The Loudon County Regional Planning Commission met in regular session January 18, 1979 and considered the following:

- Heard a presentation by Mr. Charles Eblen, representing the Rivers Advertising Company in which Mr. Eblen stated that the Amoco billboard located next to the Little Mtn. Estates Subdivision would be removed by March 1st and that any court costs associated with the county's withdrawal from the court suit would be paid by the advertising company.
- Heard the Building Commissioner's and Road Engineer's reports.
- (4) Heard a staff report on: the solid waste disposal situation; meetings with TVA Board Chairman Freeman and TVA staff; the county road map project; revision of the Loudon County Subdivision Regulations to reflect the results of the Lenoir City 201 Wastewater Facilities Plan; and, the results of the random survey that staff conducted in the Huntsville Community for the county's community development preapplication. The application proposes a 3-year comprehensive program that would provide adequate water and wastewater service, improve the streets, and initiate a housing rehabilitation program and a slum clearance program.

MHEREAS, the Tellico Area Services System (TASS) was formed by Monroe and Loudon Counties in 1969 and 1970 for the purpose of providing necessary services at an economical cost to the people of Monroe and Loudon Counties through the construction of a water system, initially to serve parts of the southern areas of the counties, along with serving the extensive residential and industrial development expected from the proposed TVA Tellico project; and

WHEREAS, over an extended period of time the counties have obtained grants and contributions exceeding \$2,500,000 to construct the water treatment and distribution facilities at a cost of approximately \$4,290,000 with a replacement cost at the present time probably in excess of \$6,000,000; and

WHEREAS, Monroe County and Loudon County have "backed" the Tellico Area Services System by the issuance of tax deficiency bonds through the Farmers Home Administration in the amount of \$850,000 for each county, or a total of \$1,700,000; and

WHEREAS the early decision to organize TASS (composed of the Monroe County and Loudon County Boards of Public Utilities) was a significant commitment on the part of the two counties to work together immediately to provide water services, but with the prospect of providing other services to county residents in the future, to include possibly the operation of sewer systems in the counties, additional water extensions in various parts of both counties, the possibility of providing sanitation services, including the possible operation of a sanitary landfill, if such should become necessary or desirable; and

WHEREAS, because the Tellico project has not been completed,
and because the revenue from the Town of Madisonville as the largest
TASS water user is inadequate, there presently is insufficient revenue
from TASS to pay the interest and principal on the Farmers Home Administration

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bonds from actual revenues from the system; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding the substantial investment of time and money that has been made by the counties, because of these financial difficulties, questions recently have been raised as to whether the counties might be interested in "selling" or "transferring" the Tellico Area Services System, assuming that the legal and practical considerations relating to the commitments made with the various lending and grant agencies would permit such a transaction;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Monroe County Commission and the Loudon County Commission by joint resolution that the declaration is hereby made that there is no intention on the part of the counties to sell or transfer to any other governmental unit the Tellico Area Services System;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tellico Area Services System Board is urged to attempt to resolve the present difficulties by the best and most reasonable solution that will benefit the peoples of both counties and protect their interests.
