RESOLUTION NO. 104-93

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR ISTEAFUNDS

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Visitors Bureau (LCVB) has been working this past year on the beautification of Loudon County's four interstate exits, and has been working with the County's staff planner and State officials toward this goal; and

WHEREAS, a new Federal program, the Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act, has authorized Federal grants on an 80% Federal, 20% local sharing basis, granted through the State; and

WHEREAS, the cost of beautification of Interstate Exit 81 (I-75 at U.S. Highway 321) has been estimated at \$20,000 to landscape and beautify this exit; and

WHEREAS, LCVB proposes that Loudon County provide 1/2 of the match of the local share of \$4,000.00, with the City of Lenoir City to be requested to provide the other 1/2, or \$2,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled this 7th day of December, 1992, that the Loudon County Visitors Bureau be authorized to apply for such a grant through the auspices of Loudon County (if the grant application is so required to be by a governmental unit), and that it be the intent of Loudon County to contribute up to \$2,000.00, or 1/2 of the local share of the grant, whichever is less, if the grant application is approved.

## Resolution

NO. 105-

WHEREAS, Chickamauga Lock, (completed in 1937) near Chattanooga, Tennessee, is one of the oldest and smallest (60' x 360') locks on the Tennessee River; is showing signs of severe structural deterioration; is plagued by concrete growth; and is in need of constant repair, and

WHEREAS, rates for commercial traffic above Chattanooga are approximately double those below Chickamauga because of the current "one-barge-at-a-time" lockages necessary due to small lock capacity, thus creating an extreme hardship and high cost for businesses, employing thousands of workers, that rely on water transportation to ship and receive goods and products, and

WHEREAS, with no auxiliary lock available, lock outages for maintenance and repair completely shuts off the entire Upper Tennessee River to both commercial and recreational through traffic, and

WHEREAS, recreational traffic adds substantially to the area's economy every year with special events like the River Bend Festival, Fall Color Cruise and the "Vol Navy," and

WHEREAS, construction of a new 110' x 600' lock on the river side of the existing lock, which could accommodate an eight-barge tow in a single lockage, would cut delays and congestion, and improve economic growth opportunities, and

WHEREAS, the existing lock could be utilized during construction of a new lock, keeping the river open to traffic, and after the new lock was completed, the existing lock could be used as an auxiliary,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the undersigned, do hereby wish to go on record by virtue of our signatures, in favor of the lock addition project for Chickamauga Lock and Dam, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, do hereby respectfully request your support relative to the necessary aspects of this project, such as continued funding, etc., until this project reaches completion.

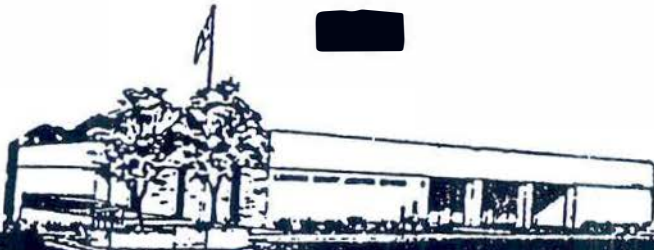
