79-80


WHEREAS, on the 24th day of February, 1980, WILLIAM H. POTEAT died in a private airplane crash; and




Exhibit A

RESOLUTION NO. 80-80

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER FOUR, SECTION 13-405 OF THE TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED, TO REZONE PARCEL 6, MAP 93 FROM A-2, RURAL RESIDENTIAL TO C-1, RURAL CENTER DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission, in accordance with Chapter Four, Section 13-405 of the Tennessee Code Annotated may, from time to time, amend the number, shape, boundary, area, or any regulation of or within any zoning resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Regional Planning Commission has forwarded its recommendations regarding the amendment of the Zoning Map of Loudon County, Tennessee, and the necessary public hearing called for and held;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission that the Zoning Map of Loudon County, Tennessee, be amended as follows:

- I. That Parcel 6, Map 93, said parcel being located in the 3rd Civil District off U.S. Highway 411, be rezoned from A-2, Rural Residential to C-1, Rural Center District.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately, the public welfare requiring it.
