RESOLUTION FOR LOUDON COUNTY FET REGISTRATION

WHEREAS, there has been an increase by approximantly 100 cases each year since 1980 of confirmed cases of Rabies in the state of Tennessee: 145 confirmed cases of Rabies in 1980 as close as McMinn and Knox Counties; 251 confirmed cases in 1981 as close as Roane, Anderson, and Knox Counties; 356 confirmed cases in 1982 as close as Knox County in which one dog exposed 21 people; And by March 1983 Tennessee had confirmed Rabies in as many domestic animals as were confirmed for the entire year of 1982; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Communicable Disease Report indicates approximantly 300 persons in Tennessee received Rabies post-exposure prophylactic treatment for each of the past two years; and

WHEREAS, the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians, the American Veterinary Medical Association and the Tennessee Department of Public Health Rabies Control Division outline a five-point program to lead the way to good community rabies control:

1. Select pets on the basis of sound advice and research including needs of the owner and home environments;

- Educate people about responsible pet ownership including vaccinations, obeying and enforcing leash and licensing laws, and using identification and rabies tags;
- 3. Educate children about the dangers of handling wild animals;
- 4. Discourage keeping native wild and exotic wild animals as pets;
- 5. Emphasize surgical sterilization of pets to minimize unwanted pets; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of citizens of Loudon County and for their pets to ensure that all dogs and cats are vaccinated against Rabies; and

WHEREAS, the registration fee will be used to help defray the cost of properly running an animal shelter and providing an animal patrol warden; and

WHEREAS, it is often necessary to discourage persons from harboring more animals than he can properly care for; and

WHEREAS, it is desired to help control stray dogs and cats from roaming the streets creating health and traffic hazards, trespassing on private property, and generally violating the rights of human beings; and

WHEREAS, it is desired to help the public understand the problem of uncontrolled breeding of dogs and cats and its effect on the problem of stray animals: and

WHEREAS, it is desired for the overall improvement of the environment for the citizens of Loudon County and for their wanted pets; and

WHEREAS, it is in accordance with Laws Related to Dogs, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 53-904; and

WHEREAS, it is in compliance with the Tennessee Department of Public Health Rabies Control Division; and

WHEREAS, it is in compliance with the Loudon County Rabies Control Program; and

WHEREAS, each of the above regulations state that all dogs and cats three months and older are required to be vaccinated, registered, and tagged;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Loudon County, Tennessee, acting as the county legislative body of said county, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be a County Registration of all dogs and cats of Loudon County. No person shall own, keep, or harbor any dog or cat over 3 months of age within the Jurisdiction of Loudon County unless such dog or cat is vaccinated and licensed. The provisions of this section do not apply to animals owned by a licensed research facility or held in a veterinary medical facility or government operated or licensed animal shelter.

Section 2. All dogs and cats shall be vaccinated against Rabies by a licensed veterinarian in accordance with the latest "Compendium of Animal Rabies Vaccines and Recommendations for Immunization" published by the National Association of State Public Health Veterinarians.

Section 3. The Registration Fee shall be one dollar (\$1.00) for each dog and cat.

Section 4. Application for a license:

- (a) Application for a license must be made within 30 days after obtaining a dog or cat over three months of age;
- (b) A written application for such license shall be made to the County Health Department and shall state the name and address of the owner, the breed, color, age and sex of the dog/cat and shall be accompanied by a veterinarians certificate showing that the dog/cat has been vaccinated for Rabies in accordance with the requirements of the state law;
- (c) Upon acceptance of the license application and fee, the Health Department shall issue a durable license tag including an identifying number, year of issuance, and County. Both Rabies and license tags must be attached to the collar of the dog or cat. Tags must be worn at all times and are not transferable.
- $\underline{\text{SECTION 5.}}$ The Loudon County Health Department shall maintain a record of all licenses issued, and such records shall be available to the Animal Control Warden
- Section 6. Registration will be good for one (1) year and correspond with the date of validity of the Rabies Certificate.

Section 7. Registration tags obtained and Fees collected:

- (a) Registration tags may be obtained from offices of Veterinarians of Loudon County, or from the Loudon County Animal Shelter upon presentation of a valid certificate of Rabies Vaccination and application for license;
- (b) The registration fee shall be collected by authorized representatives designated by the Health Department. Registration fees will then be turned over to the Treasurer of the Loudon County Humane Society to help defray the cost of operating the Loudon County Animal Shelter and its related function of providing an Animal Control Warden.

Section 8. Unlicensed dogs or cats:

- (a) Unlicensed dogs or cats found running at large shall be taken up by the animal warden and impounded in the Loudon County Animal Shelter. Such animals shall be confined in a humane manner for not less than four (4) days and thereafter disposed of unless claimed as hereinafter set forth:
- (b) Owners of unlicensed dogs/cats may reclaim same by paying a pick-up fee of \$10.00, a feeding bill of \$1.00 for each day that said animal has been in the pound, and by purchasing a license and furnishing Rabies certificate or paying for having said animal vaccinated.
- (c) Anyone may claim an impounded dog after the fourth (4) day has passed upon making the payments required above.

Section 9. Interferance with Animal Control Warden. No person shall interfere with, hinder or molest the animal warden in the performance of his duty or seek to release any animal in the custody of the animal warden or from the dog pound, except as herein provided.

Section 10. This resolution shall take effect from and upon its passage following final consideration.
