LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. <u>040599</u> - A

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT TO UTILIZE THE TENNESSEE AGING NETWORK TO IMPLEMENT THE HOME AND COMMUNITY BASED SERVICE SYSTEM FOR THE ELDERLY AND DISABLED INDIVIDUALS

WHEREAS, the Tennessee General Assembly appointed a special joint legislative Long Term Care Study Committee in 1997 to investigate the need for home and community based services in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee General Assembly passed legislation in 1998 calling for a home and community based service plan to be developed through a special planning and advisory council appointed by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, most states have applied for and received Medicaid waivers to provide home and community based services, such as, adult day care services, homemaker and chore services, home delivered meals, respite care, rehabilitative care, escorted transportation, personal care, and additional supportive services to caregivers; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Commission of Loudon County recommends that the members of the 101st General Assembly support legislation that will provide funding for additional home and community based services and that the Tennessee Aging Network be utilized as the delivery system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following principles be considered as the General Assembly debates this issue:

- The Tennessee Commission On Aging, the nine Area Agencies on Aging, and over 100 service provider agencies across the state have over 20 years experience in service delivery to disabled elders in Tennessee.
- Tennessee should avoid placing the management of home and community services under the auspices of managed care organizations.
- Provide adequate funding for a client advocacy (care management) service through each Area Agency on Aging across Tennessee to provide for client assessment and the arrangement for services based on the individual's functional needs.
- Allow for cost sharing so those who are financially able can pay a portion of the cost of the service.
- Establish the home community based services on a social model not a medical model of service delivery.
- Design the HCBS program to allow for flexibility based on the needs of the clients.

Adopted this 5th day of April 1999, the health, safety, order, prosperity, and general welfare of the citizens of Loudon County requiring it.

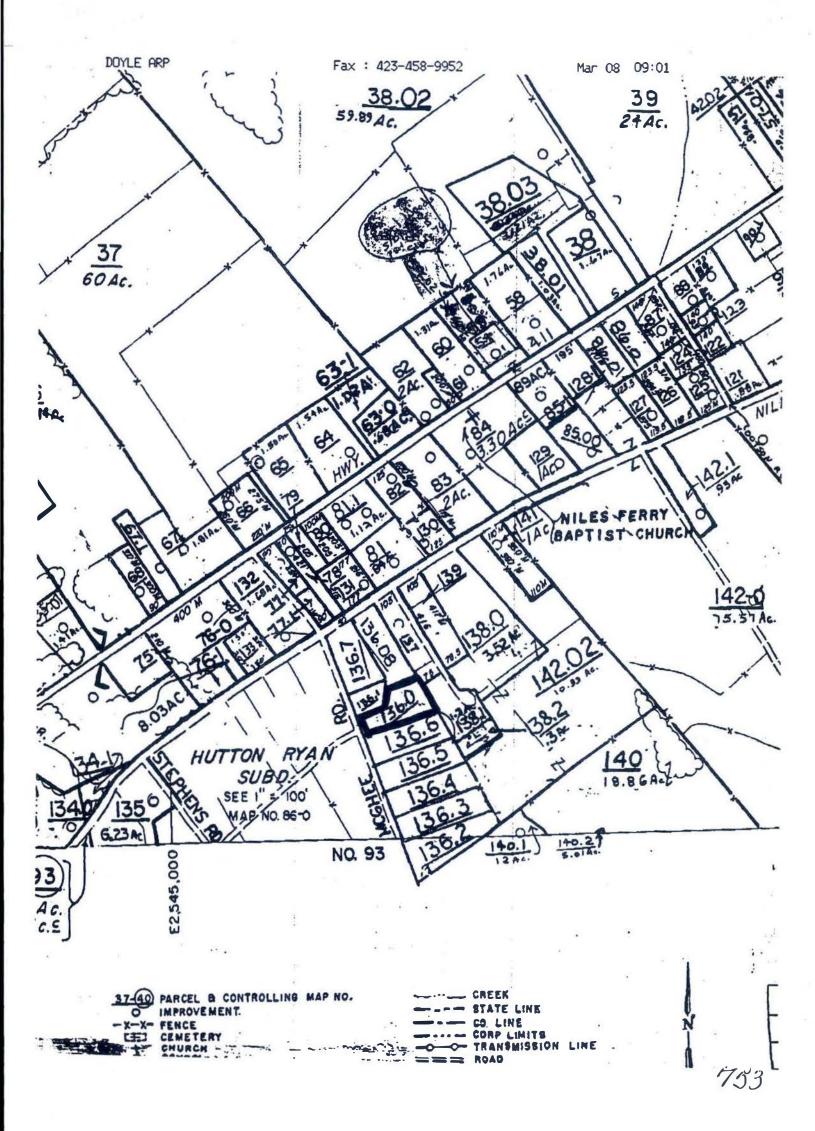
