

LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION

RESOLUTION NO. 3287

RESOLUTION TO FIX THE JAILER'S FEE OF LOUDON COUNTY
FOR MISDEMEANANT PRISONERS

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-26-105, as amended by Chapter 896 of the Public Acts of 1984 and Chapter 93 of the Public Acts of 1985, authorizes county legislative bodies to pass a resolution fixing the amount of jailer's fees which may be applied to misdeanant prisoners for each twenty-four hour period the prisoner is confined to the local facility, (jail or workhouse); and

WHEREAS, the county legislative body of Loudon County is desirous that it be fully compensated for the housing of misdemeanor prisoners;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the county legislative body of Loudon County, meeting this 3rd day of August, 1987, in regular session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. The jailer's fee for Loudon County is hereby fixed at Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per misdemeanor prisoner per twenty-four hour period of confinement in the county jail or county workhouse.

SECTION 2. The jailer's fee herein fixed shall be collected by the Clerk of the appropriate court as a part of the fines and costs imposed in each misdemeanor case upon a finding of guilt.

SECTION 3. A copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to each Clerk of Court hearing criminal matters in Loudon County and shall be spread upon the minutes of this meeting by the County Clerk.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall take effect upon adoption, the general welfare requiring it.
