Russell, County Judge presiding and Riley Wampler, Clerk of said Court present; Whereupon, Sheriff Joe Sims opened Court, led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, and introduced the Reverend Charles Redmond who gave the invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Hudson seconded by Blair that the minutes be approved as presented. The vote was unanimous.

RECOGNITION OF VISITORS

At this time the Court recognized visitors in the audience who wished to speak to the Court on various matters.

Paul Kerley addressed the Court in connection with his termination from employment with the County.

Forest Clark, representing the Loudon County Humane Society, requested the Court to assist in supplying funds for the continuation of the animal shelter.

Odell Justice complimented the Court on being reelected.

Frank Hildreath of Lenoir City requested the Court to consider funding automobiles for the Sheriff's department and other related items.

The Court then recognized the Mayor of Greenback who read his comments concerning the operations of the Court.

Ray Houk approached the Court concerning the fact that the Court had abolished his position of County Coroner and requested that consideration be given to having him reinstated as such.

Rufe Wilson requested that Gene Crawley, the new Road Supervisor, be given additional funds to help with the roads.

At the request of members of Court a special session of the Court was called to consider various items which were not on this agenda but need attention. The following items are to be considered

at the special session which will be on Monday, September 25, 1978 at 7:00 p.m.: 1. Consideration of the Process Server 2. Consideration of the County Coroner's job. 3. Consideration of Resolution to guarantee Clerk's Salary.

PLANNING COMMISSION
REPORT

Dave Folz of the Loudon County Planning commission gave the general report of the July meeting and presented rezoning request for Map 76, Parcels 98, 99, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105, 106, 107, 108, 109 from A-2 Rural Residential to R-1, Suburban Residential. On motion of Squire Hudson seconded by Squire Hawk the property was unanimously rezoned. Being attached hereto as Resolution No. 74-78, Exhibit A.

PURCHASING COMMITTEE
REPORT

Purchasing Committee report was given by Buddy Jenkins, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

PURCHASING COMMITTEE
APPOINTED

Court appointed the following members to serve on the Purchasing Committee: Roy Bledsoe representing Judge Russell, Doyle Arp, Richard Hawk, Glenn Luttrell, and Bart Eldridge. The Court gave its approval upon motion of Squire Hudson and seconded by Squire J. Will Jones. The vote was unanimous.

HIGHWAY BUDGET
APPROVED

The Court explained that after September 1, 1978 there was no longer a three division highway department but that the budget would now be combined in one budget. Upon motion of Squire Blair and seconded by Squire Eldridge the Highway Commission's budget for the remainder of the year was adopted as presented. It is attached hereto as Exhibit C. One No vote by Squire Hudson.

BUDGET COMMITTEE
APPOINTED

The Court then appointed the budget committee for the coming year. As required by law Judge Russell appointed himself as Chairman of the Committee and Jim Hartsook, Jim Blair, J. G. Hudson, J. Will Jones, serving as the other four members.

J. D. CLICK APPOINTED
TRUSTEE FOR NEWTON
BOGART ESTATE

Several years ago Newton Bogart died and left the County \$2,500.00 At that time the Court appointed J. V. Schrimsher as Trustee to administer the estate for the County. The court has been advised that Mr. Schrimsher wished to be relieved of his duties as Trustee and requested that J. D. Click, the new County Trustee be appointed. Upon motion of Squire Hudson and seconded by Squire Jones the Court unanimously approved the transfer and appointed J. D. Click as Trustee for the Newton Bogart Estate.

DISCUSSION OF
JUDICIAL COMMISSIONER

The Court discussed the position of Judicial Commissioner which was created at the last

regular scheduled meeting of Court Squire
Jim Blair moved and seconded by Hartsook that the
position be abolished. Squire Bledsoe moved to
amend the motion by requesting that the State
Legislature be asked to either amend or repeal
the act which authorized the establishment of
Judicial Commissioner to return the status of
law as it was prior to the creation of the Judicial
Commissioner post. His amendment was seconded by
Squire Hudson. The vote was unanimous for the
amendment and voting on the original motion carried
without any "no" votes.

Squire Blair then read a resolution to
the Court which would guarantee the salary of the
Clerk and have the effect of removing the Circuit
Court Clerk from the prohibitions of the act re-
stricting them from issuing warrants. His Motion
was seconded by Squire Hartsook. After discussion
a motion was made to table by Squire Hawk and
seconded by Squire Jones. The vote was unanimous
to table.

TASS RESOLUTION
APPROVED

The Court explained that an application an
grant was being prepared for filing with Farmer's
Home Administration in connection with TASS.
After due explanation and discussion and
representations made by former Judge Harvey L.
Sproul. The Court moved by Squire Hudson seconded
by Squire Hawk to allow Judge Russell to file
for the grant and loan. The vote was unanimous.

DISCUSSION OF
PROCESS SERVER

Squire Blair made a motion to abolish
the position of Process Server. It was seconded
by Squire Eldridge. After much discussion, Squire
Blair removed his motion and asked that it be
placed on the special called session.

