A RESOLUTION OF INTENT BY THE LOUODN COUNTY COMMISSION OF THE COUNTY OF LOUDON TO PARTICIPATE IN AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF LENOIR CITY, TENNESSEE, TO PARTICIPATE AND SUPPORT CERTAIN WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS TO STIMULATE THE ECONOMIC POTENTIAL OF THE NORTHERN PORTION OF LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE

Whereas, Loudon County and Lenoir City have adopted a growth management plan that identifies urban growth boundaries, planned growth boundaries and rural areas, and

Whereas, Lenoir City's urban growth boundaries include areas contiguous to Hwy. 70, U. S. 321 and Interstate 75, and

Whereas, the projected land use contemplates medium density residential and commercial uses within the City's urban growth boundaries, and

Whereas, certain utilities are necessary to maximize the areas potential for economic growth and increase in public revenues, and

Whereas, an adequate public water system (volume and pressure) is essential in order to stimulate residential and commercial growth within the area of concern, and

Whereas, Lenoir City Utilities Board has completed an assessment of water system needs that involve the construction of approximately 37,000' of 16" water mains and a 500,000 to 1,000,000 gallon reservoir to adequately serve the long term growth projections with an estimated cost of \$4.5 M, and

Whereas, the City and County have successfully engaged in previous interlocal agreements for public infrastructure/facilities for the mutual benefit of the residents of the community and to stimulate sound economic development opportunities.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that it is the desire of the Loudon County Commission to collaborate financially with the City of Lenoir City in supporting the construction of certain water system improvements in the northern portion of Loudon County, within the City's urban growth boundaries for the purpose of stimulating future economic development of the area.

RESOLUTION NO. 040102-G

RESOLUTION REAPPORTIONING SCHOOL BOARD DISTRICTS

WHEREAS, the County Commission, by Resolution No. 110501-G has reapportioned the voting legislative districts for the election of members to the Loudon County Commission, with the First, Second, and Fifth Districts having two members, and the Third, Fourth, Sixth, and new Seventh Districts having one member; and

WHEREAS, since the late 1960's when the first Quarterly County Court reapportionment plan was approved by the U.S. District Court for Eastern Tennessee, the Loudon County legislative body has been composed of a total of nine (9) County Commissioners apportioned according to population with various numbers of members in various districts, which were established based upon the geographical, political, and sociological makeup of Loudon County; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 172 of the Private Acts of 1979 established and reorganized the Loudon County Board of Education, calling for the election of the same number of Board of Education members as there are County Commission members and from the same districts; and

WHEREAS, since that time, organization of the Board of Education has continued since that time, to "track" the Loudon County Commission reapportionments each time that has occurred, with the Commission continuing to utilize the approximate district boundaries that were established in the beginning, with adjustments and variations based upon population shifts; and

WHEREAS, the population in Loudon County increased dramatically in the decade between 1990 and the year 2000, with a substantial amount of the increase coming from the new lakeshore community development of Tellico Village; and

WHEREAS, in preparation for the 2002 county election, after the census data had become available, the County Commission decided (in order to keep most of the county district lines and the voting precincts approximately the same as they have been for over thirty years) to add a new one person district (District No. 7) which primarily encompasses Tellico Village inasmuch as the new population that has grown there is approximately the population that is needed to add a district and keep the number of Commissioners representing the various districts proportionate; and

WHEREAS, legislation adopted in 1992 to improve education required reapportionment after each census, and required a Private Act if a county desired to increase the number of members on the Board above nine; and

WHEREAS, in preparation of the Private Act to increase the number of School Board members to ten in accordance with the decision of the County Commission to add a legislative district of one person for the 2002 reapportionment, the Loudon County Board of Education retained Attorney Charles Cagle of Nashville, Tennessee, who was one of the persons instrumental in drawing and preparing the 1992 education legislation which required statewide certain changes in the organization of School Boards, including staggered terms, election of Board members (rather than appointment), the employment of the Director of Schools, etc., and he drew a proposed Private Act (which apparently he felt would be legal), so as to "track" the County Commission reapportioned districts as has traditionally been done for the Board of Education in Loudon County in the past; and

