The Governor's Task Force on Education For Loudon County

A Recommendation to
The Loudon County School Board
And
The Loudon County Commission

The quality of local educational systems is an important factor in the industrial siting policies of all major corporations. They are concerned with the education and vocational training of the local labor force and with the quality of education available to the children of employees migrating into the county. Many companies, especially those from outside the South, arrrive with inherent skepticism of rural school systems in Tennessee. Even among the companies that locate in Loudon County, many employees choose to locate their homes in Knox County in order to place their children in the so-called "better" school system. We believe that many of these prejudices could be overcome if prospective companies were better informed about the high quality of Loudon County Schools.

We hereby recommend that the Loudon County School Board or its designated representatives be included as an integral part of all future industrial recruiting activities of the Loudon County Commission. At the appropriate stage in each major negotiation this should include a presentation by school officials and a tour of one or more educational facilities. A brochure describing the school system should be prepared as soon as possible for distribution to all prospective companies. This brochure should boast of the outstanding physical facilities recently constructed by the County and of our educational accomplishments such as Mrs. Pat Fanning's current title as Teacher of the Year for East Tennessee. Industrial development funds should be made available for the preparation of this brochure.

Summary: The County passed an ordinance in 1975 to undertake the responsibility for a Safety and Health Program which was to be "as effective as" the State's program (Private Sector) in providing each of its public sector employees a workplace free of recognized hazards. Ten (10) years have now passed since the original program started. Conditions have changed as well as many local officials. Because of this fact, we felt each part of your program should be re-examined and given an evaluation. See our comments on the attached sheet.

Only nine (9) non-serious workplace violations were observed during the visit and these are attached for action. Please respond by the date indicated. An extension can be requested in writing if there are problems or a lack of funds.

We appreciate the work being done by you and your staff in the interest of safety and health for the employees of Loudon County, and feel your efforts are producing an effective program. Please post a copy of this report for your employees to view for a period of at least three (3) days. If we can be of assistance to you in any way, please let us know.
