#### **RESOLUTION** <u>120202-D</u>

#### A RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A CONSULTING AGREEMENT TO PREPARE A PERMIT APPLICATION FOR LOUDON COUNTY TO COMPLY WITH THE PHASE II NPDES STORM WATER REGULATIONS REQUIRED BY THE CLEAN WATER ACT OF 1972

WHEREAS, the Clean Water Act of 1972 and amendments of 1987 require local governments to obtain permits to continue discharging storm water runoff from roads, ditches and culverts into streams and lakes; and

WHEREAS, the Phase II provisions of the Clean Water Act require compliance by local governments that are located within urbanized areas; and

WHEREAS, Loudon County's population increase, as determined by the 2000 Census, resulted in the inclusion of portions of the County in the Knoxville urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the required permit application will include a 5 year plan of action to develop and implement an ongoing program of storm water management directed at the protection and improvement of water quality in our local water resources; and

WHEREAS, the plan must address six minimum measures to improve the quality of local water resources including: public education and outreach, public involvement and participation, illicit discharge detection and elimination, construction site storm water runoff control, post-construction storm water runoff control, and pollution prevention for county facilities and operations; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Office of Planning has requested qualifications and proposals from engineering consultants with experience in environmental, water resources and storm water services; and

WHEREAS, based on a review of these qualifications and proposals, the Loudon County Office of Planning recommends awarding a consultant agreement to Jordon Jones and Goulding to prepare Loudon County's Phase II Storm Water Permit Application for a contract amount of thirty-eight thousand dollars (\$38,000), subject to the participation of Lenoir City and the City of Loudon based on their per capita share of the county's total population; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Loudon County Commission authorizes the County Executive to execute an agreement for these services on behalf of the County; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately the public welfare requiring it.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately, the public welfare requiring it.

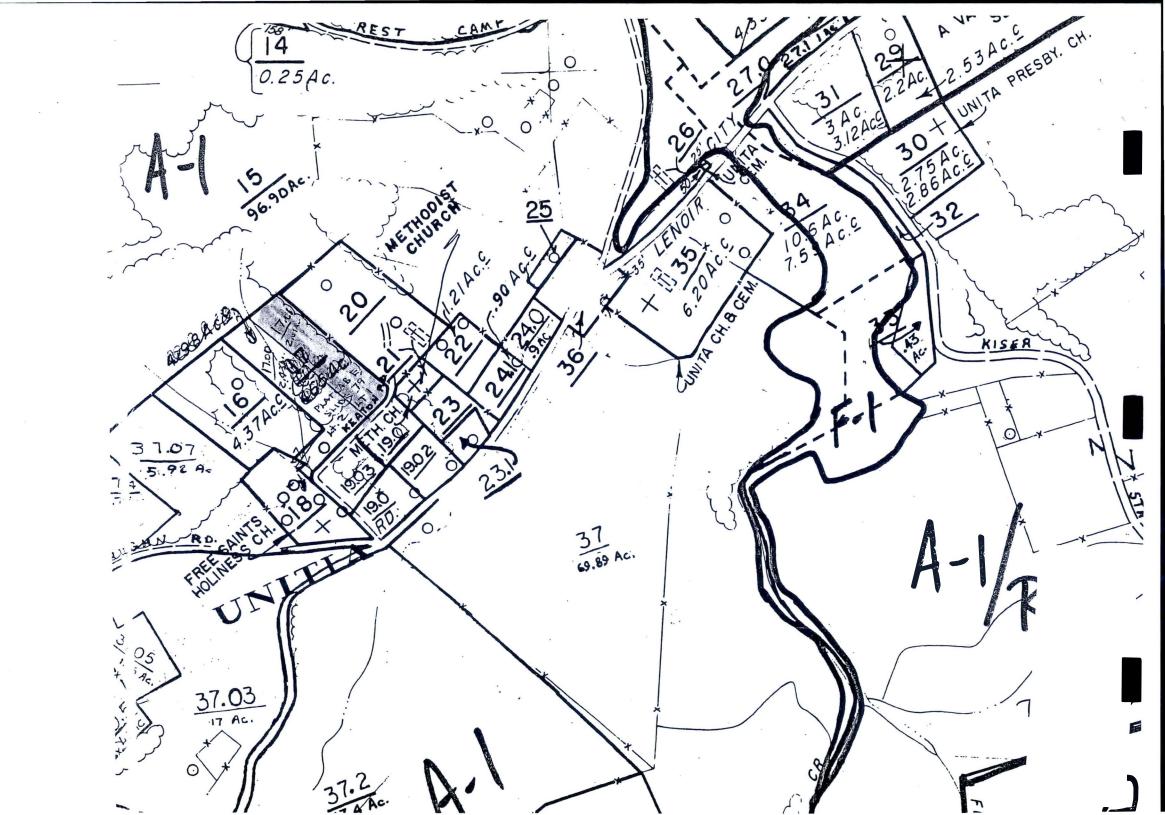

#### **RESOLUTION 120202-F**

#### A RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION ACCEPTING ST. THOMAS WAY INTO THE PUBLIC ROADWAY SYSTEM, LOCATED ON THE NORTHEAST SIDE OF STATE HIGHWAY 321, APPROXIMATELY ½ MILE WEST OF FORT LOUDOUN DAM, IN THE SECOND LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT OF LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the chieflegislative body of the county has the authority under <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> to accept the dedication of roads, to adopt policies and standards for the acceptance of new roads and to reopen previously closed county roads; and

