Attorney Sproul reported that the suit brought by a surviving widow to recover \$15,900.00 which had been confiscated by Anderson Law Enforcement Authorities, but with cooperation by Loudon County Authorities, had been dismissed as to Loudon County (Lisa Meade V. Loudon County, No. 8447 Loudon County Chancery Court.)

LIABILITY
INSURANCE

The County Attorney also reported that he had not received a written response to his request from the County's two Liability Insurance Companies (which carry Insurance on the County Communication Dispatchers), concerning the request by the Loudon County Emergency Communications District (E-911 Board), for Indemnification for any negligent acts of the Dispatchers. The Mutual Indemnification Agreement was requested by LCED in order to maintain the Liability Insurance on the 911 Board. The Attorney continued to feel that the County should not Commit to the Idemnity Agreement until a written response was received by its own Insurance Companies. He stated that an alternative would be to transfer the responsibility for the dispatching function from the Loudon County Law Enforcement Agency to LCECD, or to make arrangements so that the amse Insurance Company cover LCECD, LCLEA, and the Sheriff's Department (It now is three different Companies). Any negligent Act by anyone would then be covered without an argeement between the companies. Also a Representative of one of the Companies had suggested that there should be a specific written agreement between LCECD and LCLEA providing for the operation of the LCECD equipment and Computer Database, and the related Authority and responsibilities involved therein.

CABLE
TELEVISION
NEGOTIATIONS

Attorney Sproul reported that negotiations continue between the Joint Committee (now primarily working with the proposed Lenoir City Franchise Agreement, which would be approved first), and that the items being negotiated were narrowing. He felt that the Committee should be able to come to a final recommendation to be made to the Lenoir City Council the next Monday Night. The County would then consider a proposed Agreement which would be very similar. The present negotiations are underway with Intermedia Patners, which is to be the Purchaser of the Cablevision systems in East Tennessee, although this sale/purchase is not completed as yet. The primary issue remaining has to do with whether or not the City (and the County) would be able to regulate basic rates in the event Federal Law should later allow it, with the Cable Company wanting the City/County to give up any right to do this. The present matter of negotiation is that the Company has agreed to future Regulation if the City agrees to the Appointment of a Joint Cablevision authority of Non-Publicly elected members.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AND NAMING CERTAIN ROADS IN LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE BY THE LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission is vested with the authority to accept the dedication of roads for public use, and

WHEREAS, the regional planning commission has recommended the acceptance of the proceeding roads and rights-of-way of which have been designed and constructed pursuant to the county's road acceptance standards and subdivision regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the following roads, and corresponding names herein dedicated for public use be accepted into the county's roadway system:

Section 1. Extension of Silo Drive, said road as shown on the subdivision plat of Silo Acres Subdivision, Section IV, recorded in the Loudon County Register's Office Plat Cabinet B, slide 172.


Section 2. Forest Hills Drive, said road as shown on the subdivision plat of Forest Hills Subdivision, recorded in the Loudon County Register's Office, Plat Cabinet B, slide 172.

Section 3. Eastman Drive, Monterey Drive and Matlock Bend Road East, said roads located in Matlock Bend Industrial Park with the following easements/rights-of-ways as recorded in the Loudon County Register's Office: Deed Book 183, pg. 378; Deed Book 183, pg. 380; Deed Book 183, pg. 382; Deed Book 183, pg. 384; Deed Book 183, pg. 386; Deed Book 183, pg. 390; Deed Book 184, pg. 37 (Tract 1); Deed Book 184, pg. 41 (Tract 1-A); Deed Book 184, pg. 48 (Tract 1-B); Deed Book 184, pg. 59 (Tract 2); Deed Book 184, pg. 63 (Tract 3); Deed Book 184, pg. 69 (Tract 4); Deed Book 184, pg. 73 (Tract 5).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this resolution take effect immediately the public welfare requiring it.
