MAJOR CHANGES TO COUNTY GOVERNMENT BECAUSE OF THE APPROVAL OF PROPOSAL #11

- Changes terms of sheriff, county judge, and county court members to four years--unlimited number of terms.
- Created the position of county executive presumably to replace the current office of "county judge."
- 3. Added the positions of "assessor of property" and "county clerk to the constitution" for the first time--changes county court clerk title to "county clerk."
- 4. Removes mention of the coroner, ranger, and constable from the constitution. (Nothing discussed concerning coroner or constable, but these two positions could be removed from statutes when bill is considered on house floor.)
 Proposal has been made to eliminate "range&"
- County "legislative body" would consist of no more than 25 members and no less than 9 with no more than 3 elected in each district.

The special legislative committee has stated preference to remove all judicial functions from current justice of the peace duties and make this office strictly legislative. The committee has also stated a desire to have court members run for election by <u>position</u> rather than for top vote-getters of all candidates in a district (e.g., position 1 may have three candidates and position 2 two candidates).

County judges would assume duties of county executive and serve until 1982.

Counties with chairmen instead of judge would run for county executive this August.

Counties of the 1st and 2nd class (Knox and Hamilton) would elect a county executive this August, even though they already have a county judge.

The special committee of the legislative will meet again on April 12 to consider possible changes and then make its recommendations to the full legislative.

The Loudon County Regional Planning Commission met in regular session on March 16, 1978, and considered the following items:

Mr. Lowe wanted to erect a billboard. The matter was deferred to the next meeting so that a representative from the Tennessee Department of Transportation could be present to answer questions regarding the state regulation of billboard locations.
