#### COUNTY OF LOUDON

Be it remembered that the County Legislative . Body of Loudon County met in regular session on Monday, May 4, 1981, at 9:00 a.m. with the Honorable William H. Russell, County Judge, presiding, and Riley Wampler, Clerk of said Court was present; Whereupon, Sheriff Joe Sims opened Court, led the pledge of allegiance;; to the Flag, and introducted the Reverend Roy Hatley who gave the invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

It was moved by Commissoner Hudson and second by Commissoner Blair that the minutes of the April meeting becapproved as presented. The vote was unanimous.

APPOINTMENT OF REAPPORTIONMENT COMMITTEE

Judge Russell explained that the law required that Commission reapportion itself and that to accomplish this purpose he was appointing the following committee to make their recommendation to the Court: Commissioner Hudson, Chairman; Members, Commissioner Hartsook, Bledsoe, Jones and Judge Russell as ex-officio member. It was pointed out that the State Planning Office of the East Tennessee Development District would act as staff for this committee.

REPORT ON SOLID WASTE PROBLEMS

Judge Russell pointed out that the State of Tennessee was probabley going to cut off the per capita funds for solid waste. It was also noted that the City of Loudon had been taking care of certain solid waste problems for Loudon County by contract, thut that we were accepting proposals for doing this from several outside firms and that their reports would be made to the Purchasing Committee at their next regularly scheduled meeting.

REPORT ON TELLICO PROJECT

Judge Russell reported that he had been in contact with officials from Blount and Monroe Counties who were working on a joint developmen corporation to represent the three counties in connection with the Tellico Project. It was the purpose of the group to, in some way, have jurisdiction over the land designated as the Tellico Project by TVA and to provide for local input for additional development. Upon motion of Commissioner Blair and seconded by Commmissioner Hudson it was unanimously approved that Judge Russell proceed with the negotiations and have the appropriate private legislation passed and any other contracts which were necessary which would then be . presented to the Commission for final approval. REPORT ON TELLICO AREA SERVICE SYSTEM

Judge Russell reported thatthe had received the report from Attorney Harvey Sproul in connection with TASS. He further noted that a copy would be made available to each of the members.

PLANNING COMMISSION REPORT

Pat Phillips of the State Planning office gave the general report

REQUEST FOR CLOSURE OF SECTIONS OF SIMPSON ROAD

The Loudon County Planning Commission had recommended to the Court that certain portions of Simpson Road should be closed and in the area of new skating rink and the new building which was under construction by Jim Hamilton. Upon proper and full discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Blair and seconded by Commissioner Hudson that the road be closed. The vote was unanimous for closure.

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BUILDING COMMISSIONERS REPORT

BUDGET AMENDMENTS

J. Will Jones presented the budget amendment to the Court which was unanimously approved upon motion of Commissoner Jones and Commissione Blair which included a resolution to differ the budgeting process until thirty days after the state had made its decision on funding to the counties and also a resolution which would \$1500 to the efforts of the Little League Baseball Tournament sponsored by the Fort Loudon Baseball League. Motion on the baseball league was made by Commissioner Newman and seconded by Commissioner Blair. The vote was unanimous. Being attached hereto as Exhibit

REFUND OF TAXES TO ROBERT COBB

Upon motion of Commissioner Blair and seconded by Commissioner Hawk it was moved to refund Robert Cobb taxes in the amount of \$53.76 which had been overpaid by Mr. Cobb.

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CONSIDERATION OF JUSTICE CENTER COMMITTEE

Judge Russell introduced Morris Best from the East Tennessee Development District who explained to the Court that federal regulations required that the operation of a terminal in the Justice Center which was now governed by the joint governing body between the City of Loudon and Lenoir City and the County of Loudon required that membership consist of a majority of those people actively engaged in law enforcement. Upon motion duly made by Commissioner Eldridge and seconded by Commissioner Jones it was unanimously passed that Judge Russell enter into negotiations with the cities to effectuate a contract which would be in compliance with the federal law. It was pointed out that probably the Sheriff and the two police chiefs would serve along with members from the County Court.
