LEASE

THIS LEASE, made and entered into this <u>lst</u> day of <u>March</u>, 2000, by and between LOUDON COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Tennessee (hereinafter called "LESSOR"), and **GLENDALE** COMMUNITY CLUB, INC., a non-profit Tennessee corporation serving as a community organization working toward the welfare of the Glendale community, in the Third Civil District of Loudon County, Tennessee (hereinafter called "LESSEE");

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Glendale School located at or near the intersection of State Highway 95 and the Davis Ferry Road, was closed by the Loudon County Board of Education several years ago; and

WHEREAS, by agreement, one of the buildings was left standing for several years, and it and the grounds have been maintained and used by the Glendale Community Club for the purpose of carrying on various community-related activities, including the use of the building for the holding of public elections in Loudon County; and

WHEREAS, the community desires to continue the use and maintenance of this building, the recreation field and the acreage associated with it, being approximately 2.24 acres, and being designated on Map 47, Parcel 57, in the Property Assessor's Office (a copy of the Property Assessor's tax map being attached hereto as a description).

IN CONSIDERATION THEREOF, the Lessee covenants and agrees with Lessor as follows:

 That it will keep proper maintenance of said property and keep the premises presentable and in a good state of repair.

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2. To use the premises for community service activities including properly supervised private activities similar to those authorized in other places of public assemblage.

3. To assure that the premises are not used illegally in any way.

4. To keep the utilities and all other expenses paid on said premises during the term of this lease.

5. To safeguard and indemnify Lessor from any liability growing out of any accidents or incidents that may happen by the use of said property by Lessee, or used by those authorized by Lessee, it being understood, however, that Lessor will remain responsible for the negligence of any of its officials, employees and/or agents arising out of the use of the premises by the county for County official activities and events (e.g. public elections).

IT IS FURTHER AGREED

6. This lease is for a period of one (1) year, which shall automatically be extended for one (1) year at a time, for a total of ten (10) years unless cancelled by either party in writing on or before sixty (60) days prior to the lease expiration date.

7. Lessor may assume or retake possession of the leased property, due to the Lessee's failure to maintain said property, failure to keep the premises maintained, or upon Lessee's failure to comply with the lease agreement, or in the event that Lessee shall become inactive as an organization; provided that Lessee shall first receive notice in writing of any default, and have sixty (60) days within which to correct any deficiencies.

8. Lessor shall have no duty to do any maintenance on said property during the term of this lease.

9. The premises may be used by Lessor, at its option, for county public elections and from time to time for other reasonable public occasions and events.

10. This lease agreement may be amended only by mutual consent in writing.

RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION CLOSING A CERTAIN ABANDONED PORTION OF WHITE WING ROAD LOCATED NEAR HIGHWAY 321 IN THE FIFTH LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT OF LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the chief legislative body of the county has the authority, under <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, to accept the dedication of roads, close existing roads, adopt standards for the acceptance of new roads and reopen previously closed or abandoned roads; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Regional Planning Commission has received for review a request from owners (or their representatives) of property located adjacent to an abandoned road, requesting the closing of that roadway or segment known as White Wing Road; and

WHEREAS, applicant feels the described abandoned roadway has no present nor future public use, and desires that any county encumbrance caused by the presence of the road bed be removed; and

WHEREAS, identified affected property owners were notified and a public notice and description of the request appeared in the Loudon County News Herald on January 13, 2000, consistent with the provisions of Loudon County's Procedure for Closing a Public Road; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Regional Planning Commission has reviewed this matter, including the recommendation of the County Highway Superintendent, and based on its investigation has determined that, in its opinion, the closing of said road will not adversely affect any property owners or the present or future function of the County's roadway system, and recommends the closure of said road, described as follows:

A segment of White Wing Road that intersects with Highway 321 North to the east approximately 0.3 miles from the I-40/Highway 321 interchange. The segment to be closed extends approximately 528' from its present dead-end to the joint property line being more specifically shown on the attached map, incorporated herein.

WHEREAS, the County Commission feels the closing of the roadway is not detrimental to the community or to the present or future function of the County roadway system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled on this 7th day of February, 2000, that the aforedescribed section of the abandoned roadway is hereby closed, with any interest the County has in the roadway being hereby relinquished as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that although the only legal requirement of the County Commission is to adopt a resolution closing the described roadway, upon a request by an adjacent landowner, and upon review by the County Attorney and a determination that, in the attorney's opinion, the execution of a Quitclaim Deed evidencing the release and conveyance of any interest the County might have in the aforedescribed roadway would not adversely affect the rights of any property owners, the Loudon County Executive is hereby authorized to execute a Quitclaim Deed for the roadway (or the portion thereof) hereby authorized to be closed, upon the payment of attorney's fees and any expenses involved by the applicant.
