



WHEREAS, the Tennessee Operation Lifesaver Council has
been formed to implement the Tennessee Operation
Lifesaver Program; and,

WHEREAS, Operation Lifesaver is an ongoing program to
educate the populace of the potential hazards
occurring at railroad crossings in the State
of Tennessee and Loudon County; and,

WHEREAS, Operation Lifesaver has been initiated for the
purpose of reducing life, limb, and property
losses at railroad crossings;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS COUNTY LEGISLATIVE
BODY, IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

That the Loudon County Board of Commissioners
does hereby declare the month of March as
"Operation Lifesaver Month"

in Loudon County, Tennessee;

And further, encourages all citizens to exercise
extreme caution when approaching railroad cross-
ings, not only during Operation Lifesaver Month,
but at all times;

WHEREAS, T.C.A. 55-10-401 prohibits any person or persons from driving or being in physical control of any automobile or other motor-driven vehicle on any public road or highway in the state of Tennessee, or in any alley or street or while on the premises of any shopping center, trailer park or apartment house complex, which is generally frequented by the public-at-large, while under the influence of any intoxicant, marijuana, narcotic drug, or drug-producing stimulating effects on the central nervous system; and

WHEREAS, T.C.A. 55-10-403 provides the following penalty for first offenders:

Any persons or person violating the provisions of 55-10-401 -- 55-10-404, shall upon conviction thereof for the first offense be fined not less than than \$250.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 and such person or persons shall be confined in the county jail or workhouse for not less than 48 hours nor more than 11 months and 29 days, provided, however, if such conviction is for 48 hours, it shall be served at a time when the person is off from work and will not interfere with his or her regular employment, and the Court shall prohibit such convicted person from driving a vehicle in the state of Tennessee for a period of one year.

WHEREAS, proper enforcement of this statute requiring not less than 48 hours confinement in the county jail or workhouse has resulted in serious and substantial over-population of the county jail or workhouse beyond its intended capacity together with administrative problems; and,

WHEREAS, strict compliance with the 48-hour minimum sentencing and concurrent adherence to constitutionally permissible standards of imprisonment cannot be reasonable accomplished and maintained without costly and extensive expansion or modification of the existing facilities necessitating the imposition of significant new taxes upon Loudon County taxpayers; and,

WHEREAS, the Law Enforcement Committee of the Loudon County Commission has met, considered this serious problem and possible solutions, and believes that the best interests of the citizens of this County and the State as well as society would be more fully realized if the legislature amended the 48-hour jail confinement provision of T.C.A. 55-10-403 to grant authority to the Courts to sentence first offenders to 48 hours

of public service work which would include but not be limited to the removal of litter from the county and state highway system, public playgrounds, public parks, county-owned or operated grounds and facilities and other appropriate locations. This committee believes that the public humiliation and embarrassment attendant to performing this public service work would be as equally effective a deterrent and punishment of first offenders as is 48 hours of incarceration with concomitant beneficial contribution to the welfare of the community. Such other penalty provisions with respect to fines and revocation of driver's license should remain intact as written; and,


WHEREAS, that the Law Enforcement Committee recommends that this Resolution be passed by this County Commission and that a copy be sent to the Honorable Ben Longley, State Senator, and the Honorable Benny Stafford, State Representative, for Loudon County with a request that they introduce, sponsor and support legislation to this end.

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED by this County Commission in regular session assembled on this 5th day of March, 1984, a majority or more of the membership of said Commission concurring, that this Commission does hereby respectfully request that State Senator Ben Longley and State Representative Benny Stafford introduce, sponsor and support legislation that would amend T.C.A. 55-10-403 to grant authority to the Courts to sentence first offenders to 48 hours of public service work which would include but not be limited to the removal of litter from the county and state highway system, public playgrounds, public parks, county-owned or operated grounds and facilities and other appropriate locations. This committee believes that the public humiliation and embarrassment attendant to performing this public service work would be as equally effective a deterrent and punishment of first offenders as is 48 hours of incarceration with concomitant beneficial contribution to the welfare of the community. Such other penalty provisions with respect to fines and revocation of driver's license should remain intact as written.
