Mayor's
Comments:

- **Mayor Arp** announced that in the recent exit audit of the County General Fund there were no findings in the Fund or any Elected Official in Loudon County for the first time in at least 3 1/2 years. He thanked the **Commissioners** for supporting the appropriate changes and expressed appreciation to **Financial Director, Tracy Blair** and **Purchasing Director, Leo Bradshaw** for their contributions to making achievement of this long-time goal possible.
- Mayor Arp recently attended a meeting in Nashville with Senator McNally and Representative Matlock and representatives of the Department of Transportation to receive an update on the status of roads projects in the County. The Shaw Ferry Road Project will go to bid let on February 5th and construction signs should go up within 45 days following the bid let. This bid let has a completion date and the funds are in place so this project should continue forward. The Dixie Lee Junction Project has gone out for bid let for design work only and the design work will take up to 9 months. Mayor Arp will continue to work with Mayor McGill, the new mayor of Farragut, to secure funding for completion of this project.

The **Hwy 321 Bridge over the Fort Loudoun Dam Project** needs TIGER Grant funds to go forward but if they don't get the TIGER Grant, the State could approve Bonding Funds to allow going forward. The difference is whether the money used is Federal dollars or State dollars. This project does not include the fly-over. If the Grant is approved, the contract on this project will be let in December 2010.

- **Mayor Arp** continued by describing the conduct of the UT Presentation Meeting on Wednesday, February 3rd at the Courthouse Annex on the status of County Funding Operations. It will be conducted much like the County Commission Workshop Meetings.
- **Mayor Arp** and **Mr. Honeycutt** each spoke about the meeting on Monday, February 8th with the Loudon County School Board at the Loudon County High School at which the architects will lay out the plans for the three projects in Phase 1 of the School Building Program that have been approved by the Commission to the point of getting architectural drawings.

**Commissioner Gardin** responded to the salary criticism and defended the job the Commissoners do. He described the number of hours he devotes to commissioner duties on a regular basis and stated that he doesn't keep any of the money he earns.

**Chairman Bledsoe** asked if there were any further comments and, upon receiving none, he asked for a motion to adjourn.
