TELLICO AREA SERVICES SYSTEM

RESOLUTION NO. 94-90

RESOLUTION URGING INCREASED FEDERAL AND STATE AID
FOR CREATING AND EXPANDING RURAL WATER SYSTEMS

WHEREAS, the lack of a potable sanitary water supply has become a matter of major concern in the rural areas of the State of Tennessee, and in many other sections of the entire country; and

WHEREAS, tests have shown that an estimated 75% of all wells being used in East Tennessee (including Loudon County) are now significantly bacterially contaminated; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the safety and health considerations that must be given concerning the sections in the more rural areas which do not have a sanitary water supply, there is the question of facilitating increased economic and industrial development in the rural counties; and

WHEREAS, in particular, of the 20 counties in the State of Tennessee which have the most wells, 13 are in East Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the causes of contamination include underground storage tanks, abandoned hazardous waste sites, fertilizer, herbicides and pesticides, proximity to landfills, dumps and junkyards, subsurface sewage disposal and surface run-off; and

WHEREAS, in many counties, including Loudon County, there are already utility districts or agencies in existence, that are in position for a comparatively inexpensive funding to extend water lines so as to reach a substantial number of people who need and desire water, but such agencies typically are not able to finance the necessary extensions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Loudon County, Tennessee, that the State and Federal government be apprised of the extreme desirability and need for financial assistance to allow the extension of water lines to provide a sanitary water supply to much of the rural population and residences which have such a dire need of these services for their health, safety and convenience.

(9) "Transfer method" means a 911 service in which a public safety answering point, upon receipt of a telephone request for emergency services, directly transfers such request to an appropriate public safety agency or other provider of emergency services; and

(10) "911 service" means regular 911 service enhanced universal emergency number service or enhanced 911 service which is a telephone exchange communications service whereby a public safety answering point may receive telephone calls dialed to the telephone number 911. 911 service includes lines and equipment necessary for the answering, transferring and dispatching of public emergency telephone calls originated by persons within the serving area who dial 911, but does not include dial tone first from pay telephones which may be made available by the service provider based on the ability to recover the costs associated with its implementation and consistent with tariffs filed with the Tennessee public service commission. [Acts 1984, ch. 867, § 3; 1985, ch. 271, § 1.]

7-86-104. Creation — Referendum. — (a) The legislative body of any municipality or county may by ordinance or resolution, respectively, create an emergency communications district within all or part of the boundaries of such municipality or county. Prior to the establishment of such district an election shall be held as provided in subsection (b) of this section.

(b) The legislative body of any municipality or county shall by resolution request the county election commission to submit to the voters within the boundaries of a proposed emergency communications district the question of creating such district in an election to be held pursuant to § 2-3-204. In the election to be held, the questions submitted to the qualified voters shall be, "For the Emergency Communications District" "Against the Emergency Communications District." The county election commission shall certify the results of the election to such legislative body. The expenses of such election shall be paid by such local government. [Acts 1984, ch. 867, § 4.]

7-86-105. Creation — Board of directors. — (a) Upon approval by a majority of the eligible voters within the area of the proposed district voting at such referendum, the legislative body may create an emergency communications district.

(b) The legislative body may appoint a board of directors composed of not less than seven (7) nor more than nine (9) members to govern the affairs of the district.

(c) The members shall serve for a term of four (4) years; provided, however, that the initial members shall be appointed for staggered terms of two (2), three (3), and four (4) years, dating from the effective date of the ordinance or resolution creating such district.

(d) The members shall serve without compensation.

(e) The board of directors shall have complete and sole authority to appoint a chairman and any other officers it may deem necessary from among the membership of the board of directors.

(f) A majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum, and all official action of the board shall require a quorum.

PUBLIC CHAPTER NO. 1209

HOUSE BILL NO. 1292

By Stafford, Melton

Substituted for Senate Bill No. 1172

By Koella

AN ACT authorizing certain counties having a population of not less than 24,000, nor more than 24,300 according to the Federal census of population of 1970 or any subsequent Federal census of population, to establish a merit system and classified service for employees in the Office of Sheriff; to create a merit service board; to provide for its powers, duties and compensation; to provide for competitive tests; to provide for classification of employees; to prohibit classified employees from engaging in political activities; and to provide penalties.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. All counties having a population of not less than twenty-four thousand (24,000) nor more than twenty-four thousand three hundred (24,300) inhabitants according to the Federal Census of population of 1970 or any subsequent federal census, may establish a merit system for employees of the Office of Sheriff of such counties.

SECTION 2. The merit system to which this Act shall apply shall be the classified service which includes all positions and salaried employees in the Office of Sheriff except the Sheriff, chief deputy sheriff, jail cook, bookkeeper and his personal secretary. The Sheriff may appoint his chief deputy provided such chief deputy meets the minimum standards as required by applicable State and County law. The chief deputy is not subject to the merit service board under this Act and serves at the will of the Sheriff, and his employment terminates when the Sheriff's term expires.

SECTION 3. There is hereby created a merit service board composed of three (3) members appointed by the County Judge from the membership of the Quarterly County Court, such appointments being subject to confirmation by the Quarterly Court, to administer the provisions of this Act. No more than two (2) of the members may be from the same political party.

SECTION 4. The terms of the members shall be three (3) years; provided, however, that the initial appointment shall be as follows:
