SUBJECT: GENERAL REPORT, LOUDON COUNTY REGIONAL PLANNING  
COMMISSION

At the July 17, 1980 meeting, the planning commission did not have a quorum; however, the following matters were discussed in the form of a workshop:

(1) Discussed with Mr. James Collins his proposal to request a rezoning of a small tract near his house on U.S. 11 across from the old Lighthouse gas station. He stated that he wanted to operate an automobile repair shop on the premises. No official action was taken. The matter officially will be considered at the August meeting of the planning commission and a public hearing on the request will be held at the September meeting of the county commission.

(2) Heard the Building Commissioner's report and examined graphs which illustrate building permit activity in the county.

(3) The commission and staff examined the program design and discussed a possible amendment to the Zoning Resolution regarding the placement of the tenant houses in the A-1, Agriculture-Forestry District. The planning commission also discussed at length TVA's proposal to construct a 500 unit development on the shores of Tellico Lake in Loudon County. The lack of TVA mitigation funds were also discussed.

(4) The commission reviewed and approved through A-95, the county's 2nd year CD application for the Huntsville community.

(5) The planning commission also noted that it would be a good idea to have several workshops with the county commission in order to improve communications and resolve any problems.
