#### SPECIAL CALLED MEETING

(1) Opening of Meeting **BE IT REMEMBERED** that the Board of Commissioners of Loudon County, Tennessee convened in a Special Called Session in Loudon, Tennessee on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2020.

Commission Chairman Henry Cullen called the meeting to order at 6:03 P.M.

(2) Roll Call Upon Roll Call, the following Commissioners were <u>PRESENT</u>: Kelly Brewster, David Meers, Matthew Tinker, Gary Whitfield, Bill Satterfield, Henry Cullen, Harold Duff, and Van Shaver (8)

The following Commissioners were ABSENT: Julia Hurley and Adam Waller (2)

Thereupon Chairman Cullen announced the presence of a quorum.

Also present was the Honorable Mayor Buddy Bradshaw and Director of Accounts and Budgets, Tracy Blair.

(3) General Public Comments **Chairman Cullen** opened the floor for comments by the General Public. Pandora Vreeland spoke first, followed by Richard Anklin. Last to speak was Pat Hunter.

(4) 5 Year Contract with Priority Ambulance Mayor Buddy Bradshaw requested Commission to approve a five (5) year contract with Priority Ambulance Company. Mayor Bradshaw noted that Priority has always provided excellent ambulance services to Loudon County in the past. Other Commissioners also praised their services. Director of Procurement, Susan Huskey stated that both the Purchasing Committee and the Budget Committee recommended approving the contract. Commissioner Shaver made a motion to approve the contract with Priority Ambulance and Commissioner Brewster seconded the motion.

Upon Voice Vote, the motion PASSED unanimously.

(5) Money Allotment for Study on New Annex Mayor Bradshaw presented Commission with a recommendation to approve allotment of money to conduct a study on the placement of the new Annex. Mayor Bradshaw stated that the Budget Committee unanimously voted to allocate \$35,000 from Fund 101 to Fund 171; money that is refundable after the issuance of debt to get some hard prices/studies for an addition to the back of the courthouse, which would include a courtroom, some holding cells; it would address the needs we have as well as modernize. This would keep the old Courthouse in full use. Mayor Bradshaw further stated that we do not want to touch the Historic Courthouse until insurance is done

because right now it is a 100% funded through insurance project. Mayor Bradshaw stated that what the Budget Committee discussed is an addition to the back of the courthouse. This would be offices, courtroom, and sally port for officer's safety. In addition, Mayor Bradshaw said that per County Historian Darryl Tuck, the State of Tennessee said that is we match the design and construction of an extension to the Historic Courthouse, we can maintain our Historic Registry status. Commissioner Shaver stated he would make a motion. Mayor Bradshaw interjected before Commissioner Shaver made his motion that the total amount of money to be allocated from Fund 101 to Fund 171 would be \$37,400. \$35,000 would be to pay for the study on the courthouse and \$2,400 to cover the studies that were completed at the river front site.

Commissioner Shaver made a motion to approve the Budget Committee's recommendation for a study to build an addition or separate attached facility to the courthouse of a much smaller size/lower cost for a cost not to exceed \$35,000 for the study and \$2,400 for the river front site. Commissioner Meers seconded the motion.

Chairman Cullen called for a Roll Call Vote.

(6) MOU: Loudon County & Lenoir City Mayor Bradshaw presented a recommendation to approve an MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) from District Attorney, Russell Johnson between Loudon County and Lenoir City for permission to hold Criminal Court in Lenoir City for the simple fact that safety is better in Lenoir City and there are a couple of murder trials coming up that present the potential for danger. Mayor Bradshaw noted that the MOU was only temporary. Commissioner Shaver made a motion to approve the MOU and Commissioner Shaver seconded the motion.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This memorandum expresses the intentions of the Lenoir City, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee ("City"), and Loudon County, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee ("County"), as it relates to the use of facilities and real property located within the City limits and owned by the City.

WHEREAS, the historic Loudon County Courthouse suffered extensive damage from a fire which occurred on April 23, 2019, thus resulting in the loss of use of the Circuit and Chancery Court courtrooms, the offices of the Clerk and Master and Circuit Court Clerk, and other government agencies;

**WHEREAS**, a large, secure, and suitable courtroom is necessary for the administration of justice by the Loudon County Criminal Court;

WHEREAS, there is currently no building within the County Town (hereinafter "County Seat"), the City of Loudon, that is suitable to hold criminal jury trials;

WHEREAS, the City desires to lend assistance to the County and its citizens by providing a courtroom in a building and/or facilities in the Lenoir City City Hall ("City Hall") for the purpose of holding Loudon County Criminal Court; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated § 5-7-105(b) provides that a County may hold criminal court, including indictment, prosecution, and conviction of criminal defendants, inside buildings or facilities that are located within the limits of the County but outside the County Seat.

In consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereby enter into this Memorandum of Understanding whereby the City permits the County to utilize a courtroom located in City Hall as a temporary justice center for the limited purpose of Criminal Court jury trials, juror empaneling days or for such other purposes as the Criminal Court Judge may require until such time as the County obtains or constructs a facility adequately equipped to hold criminal court in the County Seat.
