Landfill airspace projection schedule projection, to be full Dec. 31st, 2024, below it states full April 2024, how those two dates are different. Ms. Teresa Fox couldn't answer at this time, Commission Chairman Waller would follow up with Republic representative Mr. Hollinshead.

TDEC Inspection:

Loudon Financial Information:

Commission Chairman Mr. Waller noted that the financials were included. Asked if any further questions related to the Republic report. No further questions from the Commission.

Ms. Fox replied that a survey has been done on site and assured us there is adequate volume of dirt to support through permit approval.

There being no further business, a motion being duly made by Commission member Ms. Ross to adjourn, no second made, vote taken 4-0 passed. The May 16, 2024, Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission was adjourned at 6:22p.m.