WHEREAS, when this requested Private Act was presented to the legislature, contrary to the plan prepared by Attorney Cagle, a question arose in the legislative legal office as to whether School Board districts as outlined in the requested Private Act, met the specific wording of the 1992 statute requiring equal districts, inasmuch as some districts had two members and some had one, although the two-member districts are proportionately divided as to population with the one-member districts; and

WHEREAS, the original Private Act prepared for Loudon County this year has now been modified by the county's legislators to basically and simply increase the number of Commissioners by one (to a total of ten), leaving it as the duty and authority of the County Commission to adopt a valid reapportionment plan for the ten School Board members being authorized by the new Private Act; and

WHEREAS, it appears that inasmuch as School Board member terms are staggered, in Loudon County only one multiple member district is even-numbered and affected in the election of 2002 (the second legislative district); and

WHEREAS, the qualifying deadline for candidates for School Board seats is so short in time, and the effort to redistrict Loudon County for purposes of making districts that would qualify as properly apportioned one-person districts (under the questions raised by the State legislative legal department) could possibly result in the moving of many district lines, and the short time available for education of the public could result in significant confusion among the voters, and an unusual burden would be cast upon the Election Commission in conducting an election under those circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission feels that the adopting of the redistricting plan as set forth in this resolution meets the intention of the disputed statute in that the districts are approximately equally proportioned in population;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission, in regular session assembled this 1st day of April, 2002, that the redistricting plan for Loudon County School Board members, as in the past, shall be consistent with the County Commission legislative districts, inasmuch as all seven districts comply with the equal representation principle, the redistricting plan for the Board of Education being as follows:


The county Board of Education of Loudon County shall consist of ten (10) members to be elected from the seven (7) county legislative body districts as follows: District 1 shall elect two (2) members; District 2 shall elect two (2) members; District 3 shall elect one (1) member; District 4 shall elect one (1) member; District 5 shall elect two (2) members; District 6 shall elect one (1) member; and District 7 shall elect one (1) member. The new board member position created in District 7 shall be filled by election of the registered voters of District 7 at the general election for county offices in August, 2002. The initial term of office for that district shall be for two (2) years, and at the county general election in August, 2004 and every four years thereafter, the position shall be filled for a four (4) year term. In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Education, the county legislative body shall appoint a successor to fill the position until the next general election. Each member of the county Board of Education shall be a resident of the district from which such member is elected.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that inasmuch as the Private Act to be adopted by the Tennessee General Assembly has not yet been certified back to the Loudon County Commission for adoption, this resolution is adopted in advance, to allow for planning by prospective candidates for office, and for the purpose of assisting the Loudon County Election Commission in preparing for the election and, accordingly, the County Commission members voting for this resolution certify that they hereby commit to ratify the Private Act when it is certified from Nashville for consideration for adoption.



MUD shall be responsible for all damages, claims or obligations arising out of its use of said rights-of-ways, including arising from the construction and maintenance of any of its facilities within the boundaries encompassed by MUD, and otherwise, and shall hold Loudon County, its officials, employees and agents harmless in this regard; further that MUD shall repair expeditiously any damages to said roads occasioned by the placing or maintenance of its facilities in said rights-of-ways to the same condition as said roads were in prior to the commencement of said work; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that MUD shall hold Loudon County, Tennessee, and its officials, employees and agents, harmless from all liability to MUD for damage to MUD's constructed water lines, equipment or other property, arising out of the County's maintenance of the roads and rights-of-ways under its jurisdiction, in the area described herein, unless such negligence is of a gross nature as defined under Tennessee law; and

BEIT FURTHER RESOLVED that MUD agrees to follow the rules and regulations of the Loudon County Highway Department in the construction and maintenance of water lines and facilities, and to give reasonable advance notice to the County Highway Superintendent for each phase of the project involving the County roads.

This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption, the public welfare requiring it.
