NOT TO EXCEED \$ 100,000 , AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT

WHEREAS, it has been determined by this Legislative Body that it is necessary and desirable to make major improvements to county roads in and for said Co nty; and

WHEREAS, sufficient funds are not now available for this purpose and it will be necessary for the Legislative Body to authorize the issuance of notes to finance this transaction; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Sections 5-10-501 through: 5-10-509, inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated, counties in Tennessee are authorized through their respective Legislative Bodies, upon approval by the State Director of Local Finance, to issue interest bearing capital outlay notes to finance the cost thereof; and

WHEREAS, it appears advantageous to said County at this particular time to issue capital outlay notes to finance the cost thereof:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislative Body of Loudon County, Tennessee, as follows:

SECTION 2. That, said notes shall bear interest at a rate not to

exceed ___Ten__ percent (_10_%) per annum, payable in such manner as shall

be determined by the County __Executive __ and the purchaser of said notes.

Both principal and interest on said notes shall be payable in lawful money

of the United States of America at the office of the County Trustee of

Loudon _____ County, Tennessee.

SECTION 3. That, said notes shall be subject to redemption at the option of the county, in whole or in part, at any time at the principal amount thereof and accrued interest to the date of redemption.

SECTION 4. That, said notes shall be executed in the name of

Loudon County, Tennessee, is signed by the County Executive

and attested by the County Clerk with the seal of the County attached thereto.

SECTION 5. That, said notes shall be in substantially the form attached hereto.

SECTION 6. That, for the purpose of providing funds with which to pay the principal and interest accruing on said notes at maturity, there shall be levied upon all taxable property in Loudon County, in addition to all other taxes, a direct annual tax for each of the years while said notes, or any of them, are outstanding, in amounts sufficient for that purpose. However so far as legally can be done there is also pledged a sufficient amount of current Highway Fund revenues for the retirement of said notes and interest when due.

SECTION 7. That, the Capital Outlay Notes herein described shall not be issued until approval by the State Director of Local Finance shall have been obtained as required by Section 5-10-501, Tennessee Code Annotated.

SECTION 8. That, the Capital Outlay Notes herein described shall not be sold for less than par and accrued interest.

SECTION 9. That, if any of said Capital Outlay Notes shall remain unpaid at the end of three (3) years from the date of issuance of same, the balance of said note or notes shall be converted to bonds as provided by Sections 9-11-101 to 9-11-119, inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated, or otherwise liquidated in such manner as approved by the State Director of Local Finance in compliance with statutes relating to the issuance and redemption of bonds and notes.

SECTION 10. That, the proceeds of said notes shall be turned over to the County Trustee of said County and shall be paid out for the purposes and in the manner required by law and this Resolution.

SECTION 11. That, all orders or resolutions in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed insofar as such conflict exists and this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the County Commission to make it clear that if the County-wide Motor Vehicle Privilege Tax should be adopted by a majority vote of the voters in the November 2, 1982 election, that the tax is a temporary tax which will expire and be continued only if another referendum were adopted by the voters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission that the last paragraph of the resolution previously adopted be deleted, and that the following paragraph be substituted in lieu thereof:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Motor Vehicle Privilege Tax provided for in this resolution is adopted and ratified by a referendum of the voters of Loudon County on November 2, 1982, that the tax will automatically expire on December 31, 1986, and will not be collected after that date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the question to be carried on the ballot be amended to show that the tax will automatically expire so that the amended question will read as follows:

Are you in favor of a Motor Vehicle Privilege Tax to be levied on all regular motor driven vehicles registered in Loudon County, in the amount of \$15.00 per vehicle, plus Clerk's fee of 75¢ and \$1.00 for the decal, or a total of \$16.75, with the proceeds to be deposited after collection in the County Highway Fund and used specifically and exclusively for County highway purposes, the aforesaid tax to automatically expire on December 31, 1986, and not to be collected after that date, (vote yes or no)

Gentlemen:

The Loudon County Board of Education has voted to remove the dangerous asbestos materials from Steekee School as soon as possible. Specifications are being completed by our architects, Barber & McMurry, in close consultation with Law Engineering Testing Company of Atlanta, Georgia. These specifications should be ready to let for bid requests by Wednesday, September 29th.

I would ask that you permit us to handle this situation as we have handled the school building projects in the past. That method is:

- 1. The architect advertises for interested bidders to pick up copies of the specifications.
- 2. All bids are to be returned in sealed envelopes to Buddy Jenkins's office by the end of a two-week period.
- The County Commission and the Board of Education hold a joint meeting to open the bids.
- 4. The architects and the engineering consultants look over the bids carefully to insure that all specifications have been met.
- The County Commission commits to the necessary funding to remove the asbestos from those schools where it is presently located.
- 6. Law Engineering be employed as a "Clerk-of-the-Works" and monitoring agency to insure that all Federal and State requirements are strictly followed during the removal and clean-up processes.

I hope that this method of operation will be acceptable as it will provide the quickest and safest method for accomplishing the work that is necessary.

TOTAL COUNTY WFTEADA = 7,047

These are figures that are sent from the State Department in Nashville. To correct the imbalance this situation caused last school year, we need to adjust these figures based on the WFTEADA before the Trustee divides the local tax funds between the two systems.

Lenoir City WFTEADA = 2,113

Afternoon Vocational WFTEADA = 51

Loudon Co. WFTEADA == 4,934

(including WFTEADA of 51 from L.C.)

By adjusting these figures to show the following -

Lenoir City WFTEADA = 2,164

Loudon Co. WFTEADA == 4,883

Using these figures for the Trustee to divide the local tax funds will solve the problem.
