Deferred action on a proposal to realign Rest Camp Road pending the county road engineer's review. Recommended to county court that the Smith property (parcel 27, Map 16) located on old highway 95 at I-75 be rezoned from R-1, Residential to 4. C-2, General Commercial. A public hearing has been called for the October meeting of the county court to consider the request. Postponed the rezoning request of George Sarten due to his absence. Discussed questions concerning the placement of mobile homes on lots as requested by Mrs. R.L. Allmon. Recommended the rezoning of a portion of parcel 80, Map 17, from R-1, Residential to C-2, General Commercial, property owned by C.A. Wilson. A public hearing to consider this request has been scheduled for the October meeting of county court. Heard a report by road engineer Tom Davis concerning inspections of TVA road adjustments. 9. Granted preliminary approval of the Summitt/ Smaller subdivision located near Interstate 75 at old highway 95. Denied approval of a subdivision plat presented 10. by Ray Hall. The subdivision lots were sold illegally in June, 1976 at auction. Recommended that a portion of parcel 6.0, Map 42, owned by J.B. Whaley not be rezoned from A-1, Agriculture to R-1, Suburban Residential. The following reasons were given for not rezoning the property: (a) the property, located along SR72 in the Adolphus area is in a section planned for agricultural use as noted in the Loudon County Land Use Plan; (b) there are no urban-type services such as water and sewer in the area and none are planned; (c) to rezone the property would constitute "spot zoning", which has consistently been reviewed by the courts as an illegal exercise of the zoning powers. Spot zoning singles out a particular piece of property for special treatment without providing the same advantages to other property similarly situated. Ey heart A
