RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING REIMBURSEMENT POLICY REGARDING FUNDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A HARD SURFACED ROAD AND A WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM IN THE MATLOCK BEND INDUSTRIAL AREA OF LOUDON COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission, hereinafter "County", has previously adopted a resolution of intent to approve development funding not to exceed \$2,300,000.00 for the improvement of the Matlock Bend area of the County by constructing a hard-surfaced road and extending water line improvements; and

WHEREAS, Matlock Bend Development, Inc. (hereinafter "Developer"), in order to enhance the marketability of the Matlock Bend Industrial Area to potential industrial process, has agreed to make a proportionate reimbursement from Developer's land sales to the County for the development funds expended by County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled on the 13th day of March, 1989, that the County enter into a written agreement with Developer, the agreement to be recorded in the Register's Office and to include the basic terms and conditions as follows:

- 1. That in consideration of the improvements to be made by Loudon County, the Developer reimburse the County from its land sales an amount not exceeding the total of development funds expended by the County from the proceeds of its bond issue in constructing the presently proposed water line and road improvements in the Matlock Bend area, the obligated amount to include interest incurred by the County on the bonds.
- 2. That after the initial sales to Malibu Boat Company, Bayou Steel, McKinnon Bridge Company, and McKinnon Pre-Stress Concrete Company, the Developer shall make the payments to the County by first paying fifteen percent (15%) of the sales price, or One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per acre, whichever is greater, for each and every lot or tract sold or transferred

during the reimbursement period, not to exceed the County's total development cost as defined herein. Said payments will be paid into an interest bearing escrow account controlled by the County. As the County makes its periodic scheduled bond payments in regard to these improvements, the Developer will receive credit first for the items in paragraph 3 below and then funds will be credited from the escrow account as needed to complete the County's scheduled bond payment.

- 3. That the County shall give additional credit to the Developer on its obligation to Loudon County for funds and revenues received by the County related to the presently proposed improvements in the Matlock Bend area, as follows:
 - A. Grants obtained for said improvements;
- B. Fees and revenues reimbursed to the County from local utilities relating to the improvements to this area;
- C. Additional personal and real property tax revenues received from industries which locate in Matlock Bend after this date and which directly uses the improvements made by the County as a part of this Matlock Bend development project.
- 4. That the Developer be required to deed to the County unencumbered title to all the land needed for the new planned roadway as reasonably determined by the County's engineers to be necessary for the construction of the new Matlock Bend Industrial Road.
- 5. That the payment requirement by Developer to the County is to be released by the County upon the Developer receiving full credit as provided in this resolution for the construction amount expended by the County. Any balance in the escrow account shall be released to the Developer when said payment requirement has been satisfied.
 - 6. That Developer specifically name and bind all the

properties owned by Developer in Matlock Bend, and properties in which developer and/or the owners of Developer have an interest, all of which are to be included as a part of the Agreement, and to include future acquired properties in Matlock Bend.

- 7. That Developer, through its attorney, make available for inspection by any County Commissioner on a personal basis, a current certified net worth balance sheet of the stockholders of Developer.
- 8. That there be a personal guaranty of payment of this reimbursement obligation by the shareholders of Developer.
- 9. That Loudon County not be required to commence construction of the water tank and lines unless and until:
- A. The City of Loudon and Loudon Utilities Board, or other capable utility agency, declares its intent to secure funding to make the necessary improvements to its system so as to be able to provide sufficient water to potential industrial users in the Matlock Bend area.
- B. The City of Loudon and Loudon Utilities Board (LUB) or other utility agency, agree to collect a line assessment charge from all customers that connect to the water line constructed by Loudon County, which line assessment charge will be charged on a front footage basis.
- C. The City of Loudon and Loudon Utilities
 Board or other utility agree to collect an acreage charge from
 the new water customers to recapture the cost of the water tank,
 the formula for the recapture cost to be determined by an engineer
 using standard methods.
 - D. The City of Loudon or other utility agency

agree to pay to the County all monies due under subparagraphs A & B as if the fees and charges were actually collected from the customer, whether or not the fees are actually collected by the City and/or Loudon Utilities Board.
