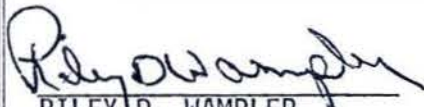

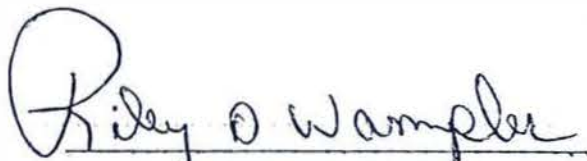

RE: RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO COOPERATE AND PARTICIPATE WITH KNOX COUNTY AND THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE WITH RESPECT TO A SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL AND ENERGY RECOVERY FACILITY

WHEREAS, the _____ of _____ County (City), Tennessee (the "Governing Body") has previously considered various alternatives for the disposal of solid waste presently being generated within _____ (the "Municipality"); and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has considered the capacity of existing landfills for the disposal of solid waste in and around the Municipality and the availability of future landfills which could be created and permitted to accept solid waste for disposal; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body has been concerned about the environmental effects of disposal of solid waste; and

WHEREAS, officials of the Municipality have held discussions with officials of the City of Knoxville and Knox County with respect to the disposal of solid waste generated within the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City of Knoxville is empowered under the laws of the State of Tennessee to finance, acquire, construct, own and operate solid waste disposal and energy recovery facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Knoxville expects to cooperate and act jointly with Knox County in connection with a proposed facility for solid waste disposal and has expressed a willingness to provide sufficient capacity at its proposed solid waste disposal facility to accept solid waste delivered by the Municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City of Knoxville intends that a facility for solid waste disposal and energy recovery would be owned and controlled by the City of Knoxville acting with Knox County or by a public instrumentality to be created for the benefit of the City of Knoxville; and

WHEREAS, there is pending in the United States Congress legislation which would seriously affect the economic viability of the financing for a publicly owned solid waste disposal and energy recovery facility; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality has reviewed the feasibility study prepared for the East Tennessee Development District by I.C. Thomasson Associates, Inc. and Barge, Waggoner, Sumner & Cannon, a joint venture, dated July 19, 1985; and

WHEREAS, On June 16, 1986 Knox County approved the execution and delivery of a tri-party agreement among the City of Knoxville, Knox County and HDR Techserv, Inc. ("HDR") with respect to the furnishing by HDR of professional engineering services relating to a plan for the disposal of solid waste; and

WHEREAS, HDR has provided a preliminary assessment that the tipping fee for disposal of solid waste may range from \$_____ to \$_____ per ton.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the _____ as follows:

SECTION 1. The Governing Body hereby finds and determines that:

(a) There is a need for a long term solution for the disposal of solid waste generated within the Municipality.

(b) A solid waste disposal and energy recovery facility (the "Facility") is the best long term, environmentally sound solution to the need for disposal of solid waste generated within the Municipality.

(c) The Municipality is currently generating an average of _____ tons per day of solid waste requiring disposal.

(d) There are no currently operating or presently planned facilities in or near the Municipality, other than landfills, which are available to the Municipality for the safe and economic disposal of solid waste.

(e) Existing landfills utilized by the Municipality and those landfills presently expected to be available in or near the Municipality for disposal of solid waste are not expected to be able to accept all the solid waste generated within the Municipality within the next twenty years at reasonable cost.

SECTION 2. The Governing Body intends that the Municipality will participate in the use of the proposed Facility, to provide for the disposal of solid waste in the presently estimated amount of _____ tons per day on average.

SECTION 3. The Governing Body hereby directs the appropriate officials and employees of the Municipality, working with appropriate officials of Knox County and the City of Knoxville, to prepare for submission to the Governing Body a cooperation agreement between the Municipality and the City of Knoxville relating to the disposal of solid waste at the Facility.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare of the Municipality requiring it.

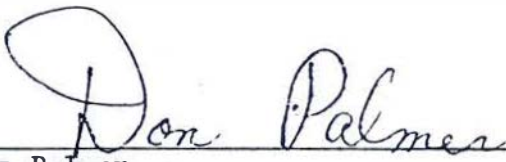

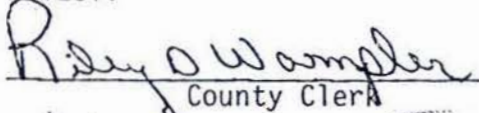

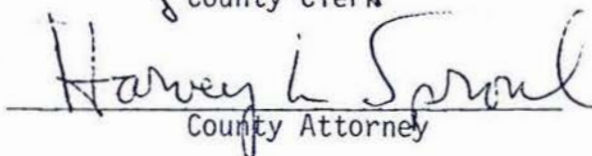

RESOLUTION REQUESTING IMMEDIATE DESIGN OF U.S. 321

BRIDGE ACROSS OR NEAR FORT LOUDOUN DAM

WHEREAS, the redesignation of State Highway 95 as U.S. Highway 321, and further its designation as a Tennessee Scenic Highway, has greatly increased the traffic flow on this highway, this also being true because of its use as an access across Fort Loudoun Lake to the Knoxville Municipal Airport, Alcoa, Blount County, Gatlinburg, Pigeon Forge, Dollywood, and the Smoky Mountains, as well as its having become a primary commercial street in the City of Lenoir City; and

WHEREAS, the Cooper Communities development in Loudon County, together with the development of the Tellico Reservoir Development Agency Industrial Park and the Monroe County Niles Ferry Industrial Park, also is resulting in a heavily increased use of U.S. Highway 321 between Broadway (U.S. Highway 11) in Lenoir City across the Tennessee River; and

WHEREAS, it would be mutually beneficial to residents in these urban areas as well as to visitors, tourists, and residents in surrounding areas, that U.S. State Highway 321 be widened as soon as possible to four (4) lanes from the intersection of U.S. 11 (Broadway) in Lenoir City to the existing four-lane portion of U.S. Highway 321 at the Blount County-Loudon County boundary line; and

WHEREAS, a necessary part of the planning and construction of the remaining four-lane portion of Highway 321 is the design of a bridge to cross the Watts Bar Lake on or near the present Fort Loudoun Dam bridge in order to complete the entire four-laning of U.S. Highway 321; and

WHEREAS, having the design work completed on the bridge will greatly facilitate and expedite the construction of the widening of the highway in the event funds should become available.

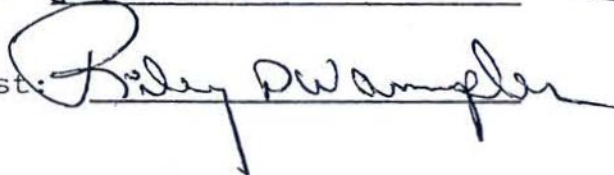
