No opposition voiced.
- 3) Rezoning request for property within ConKinnon Pointe Subdivision on Glen Mar Drive and Coppock Lane (a private lane) off Paris Drive, located in the Third Legislative District, referenced by Tax Map 31, Parcel 12, from A-2, Rural Residential District, to R-1, Suburban Residential District, including the R-E, single Family Exclusive Overlay District
No opposition voiced.
- 4) Rezoning request for property on Highway 321, South, located in the Third Legislative District, referenced by Tax Map 31, Parcel 30.00, from A-2, Rural Residential District, to C-2, General Commercial District
No opposition voiced.
- 5) Rezoning request for property on West Meadow Road, located in the Third Legislative District, referenced by Tax Map 66, Parcel 9, from A-1, Agriculture-Forestry District, to R-1, Suburban Residential District
- 6) Mr. David Hammontree, Mr. Lynn Slack and Ms. Harrison, and Ms. Debra Serphos, area residents and property owners, spoke in opposition of this request. Some concerns mentioned were the lack of restrictions, concerns of possible wastewater problems, traffic problems service costs to the county, and schools.

Executive Miller gave an update on the wage and hour study proposals. Two businesses have turned in proposals to do the study.

A **Motion** was made by **Commissioner Ledbetter** with a second by **Commissioner Park** to refer this item back to the budget committee to review the two proposals and make a recommendation to the commission at the next meeting.

Upon voice vote the motion **Passed** unanimously

Executive Miller asked the County Commission to discuss recycling efforts and would like to know how extensive and dedicated the efforts should be and point out this effort will call for matching funds and possible additional manpower to supervise the program. **Executive Miller** also pointed out to the commission that will likely be no revenue to the county but could possibly extend the life of the landfill. Grants for these extensive efforts should need to be applied for quickly now but will be available from year to year as long as a tip fee is paid at the landfill.

Commissioner Twiggs asked if the solid waste commission had been asked to participate in a recycling program and if not would the County Executive ask them if they be willing. **Executive Miller** stated the solid waste commission has not been asked to participate in the program but there are funds available from the solid waste commission that can be used toward the matching funds. **Commissioner Randolph** supports the effort and stated that he felt it would help solve the litter problem as well. **Commissioner Randolph** along with **Commissioner Duff** stated that they would like to ask the cities if they would be willing to join the county on the recycling commitment.

Commissioner Park stated that this matter should be referred back to the budget committee for further review and more details be presented as so far as the expense of the recycling effort. **Commissioner Duff** asked that the county executive contact the two cities and report at the workshop.

Executive Miller requested the commission to authorize Howard Luttrell, Purchasing Agent, to purchase equipment for the grant due by March 31, 1998 with a commitment of matching funds of \$12,000 from the county.

Commissioner Twiggs made a motion with a second by **Commissioner Randolph** to authorize the purchasing agent to spend the money on this first grant.

Upon roll call vote the following commissioners voted Aye: **Randolph, Bivens, Maples, Ledbetter, Masingo, Bledsoe, Duff, Park and Twiggs (9).**

Thereupon the chairman announced the motion **Passed** unanimously.

Commissioner Randolph has asked **Executive Miller** to appoint a committee to oversee the recycling efforts and bring the recommendations back to the commission at the next meeting.

Executive Miller brought before the commission a letter of request by Judge John Gibson for vacation time or pay. A resolution has been brought before the commission to support legislation allowing an attorney to be appointed to sit on the bench for an absent judge. This bill if passed should take care of the situation with Judge Gibson.

Commissioner Duff made a motion with a second by **Commissioner Park** to adopt A Resolution Urging State Legislators To Support Senate Bill 2742, House Bill 2111, Permitting General Sessions Judges To Appoint Attorneys To Sit For An Absent Judge and to take no action at this time on Judge Gibson's request.

APPOINT ATTORNEYS TO SIT FOR AN ABSENT JUDGE**

WHEREAS, Loudon County and several other counties in Tennessee have only one general sessions judge,

WHEREAS, these judges generally are not legally permitted to appoint attorneys to sit for them,

WHEREAS, the caseload of a General Sessions Court does not allow it to be shut down to permit the judge to take vacation or personal leave time,

WHEREAS, the state legislature has before it Senate Bill 2742, House Bill 2111, which attempts to correct this problem by making it easier for General Session judges to appoint attorneys to provide them time off from the bench.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Legislative Body, meeting February 9, 1998, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that the Loudon County Commission hereby urges our House and Senate Representatives to support this or similar legislation to remedy this situation for Loudon County and other counties that operate with only one General Sessions judge.

WHEREAS, in addition there are four additional corrections involving map number and parcel decimal point changes (Brown, Browder, Gullimet and First National Bank);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled this 9th day of February, 1998, that Resolution No. 090897 Exhibit U, is hereby amended to show that:

1. M/M Joe Allen were the owners of parcels designated as Tax Map 11G, Parcels 35 and 36, which now have become consolidated into Parcel 35 and, accordingly, are subject to only one sewer assessment.
