The County requested to pump the water from one quarry pit to another in order to clean the primary pit out and get it inspected. This needs to be done in order to get approval for the demolition landfill.

Commissioner Duff reported that bids for the Justice Center addition would be opened on May 20th. He reported any recommendations from the Capital Projects Committee on this would be deferred to meeting in June.

Commissioner Duff reported many calis had been received regarding the hazardous intersection of Browder School Road and Highway 11. He stated that the Browder family is asking the county to consider taking part of their land for improvements to the intersection. He questioned whether this intersection could be a candidate for the hazardous elimination program. RESOLUTION APPROVING LOUDON COUNTY METRO NARCOTICS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF LENOIR CITY AND THE CITY OF LOUDON

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 12-9-101 et seq. authorizes public agencies to enter into Interlocal Cooperation Agreements; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 6-54-307 authorizes law enforcement agencies to provide one another with mutual assistance and law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 58-2-601 et seq. authorizes local governments to provide one another with emergency assistance; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 913, of the Public Acts of 1988 of Tennessee authorizes the District Attorney General to participate in a Judicial District Drug Task Force and authorizes law enforcement officers assigned to Drug Task Force to exercise law enforcement jurisdiction throughout the Judicial District; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lenoir City, the City of Loudon and the County of Loudon, with the approval and cooperation of the Sheriff of Loudon County, which are parties to this Agreement wish to avail themselves of all authority conferred by these statutes and any other provisions of the law, to create and operate Loudon County Metro Narcotics (L.C.M.N.), which will identify and prosecute the users, sellers, distributors, transporters and manufacturers of controlled substances within the Ninth Judicial District; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed in the public interest by the Loudon County Commission that such a multi-jurisdictional Narcotics unit be created.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled this <u>5th</u> day of <u>May</u>, 1997, that the entry by Loudon County and the Loudon County Sheriff's Department into an agreement with the City of Lenoir

City and the City of Loudon to form a Loudon County Metro Narcotics Agency is approved, with the format and content to be in the general form of the attached "Interlocal Cooperation and Mutual Aid Agreement for Loudon County Metro Narcotics", and with the County Executive to negotiate the final provisions of the Agreement, it being specifically provided that if one party should decide not to participate, the remaining parties may proceed with the agreement.

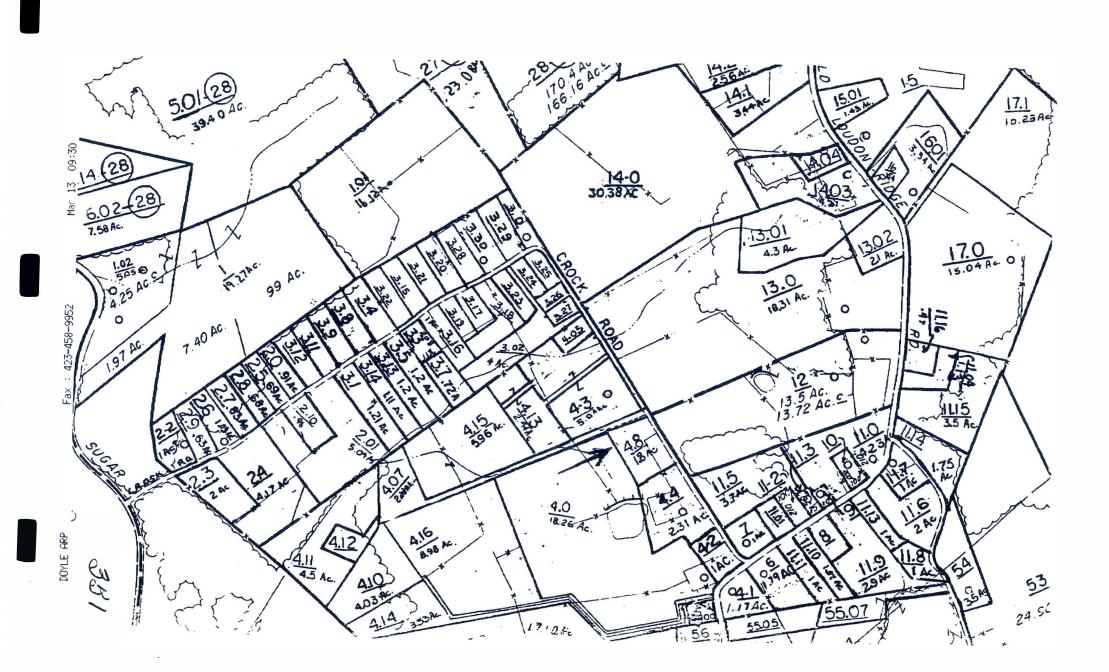
