RESOLUTION DIRECTING LOUDON COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION TO INCLUDE REFERENDUM ON COUNTY-WIDE MOTOR VEHICLE PRIVILEGE TAX IN NOVEMBER 2, 1922 ELECTION

WHEREAS, the County roads and highways of Loudon County are in poor condition throughout the County; and

WHEREAS, the equipment and machinery used by the Loudon County
Highway Department is old and delapidated, and in almost unusuable
condition; and

WHEREAS, it is a matter of extreme concern to the citizens of Loudon County who use the roads and highways to have safe roads which are maintained in the most economical manner possible; and

WHEREAS, in many counties in the State of Tennessee, a "idotor Vehicle Privilege Tax" has been adopted for the purpose of building and maintaining adequate and safe county roads so that the maintenance is paid for by those who use the roads and highways; and

WHEREAS, it is the feeling of the Loudon County Commission that the people of the County should be given the opportunity of specifying whether or not they want improvement in the County highway system and want it paid for by means of a County-wide Motor Vehicle Privilege Tax;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Loudon County Commission in regular session that the Loudon County Election Commission be directed to include on the ballot for the November 2, 1982, State election the following question: Are you in favor of a Motor Vehicle Privilege tax to be levied on all regular motor driven vehicles registered in Loudon County, in the amount of \$15.00 per vehicle, plus Clerk's fee of 75¢ and \$1.00 for the decal, or a total of \$16.75, with the proceeds to be deposited after collection in the County Highway Fund and used specifically and exclusively for County highway purposes (vote yes or no) ;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that subject to the aforesaid question being answered in the affirmative by the voters of Loudon County, the County Commission of Loudon County hereby adopts and levies a county-wide Motor Vehicle Privilege tax as a condition precedent to the operation of a motor vehicle within the County, with the proceeds to be deposited after collection in the County Highway Fund, and used specifically and

exclusively for County highway purposes in the amount of \$15.00 per vehicle, plus Clerk's fee of 75¢, and \$1.00 for the decal, or a total of \$16.75;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the duration or term for which the privilege is issued, method of collection, proration of the amount chargeable for a period of either more or less than a calendar year interval, and the grace period allowable shall be the same as that provided for in TCA 55-4-104 for payment of the state motor vehicle registration fee for all such vehicles described therein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said privilege tax shall be interpreted so as not to be applicable to motor-driven bicycles (but including motorcycles) and scooters, nor to farm tractors, self-propelled farm machines, or other vehicles or machinery not usually used for operation upon public highways, and so as not to be applicable to all governmental instrumentality motor vehicles.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk of Loudon County shall collect this tax at the same time he collects the state privilege tax levied upon the operation of motor-driven vehicles over the public highways of this state, and shall not issue to a resident of such County a state license for the operation of a motor-driven vehicle unless at the same time such owner shall purchase the license or pay the privilege tax levied hereunder.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk shall keep proper records and receipts, and shall design, and order from the funds provided herein, decals to be issued indicating the payment of the aforesaid County Motor Vehicle privilege tax, which decal shall be displayed by affixing the same to the lower right hand side of the windshield of the motor-driven vehicle for which same is issued. (Providing, however, that the privilege tax decal for motorcycles shall be placed on the top portion of the gasoline tank, but if such tank is not visible, then the decal shall be placed on any prominent and visible portion of said vehicle).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk shall issue duplicate decals for the same fees established for the issuance of the decal originally, upon proper affidavit and the proof that the motor-driven vehicle has been destroyed or damaged, or if such owner can prove

that he has destroyed or taken the decal from a motor-driven vehicle which he has sold and he desires to transfer the decal to another motor-driven vehicle for the unexpired term for which the original decal was issued.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the tax levied under this resolution shall become effective beginning with motor vehicle registrations or renewals made after January 1, 1983, and is to be paid when each registration or renewal of registration is made each year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the motor vehicle privilege tax is to be reviewed by the County Commission at its first meeting after January 1, 1985, for the purpose of determining whether or not the tax should be reduced or eliminated.

WHEREAS, the Department of General Services, Federal Property Utilization Division, by authority of the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949, as amended, makes available federal surplus personal property to public agencies for public purposes and to nonprofit tax-exempt health and educational institutions, and

WHEREAS, Loudon County, hereafter referred to as the Applicant, (Applicant Organization)

is desirous of utilizing the services and resources of the Department of General Services, Federal Property Utilization Division, hereafter referred to as the State Agency, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant certifies that it is a public agency or a nonprofit educational or health institution exempt from taxation under Section 501 of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code of 1954, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant further certifies that the property is needed and will be used for carrying out or promoting for the residents of a given political area one or more public purposes and for no other purpose, or be used for public health or educational purposes including research and for no other purpose, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant agrees that all items of property shall be placed in use for the purposes for which acquired within one year of receipt and shall be continued in use for such purposes for one year from the date the property was placed in use, and in the event the property is not so placed in use, or continued in use, the donee shall immediately notify the State Agency, and return said property to the State Agency, as directed, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant further agrees to adhere to any additional periods of restrictions placed on the property by the State Agency which shall include a total period of use restrictions for at least 18 months on all passenger motor vehicles and other items of property with a unit acquisition cost of \$3000 or more; and additional special terms, conditions, reservations and restrictions on aircraft, vessels, special limited or restricted use items, and other items as specified in a Conditional Transfer Document or written on the face of the distribution document, and
