

The Loudon County Quarterly Court met in regular session on June 3, 1974, at 8:00 P. M. with Chairman Pro tem Squire James M. Hartsook presiding and with Mrs. Addie Ruth Clarke, Deputy Clerk of said Court, present; Whereupon Sheriff Russell opened Court and led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

PUBLIC HEARING ON
STEEKEE ROAD
REZONING

Squire Hartsook explained that the County Judge was attending annual training with the U. S. Army Reserve, and that the first item on the agenda was a Public Hearing on the rezoning of a certain area of Steekee Creek Road in District 1 in the vicinity of the Ruth Smith property and the Corinth Baptist Church, changing it from A-2 (Rural Residential) to R-1 (Suburban Residential), as had been described in the Public Notice published in the Loudon County Newspapers. There appearing to be no persons present to speak on the question, Squire Hartsook declared the Public Hearing closed.

ANNOUNCEMENT



A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF
LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE, PURSUANT TO
CHAPTER FOUR, SECTION 13-405 OF THE
TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED, TO REZONE
PROPERTIES IN THE VICINITY OF THE CORINTH
BAPTIST CHURCH

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Quarterly Court, in
accordance with Chapter Four, Section 13-405 of the Tennessee
Code Annotated may, from time to time, amend the number, shape,
boundary, area, or any regulation of or within any district or
districts, or any other provision of any zoning resolution, and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Regional Planning Commission
has forwarded its recommendations regarding the amendment of
the Zoning Map of Loudon County, Tennessee, and the necessary
public hearing called for and held;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County
Quarterly Court that the Zoning Map of Loudon County, Tennessee
be amended as follows:

- I. That the properties as described as follows
and as shown on the accompanying map be
rezoned from A-2 to R-1: Tax Map 62, parcels
79, 78, 76, 26-5, and portions of parcels
77-0, 77-1, 26-1, 26-2, 26-3, and 26-4.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this resolution shall
take effect immediately, the public welfare requiring it.

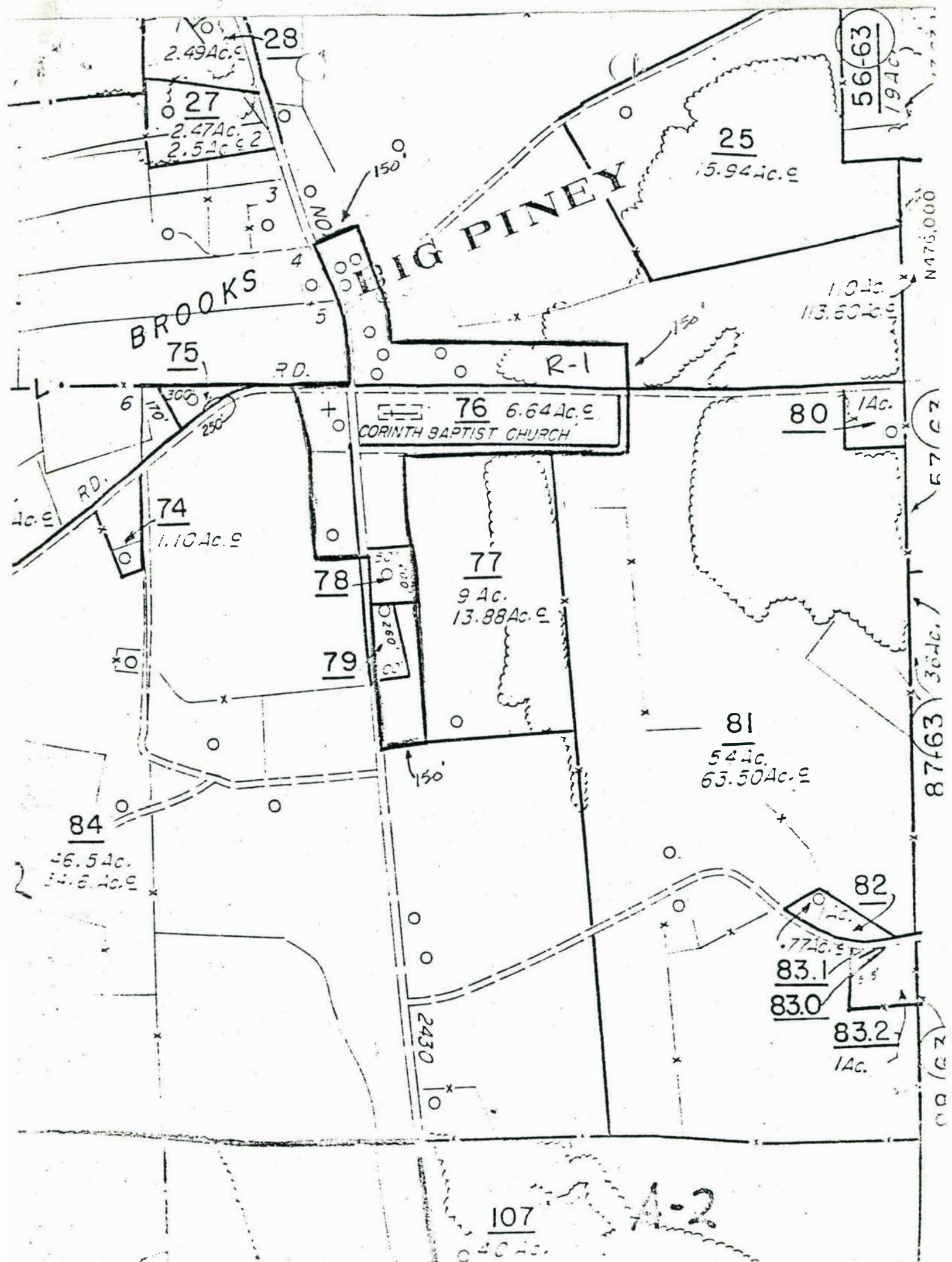
