HOSPITAL REPORT County Executive, George Miller reported he had talked with Mr. McDonald several times concerning the Hospital and that the Committee is still working and hopefully they will have a complete report by the October Meeting.

RE: ESTABLISHMENT OF A 911 EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the establishment of a 911 Emergency Telephone Communication System would shorten time for requests and receiving of emergency services to the citizens of Loudon County, and
