APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Commissioner Hudson and seconded by J. J. Blair that the minutes be approved as presented.

RESOLUTION FOR SHEILA MILSAPS

Commissioner Bledsoe presented a resolution memoralizing the life of Sheila Milsaps who died in an automobile accident on March 16, 1979 . It was seconded by Doyle Arp and the vote was unanimous. The resolution being attached hereto as Resolution No. 56-79, Exhibit A. .

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DISCUSSION OF ELECTION OF SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS

Judge Russell reported on the Legislation of the eletion of the school board members. After much discussion, it was moved by J. J. Blair. seconded by J. Will Jones that Judge RUssell name a committee of three (Doyle Arp, Bart Eldridge, and J. G. Hudson) tomeet with the school board members and get their feelings on the Legislation and also to see if they all could come to some kind of agreement. They are to report back at the May meeting. The vote was unanimous.

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EVACUATION PLAN FOR THE COUNTY

Judge Russell reported to the Commissioners he had asked Civil Defense Director Don Gagley, Sheriff Joe Sims and the Loudon County Resque Squad to develop an evacuation plan for the County. He said his action was prompted by the nuclear accident in Pennsylvania and the fact that Loudon County was within radiation range of the nuclear facility at Oak Ridge. He also said an evacuation plan could be useful in the event of natural disasters such as tornados.

FENCING ALONG BEALS CHAPEL ROAD Commissioner Hawk discussed the fencing along Beals Chapel Road and Judge Russell asked the Highway department to look into the matter.

It wasmoved by Commissioner Eldridge and seconded by Commissioner Blair that the following Notary Publics be elected: Boyd Lee Moats, James H. Simpson, Charles H. Davis, Charlotte Lawson, Ruth Hildreath, and John E. Farmer. The vote was unanimous.

SUBJECT: GENERAL REPORT - LOUDON COUNTY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION

The Loudon County Regional Planning Commission met in called session on March 14, 1979, and considered the following items:

- Voted unanimously not to recommend the rezoning of Parcel 38, Map 15 from A-2, Rural Residential to C-2, General Commercial as requested by the property owner Mr. Freeman R. Dishner. The commission felt it would be a spot zoning not in conformance with the land use plan and that it would adversely affect adjacent property values. A public hearing on the rezoning request has been scheduled for the May meeting of the County Commission.
- 2. Heard a presentation by Mr. Wallace Harvey who represented a group of residents that live off Shaw Ferry Road. Mr. Harvey and members of the community expressed a serious concern over the operation of a junkyard by Mr. C. Wilson. They explained that the junkyard was a health hazard, an eyesore, and with the 18-wheel trucks which often park on the roadside, it also constituted a road hazard especially since Shaw Ferry is very narrow. The planning commission recommended that the Building Commissioner swear out a state warrant and proceed with the legal enforcement of the provisions of the Zoning Resolution.
- Heard the Building Commissioner's report, the Road Engineer's report and the Staff report.


