# A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING NON-UNIFORM ACT RELOCATION BENEFITS IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT

4-81

WHEREAS, Loudon County, Tennessee, has an on-going Community Development Program for the Huntsville Community which involves the provision of safe, sanitary, and decent housing for project area residents, and

WHEREAS, the Community Development Program is funded by and subject to the regulations of the Department of Housing and Urban Development (NUD), and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to establish certain local policies for the Community Development Program which are consistent with HUD regulations;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Loudon County, Tennessee, that:

Section 1. Authorization is hereby granted to provide Non-Uniform Act Relocation Benefits in accordance with CFR 570.602 (c) to affected project area residents where the dilapidated residences of such persons are to undergo demolition without the acquisition of the property upon which the residence is located. The authorization to provide the Non-Uniform Act Relocation Benefis Utilizing Community Development funds shall be in accordance with the following policies:

- (a) Benefits provided shall be at cost not to exceed \$15,000; such cost may include moving expenses and temporary relocation expenses incurred during construction, replacement housing costs, costs of setting-up the replacement housing including water and wastewater system connections, and clearance of the existing dilapidated structure;
- (b) The replacement housing shall be of a size and type that meets HUD Section 8 housing quality standards;

In regard to size, the following standards shall apply when the replacement housing is to be a mobile home:

Family Size		No. of Bedrooms
3 or less		2
4		3
5 or more	-	Double-wide Unit

All mobile homes shall be located on the property so as to provide a permanent siting.

(c) The County, through the Community Development Director shall serve as the negotiating agent with the contractor/dealer on behalf of and in cooperation with the affected owner of the residence.

Section 2. This Resolution shall become effective immediately, the public welfare requiring it.
