The resolution as follows "Resolution Ratifying And Approving The Amendments Authorizing House Bill No 2255 As Formulated in The Public Acts of The 1996 Tennessee Legislature (99th General Assembly) Amending TCA 8-10-101; Section 8-10-101; Section 8-10-108; Section 40- 6-210; Section 55-8-152; Section 57-5-202; Section 57-9-101 Relative to Constables In Any County Having A Population of Not Less than 31,000 Nor More Than 31,400, According to the 1990 Census, or Any Subsequent Federal Census." LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 042296

RESOLUTION RATIFYING AND APPROVING THE AMENDMENTS AUTHORIZED IN HOUSE BILL NO. 2255 AS FORMULATED IN THE PUBLIC ACTS OF THE 1996 TENNESSEE LEGISLATURE (99th GENERAL ASSEMBLY) AMENDING T.C.A. 8-10-101; SECTION 8-10-108; SECTION 40-6-210; SECTION 55-8-152; SECTION 57-5-202; AND SECTION 57-9-101 RELATIVE TO CONSTABLES IN ANY COUNTY HAVING A POPULATION OF NOT LESS THAN 31,100 NOR MORE THAN 31,400, ACCORDING TO THE 1990 FEDERAL CENSUS, OR ANY SUBSEQUENT FEDERAL CENSUS

WHEREAS, House Bill No. 2255 (by Honorable Doug Gunnels and Howard Kerr), has been enacted into law as Public Chapter No. 753 of the Acts of the Ninety-Ninth General Assembly (1996), and signed into law by Governor Don Sundquist on April 16, 1996, its effectiveness being subject to approval of a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the County Commission of any county having a population of not less than 31,100 nor more than 31,400, desiring to come within the

provisions of the aforesaid legislation; and
WHEREAS, the adoption of said amendments by the Loudon
County Commission has the effect of removing the law enforcement powers of Constables in Loudon County immediately upon adoption, and the abolishment of the office of Constable in Loudon County effective September 1, 1998; and

WHEREAS, Loudon County, Tennessee, has a population of 31,255, according to the 1990 Federal Census, and the Loudon County Commission feels that adoption of a resolution bringing Loudon County within the terms of the legislation is in the best

interest of the people of Loudon County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County
Commission, in special session assembled this 22nd day of April,
1996, that in accordance with Section 7 of the aforesaid Act of the 99th General Assembly, the amendments authorized in Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of said Act are hereby ratified and approved, and do hereby take effect on this date, the caption of said Act being as follows:

> AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 8-10-101; Section 8-10-108; Section 40-6-210; Section 55-8-152; Section 57-5-202 and Section 57-9-101, relative to constables in any county having a population of not less than thirty-one thousand one hundred (31,100) nor more than thirtyone thousand four hundred (31,400), according to the 1990 Federal Census or any subsequent Federal Census.
