Loudon County Commission Fact Finding Committee Report Loudon County Landfill

In October 1990 Loudon County Executive, George Miller, appointed a Fact Finding Committee to Study Loudon County's liabilities and fiscal responsibilities associated with the Loudon County Landfill. The fact finding committee was chaired by Commissioner Lynn Milsaps. Members of the committee were Commissioners Jim Price and Mary Williams.

These findings were determined after talking to Jack Crabtree, State Solid Waste Office in Knoxville, State Solid Waste CTAS and CTAS Legal Services.

Committee Findings:

- .(1) The Loudon County Landfill is deeded to Loudon County and the State Operating Permit is issued to Loudon County. Currently Loudon County is totally responsible for all Liability associated with the Landfill.
- (2) The Loudon County Commission has no oversite of the Landfill, nor can there be any according to the current agreements with the city's of Lenoir City and Loudon.
- (3) Operation of the Landfill comes under the oversite of the Loudon County Solid Waste Commission. Representation on this commission is made up of the County Executive and representatives from the cities of Lenoir City and Loudon. In this position the County Executive does not report to the Loudon County Commission.
- (4) The Solid Waste Commission makes no report to the Loudon County Commission.
- (5) The Landfill is operated by Santek under Contract to the Solid Waste Commission.
- (6) A Fynt Engineering study reflects that in the last year the landfill lost 3-4 years capacity due to improper waste compaction. If this type of operation is continued the landfill's useful life will be significantly decreased.
- (7) Loudon County's Liability for the Landfill will continue for 3⊕ years after it's closure.

(8) The landfill operator is being paid approximately \$1000 per week above the contract value for daily covering of waste. Mr. Crabtree of the State Solid Waste Commission stated that Mr. Baker of the Solid Waste Commission was aware of the State Regulation for covering special waste when the city of Loudon operated the landfill. He further stated that Mr. Ed Smith with Santek was aware of this regulation because he had served on the Loudon County Solid Waste Commission before being employed hy Santek.

Recommendations:

- (1) The landfill operator will be paid approximately \$50,000 per year above the contract value for daily waste covering if it continues as is. The committee recommends that the Loudon County Commission direct the County Attorney to investigate this issue and file a formal report of his findings with the Loudon County Commission.
- (2) The two cities (Lenoir City and Loudon) should be put on the Deed of this property and on the State Operating Fermit so that the liability would be shared equally.
- (3) The County Executive should be required to report monthly to the Loudon County Commission. This report should include sufficient information and detail that the Commission is assured that; (1) The landfill is being operated in a manner to minimize Loudon County's current and future liability; (2) The landfill is being operated in a manner to assure the maximum cost effect life at a minimum cost to the county; and (3) The landfill operator is being paid in accordance with the contract.

The Fact Finding Committee ask that this report be entered into the records of this meeting and that this committee be dissolved.