RURITAN CLUB

Squire Bledsoe advised the Court that the
Ruritan Club in the Davis Community requested that
a lease be drafted and signed between the County
and the Ruritan Club for the purposes of using
the Davis School. The Court advised that a lease
would be drawn according to the discussion had
and present it to the next regularly scheduled
Court session for the Court's consideration.

ELECTION OF SCHOOL
BOARD MEMBERS BY
THE PUBLIC

Upon motion of Squire Blair and
seconded By Squire Eldridge it was moved that the
area Legislators be advised that the Court requested
a bill to be drafted which would require the
popular election of the Loudon County Shool Board
Members consisting of nine members apportioned
exactly as the present County Court with terms
for four years. The vote was uanimous for this.

SALE OF LAND ON
MUDDY CREEK

The Court advised the members that
areas of land along Muddy Creek Road which had
been purchased during the right of way acquisition
for the road and portions of the same were now
not of any particular use to the County.

DISCUSSION ON PRISONERS'
BONDS

Upon motion of Squire Blair and seconded by Squire Bledsoe the Court unanimously passed a resolution to be sent to the area Legislators to consider amending the general law or passing a private act applicable to Loudon County which would alter or remove the requirements that trust deeds be drafted to the County in order for prisoners to make bond. Included in the motion was a similar division in connection with Notary Public's bonds. It was unanimously passed.

DISCUSSION OF BUSINESS
TAXES

Upon motion of Squire Bledsoe and seconded by Squire Arp it was unanimously passed that the business taxes collected by the Trustee's Office and handled through the Property Assessor's Office be turned over to the County Clerk. The County Clerk has a business personal property tax with the exception of large manufactureres who will continue to pay through the Trustee. JIM HARTSOOK APPOINTED
TO SENIOR CITIZENS' COUNCIL

Upon motion of Squire Blair and seconded by Squire Hudson the Court unanimously reappointed Squire Jim Hartsook to the Loudon County Senior Citizens' Council representing County Court.

NOTARY PUBLICS ELECTED

The following Notary Publics were re-elected or elected: Bobbie D. Hamby, H. L. Sproul, Sr., John L. Brown, Faye S. McDonald, Carolyn S. Nelson, Frank A. Harvey, and Hassalyne Walker, Mary Collins.

Court was adjourned until the special session.

SUBJECT: GENERAL REPORT - LOUDON COUNTY REGIONAL PLANNING
COMMISSION

The Loudon County Regional Planning Commission met in regular session July 20, 1978, and considered the following:

1. Recommended to County Court that a 3.7 acre tract located off Martel Road owned by Jack Hardin be rezoned from R-1, Suburban Residential to C-2, General Commercial. A public hearing will be held on the matter at the October meeting of the court.
2. Assisted Mr. Erwin Collins in his efforts to prepare a subdivision plat for property off Stockton Valley Road.
3. Discussed the problem with South Central Bell and their lack of compliance with the county's resolution dealing with work conducted in public road right-of-ways and the requirements for the posting of bonds. Mr. Davis, county road engineer, explained that he is trying to get South Central Bell to submit a bond for their work in county road right-of-ways. The commission voted to proceed with the appropriate legal enforcement remedies if South Central Bell fails to comply with the county law.
4. Requested that staff investigate a proposed Barite mining operation in South Loudon County.
5. Discussed a road proposed by Mr. Robert Bedwell and building work being done on the O. D. Hall property off U. S. 11. The commission directed the building commissioner to investigate the latter item and report back to the commission.
6. Heard the building commissioner's report and the road engineer's report.
7. Approved the planning Program Design and discussed grading, drainage, and soil erosion regulations.

RESOLUTION NO. _____

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER FOUR, SECTION 13-405 OF THE TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED, TO REZONE PARCELS 98, 99, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105, 106, 107, 108, AND 109, MAP 76, FROM A-2, RURAL RESIDENTIAL TO R-1, SUBURBAN RESIDENTIAL.

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Quarterly Court, in accordance with Chapter Four, Section 13-405 of the Tennessee Code Annotated may, from time to time, amend the number, shape, boundary, area, or any regulation of or within any zoning resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Regional Planning Commission has forwarded its recommendations regarding the amendment of the Zoning Map of Loudon County, Tennessee, and the necessary public hearing called for and held;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Quarterly Court that the Zoning Map of Loudon County, Tennessee, be amended as follows:

- I. That Parcels 98, 99, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105, 106, 107, 108, and 109, Map 76 located in the 3rd Civil District be rezoned from A-2, Rural Residential to R-1, Suburban Residential.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately, the public welfare requiring it.

WHEREAS it has been determined that there is need for public water service in selected rural areas in Loudon County, and

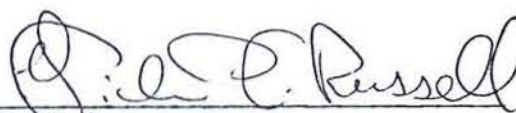
WHEREAS a project to extend water lines and necessary appurtenances has been defined and feasibility studies completed in connection with said project, and
