BEGINNING JULY 1, 1985


SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED, by the Loudon County Board of Commissioners of Loudon County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on the 19th day of August 1985, that the combined property tax rate for Loudon County, Tennessee for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985, shall be \$2.55 on each \$100.00 of taxable property within the boundaries of the City of Lenoir City and \$2.80 on each of the \$100.00 of taxable property in Loudon City, Philadelphia, Greenback and rural Loudon County, which levy is to provide revenue for each of the following funds and otherwise conform to the following levies:

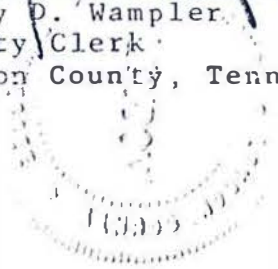

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Loudon County, Tennessee, assembled in regular session on the 19th day of August, 1985, that the amounts hereafter set out are hereby appropriated for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the various funds, departments, institutions, offices and agencies of Loudon County, Tennessee, for the capital outlay, and for meeting the payment of principal and interest on the County's debt maturing during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1985 and ending June 30, 1986, according to the following schedule:

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Register, Sheriff and the Clerk and Master and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State laws heretofore or hereafter enacted Expenditures out of commissions, and or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commission and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and covered into the County General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-2201, T.C.A., operate under provisions of Section 8-2204, T.C.A., provisions of preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if the need shall arise, the Budget Committee may, with the approval of any official, head of any department or division which may be affected, transfer any amount within any major appropriation category; however, for transfers between major appropriation categories within the same fund, the approval of the Board of County Commissioners must be obtained. The School Superintendent must obtain the approval of the Board of Education for all school department transfers.

One copy of this authorization shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one with each divisional or departmental head concerned. Aforesaid authorization shall clearly state the reasons for the transfer, but this provision shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriation made by this resolution which covers the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee or agent of the County, shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for and office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office agency, institution, division or department ending June 30, 1986. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the fiscal year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Sections 9-1101 to 9-1119, Tennessee Code Annotated.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that certain school funds which function as clearing accounts have been included in the revenue and appropriations for the year ending June 30, 1986 as a memorandum only. It is expressly understood that the County Board of Education may not create or incur expenditures from these funds above actual revenue of such funds. It is further directed that no transfers may be effected between these clearing accounts and the operation school fund accounts.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there is hereby appropriated for Rural Road Construction on State-approved projects such amounts as may be from time to time approved by contract with the State Department of Highways.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Executive and County Clerk are Hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the fiscal year 1985-86 have been collected, not exceeding 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made and the loan shall be paid out of revenue of the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the authority of Sections 5-1031 to 5-1039, inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Executive and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 1986.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent County property taxes for the year 1984 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 1984 shall be apportioned the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 1984. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly. Also, that payment in lieu of taxes from the T.V.A. shall be placed in the General Purpose School Fund

Taxes collected in compliance with the Business Tax Act shall be placed in the various funds of the County in the same proportions as the tax rate is divided.

Interest on County investments shall be placed in the County General Fund. This excludes the interest on Loudon County Memorial Hospital Depreciation Funds which would be placed in the Loudon County Memorial Hospital Depreciation Fund, the Special Bond Fund, which would be placed in the Special Bond Fund. Interest on School Building Fund shall be placed in the General Bond Debt Fund.


SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Highway Capital Outlay notes indebtedness of \$76,000.00 be paid from the General Bond Debt Fund.

SECTION 11. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the fiscal year at June 30, 1986.



RESOLUTION OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF LOUDON  
COUNTY, TENNESSEE, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF INTEREST BEARING  
HIGHWAY CAPITAL OUTLAY NOTES  
NOT TO EXCEED \$ 600,000.00, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT  
OF SAID NOTES.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by this Legislative Body that it is necessary and desirable to upgrade Loudon County Roads in and for said County; and

WHEREAS, sufficient funds are not now available for this purpose and it will be necessary for the Legislative Body to authorize the issuance of notes to finance this transaction; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Sections 5-10-501 through 5-10-509, inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated, counties in Tennessee are authorized through their respective Legislative Bodies, upon approval by the State Director of Local Finance, to issue interest bearing capital outlay notes to finance the cost thereof; and

WHEREAS, it appears advantageous to said County at this particular time to issue capital outlay notes to finance the cost thereof:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislative Body of Loudon County, Tennessee, as follows:

SECTION 1. That, for the purpose of providing funds to finance the cost of upgrading of Loudon County roads in and for said County, there shall be issued its negotiable interest bearing capital outlay notes in a principal amount not to exceed \$ 600,000.00. That, said notes shall be designated "Highway Capital Outlay Notes" and shall be numbered serially beginning with the number 1. Each of said notes shall be dated as of the date of issuance thereof, shall be of such denomination as may be agreed upon by the County \* Executive and the purchaser of said notes, and shall mature not later than three (3) years after the date of issuance, provided, that not less than one-ninth (1/9) of the original principal amount of the notes issued hereunder shall mature, without renewal but subject to prior redemption, each year that any of the notes issued hereunder are outstanding.

SECTION 2. That, said notes shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed Ten percent (10 %) per annum, payable in such manner as shall be determined by the County Executive and the purchaser of said notes. Both principal and interest on said notes shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the County Trustee of Loudon County, Tennessee.

*Exhibit C*

SECTION 3. That, said notes shall be subject to redemption at the option of the County, in whole or in part, at any time at the principal amount thereof and accrued interest to the date of redemption.

SECTION 4. That, said notes shall be executed in the name of Loudon County, Tennessee, is signed by the County Executive and attested by the County Clerk with the seal of the County attached thereto.

SECTION 5. That, said notes shall be in substantially the form attached hereto.

SECTION 6. That, for the purpose of providing funds with which to pay the principal and interest accruing on said notes at maturity, there shall be levied upon all taxable property in Loudon County, in addition to all other taxes, a direct annual tax for each of the years while said notes, or any of them, are outstanding, in amounts sufficient for that purpose.

SECTION 7. That, the Capital Outlay Notes herein described shall not be issued until approval by the State Director of Local Finance shall have been obtained as required by Section 5-10-501, Tennessee Code Annotated.

SECTION 8. That, the Capital Outlay Notes herein described shall not be sold for less than par and accrued interest.


SECTION 9. That, if any of said Capital Outlay Notes shall remain unpaid at the end of three (3) years from the date of issuance of same, the balance of said note or notes shall be converted to bonds as provided by Sections 9-11-101 to 9-11-119, inclusive, Tennessee Code Annotated, or otherwise liquidated in such manner as approved by the State Director of Local Finance in compliance with statutes relating to the issuance and redemption of bonds and notes.

SECTION 10. That, the proceeds of said notes shall be turned over to the County Trustee of said County and shall be paid out for the purposes and in the manner required by law and this Resolution.

SECTION 11. That, all principal payments to retire the afore mentioned notes and the interest expense thereon shall be paid from the Highway Fund.


