SECTION 1, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Board of Commissioners of Loudon County, Tennessee, assembled in regular session on the 14th day of July, 1980 that the amounts hereafter set out are hereby appropriated for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the various funds, departments, institutions, offices and agencies of Loudon County, Tennessee, for the capital outlay, and for meeting the payment of principal and interest on the County's debt maturing during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1980, and ending June 30, 1981, according to the following schedule.

SECTION 2, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Court Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Register, Sheriff, and the Clerk and Master, and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State laws heretofore and hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or collected by the Trustee, County Court Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commission and/or fee collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized to be paid therefrom, and paid therefrom, shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the County General Fund as provided by Law.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the need shall arise, the Budget Committee may with the consent of any official, head of any department or division which may be affected, transfer any amount from any line item of appropriation to any other line item of appropriation in the same fund. Be it further provided that any such transfer shall be authorized in writing and signed by the Director of Accounts, County Judge, the Budget Committee and the department or divisional heads directly concerned. The School Superintendent must also receive the consent of the Board of Education for transfers within each main division of the budget and the consent of the Board of Commissioners for transfers between these main divisions as required by law.

One copy of this authorization shall be filed with the County Court Clerk, one with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one with each divisional or departmental head concerned. Aforesaid authorization shall clearly state the reasons for the transfer, but this provision shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfer within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any appropriation made by this resolution which covers the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or renumeration ofeach officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. But provisions for such salaries, wages, or other renumeration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for any department, agency, or division of the County in excess of the appropriation herein for such department, division, or agency of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute to the limit of expenditures of any department, division and agency ending June 30, 1980. The aggregate expenditures of any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specificially provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the fiscal year in which expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that certain school funds designated as "Clearing Accounts" have been included in the revenue and appropriations for the year ending June 30, 1981, as a memorandum only. It is expressly understood that the County Board of Education may not create or incur expenditures from these funds above actual revenue of such funds. It is further directed that no transfers may be effected between these Clearing Accounts and the operating school funds accounts.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there is hereby appropriated for Rural Road Construction on State-approved projects such amounts as may be from time to time be approved by contract with the State Department of Highways.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Judge and the County Court Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes to pay the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the fiscal year 1980-1981, have been collected, not exceeding 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made and the loan shall be paid out of revenue of the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the authority of Sections 5-1031 to 5-1039, inclusive, Tennessee Code annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Judge and countersigned by the County Court Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 1981.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent County property taxes for the year 1979 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 1981, shall be apportioned to the various County fund according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 1980. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly. Also, that payments in lieu of taxes from the T.V.A. shall be placed in the various funds of the County in the same proportion as the tax rate is divided except the portion that would ordinarily go go the Department of Education and Rural School Bond Fund will go to the Debt Service Fund.

Taxes collected in compliance with the Business Tax Act shall be placed in the various funds of the County in the same proportion as the tax rate is divided.

Interest on County investments shall be divided accordingly for the fiscal year 1980-1981. The first \$100,000.00 shall be placed in the County General Fund and the balance shall be place in the Bond Debt Fund. This excludes the interest on Loudon County Memorial Hospital Depreciation Funds which would be placed in the Loudon County Memorial Hospital Depreciation Fund, the Federal Revenue Sharing Funds which would be placed in the Federal Revenue Sharing Funds, the Rural School Bond Funds which would be placed inthe Rural School Bond Funds and the Special Bond Fund, which would be placed in the Special Bond Fund.

The first \$12,468.00 of the one-third of the second half of Loudon County's sales tax that goes to the Special Highway Fund shall go to the Highway Fund for the fiscal year 1980-81 to match the State's supplement to the Highway Fund.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at theend of that fiscal year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the fiscal year at June 30, 1980.

SECTION 11. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 1980. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of Commissioners.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF 93-80 \$250,000 TAX ANTICIPATION NOTES OF LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE, PROVIDING THE DETAILS THEREOF AND AUTHORIZING THE SALE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, There are certain obligations of Loudon County, Tennessee which become due July 1, 1980

WHEREAS, Revenues are not always sufficient to meet these obligations

WHEREAS, It is necessary to borrow temporary funds until revenues are available to substain county operation

THEREFORE, Be it resolved that the County Judge and the County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on tax anticipation notes to pay the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenues for the fiscal year 1980-81 have been collected, not to exceed 60% of the appropriation.

The proceeds of the loan shall be used only to pay expenses and other requirements of the General Fund for which the loan is made and the loan shall be paid out of the revenue of the General Fund for which money is borrowed.

The notes evidencing the loan authorized under this section shall be issued under the authority of Section 5-1035 of the Tennessee Code Annotated.

Said notes shall be signed by the County Judge and countersigned by the County Clerk, and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal no later than June 30, 1981.

At the June 19, 1980 meeting, the planning commission considered the following items:

- 1. Discussed Mr. Arthur Rice's proposal to construct a road to Parcel 7, Map 6 off Highway 95. It was determined that Mr. Rice owns a land-locked tract and that a right-of-way across adjacent property owners would need to be acquired by Mr. Rice. Also, the commission determined that the proposed road must be constructed according to the sub-division road standards contained in the Loudon County Road Acceptance Manual.
- Heard a report from Loudon County Road Engineer, Tom Davis, on the status of the road work in the Golf Course Subdivision on Huff Ferry Bend.
- Heard the Building Commissioner's report and examined charts on the building permit activity in Loudon County since August, 1979.
- 4. Examined population and employment estimates and projections for Loudon County. The following table is an example of what the commission discussed:
