- 2. Voted to recommend the rezoning of a 1.82 acre tract located at the intersection of U. S. 11 and Robinson Drive across from Dutton's Trucking Company from R-1, Suburban Residential to C-2, General Commercial. The property is owned by Mr. Avery McGinnis (5th District). A public hearing has been scheduled for the June meeting of the court.
- 3. Voted to recommend the rezoning of a ½ acre tract in Parcel 3-1, Map 52 from A-2, Rural Residential to C-2, General Commercial (4th District). The property is owned by Mr. S. T. Shubert. Mr. Bill Lowe was wanting the property rezoned so that he could lease it and erect a billboard. The site is located off the R.O.W. of Interstate 75. A public hearing has been scheduled for the June meeting of county court.
- 4. Deferred a rezoning request by Mr. Johnny James for a 10 acre tract off Prospect Road. Mr. James wanted the property rezoned from Agriculture to C-2, Commercial so that he could buy it and relocate his body shop and junkyard. The matter was deferred so that a survey could be made of the property.

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- 5. The planning commission voted to approve the final plat of Little Mountain Estates Subdivision and to recommend to the county court that the subdivision roads be accepted as public streets.
- 6. Appointed Ms. Betty Dope to be secretary of the Loudon County Regional Planning Commission.
- 7. Heard the staff's report on the mapping and survey work that is being done in the Huntsville community in association with the preparation of the county's community development application to HUD.
- 8. Heard the road engineer's report in which Mr. Davis recommended public acceptance of the Little Mountain Estates subdivision roads and in which he recommended that the county not accept the Walnut Street extension built by the Lenoir City Company because it was not built according to plan or to the specifications of the Lenoir City Subdivision Regulations which call for the pavement width to be 26' wide. The road ranges in width varying from 24' to 25'6". However, the Loudon County Planning Commission voted to recommend acceptance of the road since all other requirements were met.



AN ACT To authorize the county judge of Loudon County to schedule certain meetings of the Quarterly County Court in the County Justice Center.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Any contrary provision of the law notwithstanding, whenever inclement weather conditions would make meeting in the Courthouse impractical, the county judge of Loudon County shall be authorized to schedule any session of the Quarterly County Court in the County Justice Center.

SECTION 2. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Quarterly County Court of Loudon County at any regular or special session thereof. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the Quarterly County Court and certified by him to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 2.
