RESOLUTION NO. 82-92

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE MINUTES OF THE  
JUNE 1, 1992, COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING CONCERNING ACCEPTANCE  
OF THE TELlico PARKWAY AS A COUNTY ROAD

WHEREAS, the question of acceptance of the Tellico Parkway as a County road was considered at the June 1, 1992, meeting of the Loudon County Commission; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Roy Bledsoe made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Mary Williams, to accept the road subject to certain limitations; and

WHEREAS, the minutes of the meeting as written by the County Clerk do not appear to accurately set out the motion as it was made within the context of the discussion that occurred as to this matter;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled on this 9th day of July, 1992, that the portion of the minutes relating to the Tellico Parkway be stricken from the minutes as written, and that the following be substituted:

As to the issue concerning the acceptance of the Tellico Parkway as a County Road, and the maintenance of the road, the County Executive requested the decision of the Board of Commissioners with the comment that the TVA offer of \$300,000.00, and \$100,000.00 from the Tellico Reservoir Development Agency, to bring the roadway up to standards was going to be withdrawn if something was not decided. After considerable discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Bledsoe, seconded by Commissioner Mary Williams, that the County accept the Tellico Parkway as a County road, under the following conditions, restrictions and limitations:

1. That the County only accept the roadway for the approximately eight (8) miles that goes through the TRDA property, and not including the portion of the road that goes through TVA property;
2. That TRDA and TVA contribute the \$400,000.00 and bring the Parkway up to State standards, in accordance with the study by the Consulting Engineers;
3. That the County not be responsible for any maintenance on the road for five (5) years from the time that the maintenance and improvement repairs are completed, including mowing and litter pick-up.
4. That a weight limit be placed upon the roadway, prohibiting heavy through trucks going between U. S. Highway 321 and State Highway 72 from using the road.

5. That the County apply to place the Road on the "State Aid" Program;

During discussion, the County Executive stated that he felt that TVA's offer was conditioned upon acceptance of the entire Tellico Parkway, not just the TRDA portion, but Commissioner Bledsoe explained that he did not want to change his motion.

On roll call, the vote was five to four in favor of the motion, with Commissioners Blair, Park, Maples, and Price voting against it, whereupon Chairman Blair declared the motion adopted.

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

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A VEHICLE LOAD LIMIT ON  
THE TELLICO PARKWAY

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission has taken steps to accept that portion of the Tellico Parkway lying south of the TVA/TRDA property boundary line as it extends to its juncture with State Highway 72; and

WHEREAS, upon the meeting of certain conditions, that described portion of the Tellico Parkway shall become a County road of Loudon County; and

WHEREAS, the roadway is to be repaired and improved so as to bring the roadway up to acceptable standards as a part of its being accepted by Loudon County; and

WHEREAS, when the road is brought up to standard, it is necessary that the said road not be heavily traveled by trucks and/or other vehicles in excess of what the construction of the road will allow; and

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the County Commission that the Tellico Parkway is being used by heavy trucks using the Parkway between U. S. Highway 321 and State Highway 72 as a "through" highway, rather than using the State and Federal highways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled this 9th day of July, 1992, that upon its becoming a County roadway, the following limitations and restrictions are established on that portion of the Tellico Parkway, lying south of the TVA/Tellico Reservoir Development Agency/Cooper Communities boundary line and extending to State Highway 72:

BE IT RESOLVED that all vehicles having more than a single axle (steering axle not included) are prohibited from using the specified portion of the Tellico Parkway. Tandem and Tri-Axle vehicles are specifically prohibited.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that single axle vehicles bearing a gross weight of more than 22,000 pounds are prohibited.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with Tennessee Code Annotated, Sections 55-11-205(a) and (b) and

Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-11-206(a), any person violating the rules and regulations prescribed herein shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, a fine of \$50.00 shall be assessed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this prohibition shall not apply to heavy vehicles bearing shipments originating or destined, as shown by a bill of lading, or other verifiable documentation, to anywhere within the area owned by Cooper Communities, Inc. and the Tellico Reservoir Development Agency, more generally known as Tellico Village and its various neighborhoods as recorded and defined in the Register's Office of Loudon County, Tennessee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution is not intended to restrict vehicles, equipment or machinery that is related to farm or agricultural uses which by necessity have to use any of the roads named in this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said Parkway shall be adequately posted to notify drivers as to the prohibited use.
