MOTION TO PURCHASE
JIM FINE PROPERTY

After full and complete discussion it was moved by Squire Bledsoe and seconded by Squire Blair that the property known as the Jim Fine property which consists of approximately twenty-five (25) acres on the Harrison Road in Loudon County, Tennessee, be purchased for Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) of which is to be returned to Loudon County by Mr. Fine as a gift. It was included in the motion that said property should be bought subject to any and all required state approvals and that the site be architecturally and engineeringly approved for the purpose for which it is purchased. After additional discussion a call for the question was had with a roll-call vote. The vote is as follows: Blair, yes; Bledsoe, yes; Conner, no; Foster, passing; Hudson, yes; Hartsook, no; Williams, yes; Hamilton, yes; and Duckworth, yes.
