

RESOLUTION REQUESTING PRIVATE ACT REQUIRING BUILDING PERMIT PRIOR TO ELECTRICAL SERVICE BEING RENDERED BY UTILITY COMPANIES

Whereas, there is not presently in Tennessee Law any general requirement that persons applying for new electric service have to comply with regulations, where applicable, requiring a building permit for new structures; and

Whereas, although most residents and applicants for electrical service do comply with regulations, a significant number avoid applying for a building permit, and accordingly for a period of time are successful in avoiding having the structure assessed for tax purposes for the new improvements, and in complying with zoning regulations, which then is unfair to those citizens who are paying property taxes and complying with the law;

Now, therefore, <u>BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF LOUDON COUNTY</u> in regular session assembled that the General Assembly of Tennessee be requested to adopt a private act requiring all electric utility companies operating in Loudon County to require certification that a building permit has been obtained before supplying electric service to new structures in Loudon County.
