APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Squire Hudson seconded by Squire Blair that the minutes of the Quarterly County Court meeting of the May 2, 1977 be approved. The vote was unanimous for this.

RADIO COMPLAINT BY
DEPUTY VOYD CARRUTH

The Court opened the floor to any visitors who wished to speak on any subject not on the planned agenda. The Court recognized Deputy Sheriff Voyd Carruth who informed the Court of the troubles he had encountered with his communication system. Mr. Carruth played a tape for the Court which recorded the noise and interference on his car radio. Mr. Carruth asked the Court for help in getting some relief for this problem.

PLANNING COMMISSION
REPORT

The Court then recognized State Planner Dave Folz who gave the general report of the April 21 and May 19 Planning Commission meetings. These reports are attached hereto as Exhibit H.

APPROVAL OF
REZONING REQUEST
PARCEL 5.5, TAX MAP
43

It was moved by Squire Blair and seconded by Squire Bledsoe that the rezoning request of parcel 5.5, Tax Map 43 from A-1, Agriculture Forestry to C-2, General Commercial, located in the First Civil District near State Route 72 be approved. The vote was unanimous.

APPROVAL OF
REZONING REQUEST
PARCEL 52-2, TAX MAP
16

Squire Conner moved and was seconded by Squire Hartsook to approve the rezoning request of Parcel 52-2 and a 100 foot strip in 52-0 and 54-2, Tax Map 16 from R-1 Suburban Residential to C-2 General Commercial, located in the Fifth Civil District along the I-75 right-of-way. The motion passed approving the rezoning request.

POSTPONEMENT OF
REZONING REQUEST

The Court recognized Squire Hartsook who moved and was seconded by Squire Conner that a rezoning request by Mr. Robert Bivens be passed until the next Court meeting. The vote was 6 for and 2 against, approving the passing of this matter.

ACCEPTANCE OF
WATER TANK ROAD

Squire Vann moved and was seconded by Squire Conner that Water Tank Road near the Blount County Line leading into the water tank site owned by Tellico Area Service System be accepted into the County road system and the vote was unanimous for this.

ACCEPTANCE OF COUNTY
ROADS POSTPONED

Squire Bledsoe moved and was seconded by Squire Blair that the acceptance of roads into the County system requested by County road engineer Tom Davis in a letter to the Court be postponed until Mr. Davis could report directly to the Court. The vote was unanimous for this.

COMPLETION OF
INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT
STUDY

State Planner Folz stated to the Court that the Industrial Development Study was now in the County Judge's Office and was there for the Court's review.

ELECTION OF ROSS
WILKERSON TO BOARD
OF ZONING APPEALS

The Court recognized Squire Hamilton who nominated Ross Wilkerson to the Board of Zoning Appeals replacing John Cardwell. Squire Hartsook moved and was seconded by Squire Conner that nomination cease and Mr. Wilkerson be elected by acclamation and the vote was unanimous for this.

REELECTION OF
TED WAMPLER TO
SCHOOL BOARD

The Court recognized Squire Hamilton who nominated Ted Wampler to the Loudon County School Board. His nomination was seconded by Blair and Mr. Wampler was renominated unanimously.

USE OF BROWDER SCHOOL

Judge Russell then informed the Court that the Loudon County Adult Activities Center had requested the use of Browder School if the

School Board turned the building over to the County. Adult Activity Center Director Mrs. Paula Hawley was recognized by the Court to explain the program which they now have at the Adult Activity Center. She explained to the Court that they serve some 25 students and they have very cramped conditions in the Bacon Building and stated that Browder School would give them more room to improve their program. It was then moved by Squire Bledsoe and seconded by Squire Blair that Browder School be turned over to the Adult Activity Center contingent upon the Loudon County School Board giving the building to the County. The vote was unanimous for this.

PURCHASING COMMITTEE
REPORT

The Court recognized Squire Hamilton who gave the purchasing committee report. It is attached hereto as Exhibit WA.

LOUDON COUNTY MEMORIAL
HOSPITAL REPORT

Gay Hamilton, Hospital Administrator was recognized to give the Loudon County Memorial Hospital report. It is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

APPROVAL OF BUDGET
AMENDMENTS

The Court then recognized Squire Hudson who moved and was seconded by Squire Hartsook that the budget amendments be approved with the deletion of \$10,000 for the Greenback and Lenoir City Community Parks. The vote was unanimous for this.

APPROVAL OF TAX
REFUND

The Court then read a letter from Tax Assessor Emmett Carter who requested the Court grant a tax refund of \$744.00 to the Coulton Electronic Company. It was moved by Squire Hamilton and seconded by Squire Hartsook and the vote was unanimous to approve this refund.

POSTPONEMENT OF
APPOINTMENT OF TASS
BOARD MEMBER

It was moved by Squire Hudson seconded by Squire Hartsook that the appointing of a member to the TASS board replacing W. V. Kirkland be postponed 30 days. The vote was unanimous for this.

REAPPOINTMENT OF DON
PERKEY TO LOUDON COUNTY
LIBRARY BOARD

Squire Hartsook moved and was seconded by Squire Hamilton to reappoint Don Perkey to the Loudon County Library Board. The vote was unanimous for this.

DISCUSSION OF INDUSTRIAL
ACCESS ROAD

The Court then recognized Industrial Committee representative Bart Iddins who reported

on the proposed industrial access road leading to the FLIDCO Industrial Park on Carding Machine Road. Mr. Iddins informed the Court that 3 different proposals had been considered by the State. The Court recognized Mr. J. E. Greenway who represented several landowners in the area of the proposed access road. Mr. Greenway asked the Court to carefully consider the proposal which would build a new road from SR 72 directly straight across the Kline land to Carding Machine Road. The Court felt that it would be better to pass this matter so that closer study could be done in the next 30 days.

STATION


