RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE  
FILING OF A 1983 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT  
BLOCK GRANT APPLICATION

WHEREAS, Loudon County has determined that the potential exists to develop and implement an innovative system of solid waste disposal that may serve as a demonstration within the State of Tennessee and the technology of which is transferable to other localities within the state; and

WHEREAS, the municipalities of Loudon and Lenoir City, each lying within Loudon County and presently participants in a county solid waste disposal program, have chosen to continue participation in said program expanded to include solid waste baling technology designed to increase the cost effectiveness and efficiency of solid waste disposal; and

WHEREAS, each party of the existing arrangement have agreed to pursue the baling technology system and support the local share required under the arrangements enumerated within the existing contract dated October 19, 1979; and

WHEREAS, financial assistance necessary to support implementation of the proposed baling system is available through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program administered by the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Loudon County Commission authorizes the county executive to make application for the above-referenced assistance, provide supplemental information as needed and enter into any and all agreements and certifications to secure funding and project implementation;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the county commits a local share not to exceed \$400,000 as required by the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development.
