**BE IT REMEMBERED**, that the Commission of Loudon County, convened in regular session in Loudon, Tennessee on the 5th day of January 1998.

The meeting was called to order by **Chairman Roy Bledsoe**.

**Sheriff Tim Guider** opened Court and led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Hank McGee, Loudon County Assistant Superintendent of Schools, gave the Invocation.

Executive Miller asked the commission to grant him authority to pay the health department \$500.00 to do study on the Gentry Drive property.

Loudon County may obtain this software in its present form for a fee of \$1500. A Memorandum of Understanding and Mutual Aid Agreement between Blount County and Loudon County was read at the request of Commissioner Park.

A motion was made by Commissioner Park with second by Commissioner Twiggs to enter into this agreement with Blount County for use of their software for a fee if \$1500.

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# RESOLUTION NO. $0105^{\circ}$ %

### RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING PASSAGE OF THE ANTI-CORRIDOR ANNEXATION LEGISLATION

WHEREAS, Loudon County and other counties in the State of Tennessee have suffered from excessive "corridor" or "finger" annexation, wherein municipalities have annexed thin strips of land or roadways far into the County in order to take by annexation sales-tax revenue producing properties; and

WHEREAS, such "corridor" or "finger" annexations clearly do not meet any rational definition of "orderly and planned growth" for any municipality; and

WHEREAS, such "corridor" or "finger" annexations cause tremendous dislocation and confusion in the provision of various governmental services throughout the cities and counties where they occur; and

WHEREAS, such "corridor" or "finger" annexations generally are transparently a device used by municipalities to increase their revenues without having to provide any meaningful services to the area annexed; and

WHEREAS, such annexations tend to increase taxes for all the citizens, inside and outside of cities, and lessen the efficiency of the provision of government services for all citizens, inside and outside of cities, and have a real and substantial negative effect wherever they are commonly practiced;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled this 5th day of January. 1998, that the Loudon County Commission congratulates the Tennessee Senate for the passage of SB 1841, which substantially limits or prohibits the ability of municipalities to engage in "corridor" or "finger" annexation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Loudon County Commission urges and encourages the Tennessee House of Representatives to pass HB 1873, the companion House Bill which also would prohibit or greatly restrict "corridor" or "finger" annexations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Loudon County Commission further encourages Governor Don Sundquist immediately to sign and implement SB 1841 and HB 1873 upon final passage by the Tennessee Legislature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this Resolution to all members of the Loudon County Legislative Delegation and to the Office of Governor Don Sundquist.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if any notifications are to be made to effectuate this Resolution, then the County Clerk is hereby requested to forward a copy of this Resolution to the proper authority.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, this Resolution take effect from and after its passage, as provided by the Charter of Loudon County, Tennessee, the public welfare requiring it.

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# RESOLUTION NO. 3/05 98

### RESOLUTION REQUESTING STATE ASSISTANCE FOR OLD HIGHWAY 95 AND HARRISON AVENUE INTERSECTION

WHEREAS, there exists in Lenoir City, Tennessee, a dangerous intersection located at Old Highway 95 and Harrison Avenue at the corner of Lenoir City High School, and one block from the Lenoir City Middle School; and

WHEREAS, this dangerous intersection lies partly within the municipal boundaries of Lenoir City, and is partially under Loudon County jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, this intersection creates a hazard to the safety and health of our school children as well as the community at large; and

WHEREAS, the Lenoir City Schools and the City of Lenoir City lack the economic and technical resources to enable to remedy this dangerous intersection; and

WHEREAS, it is felt that an engineering study could reveal the most economical and technically suitable alternative to remedy this dangerous intersection; and

WHEREAS, within its various departments, the State of Tennessee has the required expertise to assist the local governments; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission supports the request for assistance of the Lenoir City Schools, and the City of Lenoir City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled this 5th day of January. 1998, that it supports the request of the Lenoir City Schools and the City of Lenoir City, Tennessee, for technical and economic assistance from the State of Tennessee, and that our State Representatives be requested all possible aid and assistance in furtherance of this objective.
