OF TAXES TO JOE SIMPSON



HOUSE BILL NO. 1229

AN ACT to increase the litigation tax in Loudon County and to amend Chapter 28 of the Private Acts of 1973.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Chapter 28 of the Private Acts of 1973 is amended by deleting the following words and figures in Section 1:

"not to exceed two dollars (\$2.00) on all civil cases and not to exceed one dollar (\$1.00) on all criminal cases"

and by substituting instead the following:

not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) in all civil and criminal cases

SECTION 2. This Act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body of Loudon County. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the county legislative body and certified by him to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this Act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective upon being approved as provided in Section 3.

AN ACT to vest jurisdiction of probate matters and the administration of estates in the General Sessions Court of Loudon County and to amend Chapter 57 of the Private Acts of 1959, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. The Judge of the General Sessions Court of Loudon County is hereby vested with jurisdiction over the probate of wills and the administration of estates, and all matters relating thereto, previously vested in the County Court, the County Judge or County Chairman, or the Chancery Court.

SECTION 2. The County Clerk shall continue to be the clerk for all probate matters and such clerk shall retain all powers, duties and jurisdiction in probate matters as he exercised prior to this Act.

SECTION 3. The procedure, rules of practice and laws governing the administration of estates in probate shall be the same as are now in effect, except where expressly changed by this Act.

SECTION 4.

(a) All probate matters and the administration of any estate pending in any other court in Loudon County and all records pertaining thereto on the effective date of this Act shall be transferred to the General Sessions Court of Loudon County and such court, or the County Clerk if so authorized, may hear and make final disposition in such matter as if it had originated in such court.

(b) Upon approval of this Act by the county legislative body, all records and other documents relating to a probate matter or the administration of an estate in Loudon County, except those records and documents that relate to a pending case, shall be transferred to the General Sessions Court of Loudon County.

SECTION 5. Chapter 57 of the Private Acts of 1959, and all Acts amendatory thereto, is further amended by deleting from the second sentence of the second paragraph of Section 3 the words "probate and".

SECTION 6. This Act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the county legislative body of Loudon County before January 1, 1982. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the Loudon County legislative body and certified by him to the Secretary of State.

SECTION 7. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this Act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective thirty (30) days after being approved as provided in Section 6.

RESOLUTION NO. _____

A RESOLUTION, IN PURSUANCE OF THE AUTHORITY GRANTED BY SECTION 13-7-110 TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR BUILDING PERMITS ISSUED, BY THE LOUDON COUNTY BUILDING COMMISSIONER, FOR THE ERECTION, CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION OR USE OF ANY BUILDING OR OTHER STRUCTURE WITHIN THE TERRITORY COVERED BY THE ZONING RESOLUTION OF LOUDON, TENNESSEE.

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission, in accordance with Sections 13-7-101 through 13-7-401, Tennessee Code Annotated, has adopted zoning regulations within the portions of Loudon County, Tennessee, which lie outside of the municipalities, and

WHEREAS, the zoning regulations stipulate that it shall be unlawful to erect, construct, reconstruct, alter or use any building or other structure within the territory covered by said zoning regulations without first obtaining a building permit, and

WHEREAS, certain expenditures shall be incurred by Loudon County in issuing said building permits as a means of enforcing the zoning regulations: Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION, OF LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE, That on all buildings, structures, or alterations requiring a building permit, as set forth in the Zoning Resolution of Loudon County, Tennessee, a fee shall be paid as required at the time of filing application, in accordance with the following:

I. The following schedule is hereby adopted as a fee for all commercial, industrial and residential buildings:

- 1) Commercial - .06¢ per square foot of floor space up to 5,000 square feet, plus .03¢ per square foot over 5,000 square feet.
- 2) Residential - .05¢ per square foot of floor space for the first 2,000 square feet, plus .03\$ per square foot exceeding 2,000 square feet.
- 3) Utility/warehousing - .03¢ per square foot of floor space.

II. For all structures, not classified as buildings the following fee schedule is adopted:

- 1) Where the valuation does not exceed \$500.00, no fee shall be required, unless an inspection is necessary, in which case there shall be a \$1.50 fee.

- 2) For a valuation over \$500.00 up to and including \$15,000.00 the fee shall be \$3.00 per thousand or fraction thereof.
- 3) For a valuation over \$15,000.00 up to and including \$100,000.00, the fee shall be \$45.00 for the first fifteen thousand plus \$2.00 for each additional thousand or fraction thereof.
- 4) For a valuation over \$100,00.00 up to and including \$500,000.00, the fee shall be \$215.00 for the first one hundred thousand plus \$1.00 for each additional thousand or fraction thereof.
- 5) For a valuation over \$500,000.00, up to and including \$1,000,000.00, the fee shall be \$615.00 for the first five hundred thousand plus 40¢ for each additional thousand or fraction thereof.
- 6) For a valuation over \$1,000.00, the fee shall be \$815.00 for the first million plus 15¢ for each additional thousand or fraction thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the building commissioner shall keep a permanent and accurate accounting of all permit fees and other monies collected, the names of all persons upon whose account the same was paid, the date and amount thereof;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That no permit shall be issued until the fees prescribed herein shall have been paid. Nor shall an amendment to a permit be approved until the additional fee, if any, due to an increase in the estimated cost of the building or structure, shall have been paid;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That if no permit has been obtained before the erection or alteration of any building or structure the building commissioner is hereby authorized to charge a fee at a rate twice the designated fee for that structure or building;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution shall not be construed as authorizing the requirement of building permits for the erection, construction, or reconstruction of any building or other structure on land now devoted to agricultural uses or which may hereafter be and for agricultural purposes, except on agricultural land adjacent or in proximity to state federal aid highways, public supports or public parks, provided however, such building or structure is incidental to the agricultural enterprise.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, That this resolution shall take effect June 8, 1981, the public welfare requiring it.