WHEREAS, the Lenoir City Regional Planning Commission has received a request from the property owner to dedicate St. Thomas Way to Loudon County as a public road; and

WHEREAS, St. Thomas Way measures approximately 1,048' in length, with a 50' right of way; a paved two lane driving surface 24' feet wide with curbing and drainage structures ending in a hammer head turn around; and

WHEREAS, said road does meet the minimum road design standards adopted by Loudon County, and the County Highway Commissioner supports acceptance of the road; and

WHEREAS, there is no known additional costs to the County to bring this road up to County Road Standards; and

WHEREAS, the Lenoir City Regional Planning Commission has reviewed this matter and has recommended that St. Thomas Way be accepted into the County's Roadway System based on its existing conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Loudon County Commission considers the acceptance of this road to be in the public interest and that said road be accepted into the County's roadway system as indicated on the attached map, said map being a part of this Resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately the public welfare requiring it.

#### RESOLUTION/ORDINANCE NO. 120202-G

### AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT ESTABLISHING THE LOUDON COUNTY CABLE TELEVISION AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the City of Lenoir City, the City of Loudon, and Loudon County, in 1994 established by interlocal agreement the Loudon County Cable Television Authority (LCCTA) for the purpose of regulating and monitoring cable television companies operating in Loudon County, the said board being composed of three (3) members, one (1) each being selected to serve on the board by the governing bodies involved; and

WHEREAS, said interlocal agreement provided for remuneration to the Authority members of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) per meeting; and

WHEREAS, the work of the board has been rather extensive, there having been several transfers of franchises from one company to another in the intervening period, as well as one renewal, and the process is presently underway for the renewal of the present Charter franchise, the business of the board generally requiring a meeting once a month lasting between two and three hours, probably averaging ten (10) meetings a year; and further involving rather extensive committee meetings and dealings with citizens, cable customers and government officials; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Authority, after consideration, have requested remuneration of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) per meeting as presently being more appropriate for the work and responsibility involved, and more in line with the remuneration and reimbursement of expense received by members of other comparable boards and commissions, and further have given assurance that the funds received by the Authority for its budget each year are sufficient to pay the increased amount;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the interlocal agreement, Section 10, be amended by striking the words "Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00)", and inserting the words "Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00)".

This amendment is effective only when all three interlocal agreement governments have approved the amendment.

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING LOUDON COUNTY TO REQUEST STATE FUNDS FOR WIDENING AND EXTENSION OF IRENE LANE

WHEREAS, Tellico Village Community Church has only one exit from their parking lot and this exit goes through a shopping center; and

**WHEREAS**, the traffic congestion associated with this exit creates a real safety and health hazard in the event of an emergency; and

WHEREAS, the church continues to grow rapidly, has a current membership of about 1200, and is often used by all 4500 citizens of Tellico Village as a Community Center for numerous events; and

**WHEREAS**, the church has attempted repeatedly to gain access to State Highway 444 as an exit from the church parking lot and this has been denied by the State of Tennessee Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, an alternative solution is to widen and extend Irene Lane, which is currently a one lane county road; and

WHEREAS, widening and extension of Irene Lane will alleviate the traffic congestion, safety and health concerns aforementioned; and

**WHEREAS**, widening and extension of Irene Lane may also alleviate the need for the County to provide a traffic officer during events at the church; and

**WHEREAS**, other property along Irene Lane will be developed in the future and the County will undoubtedly receive additional requests to widen it, and

WHEREAS, the church has agreed to provide \$30,000 to cover part of the costs of extending and widening Irene Lane.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That George M. Miller, Loudon County Executive, is authorized to request funding from the State of Tennessee to assist in widening and extending Irene Lane.
- 2. That, contingent upon adequate funding from the church and State of
- Tennessee, Loudon County will widen and extend Irene Lane.
- 3. That Loudon County will accept the extension as a county road.
- 4. That Loudon County will adequately maintain the entire length of Irene Lane.

#### AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT made and entered into as of the \_\_\_\_ day of November, 2002, by and between LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), and WILLIAM R. HAYS (hereinafter referred to as "Hays"), an individual and real property owner in Loudon County, Tennessee.

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Hays owns property located at 14200 El Camino Lane in Loudon County (hereinafter referred to as the "Property") on which adult businesses, as that term was defined in the Loudon County Zoning Resolution on May 2, 2002, which Hays claims have been in operation since May 2, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the County, by amendment of its Zoning Resolution dated May 9, 2002, restricted the operation of adult businesses to a zone other than what the Property is zoned for; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated § 13-7-208 provides that when a zoning resolution is changed to prohibit a type of use of property that formerly was lawful on a such property, the owner may continue the pre-existing use notwithstanding the prohibition (hereinafter referred to as "Grandfather Status"); and

WHEREAS, Hays has filed suit (the "Lawsuit") in the Chancery Court for Loudon County seeking a determination that his use of the Property enjoys a Grandfathered Status under state law; and

WHEREAS, the County denies the claims of Hays in the Lawsuit and that his property enjoys a Grandfathered Status; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Adult Oriented Business Board has denied an application for a license to operate an adult business on the Property on the ground that the Property was not zoned properly for any adult-oriented business; and

WHEREAS, the County and Hays desire to end the Lawsuit, avoid further expense in litigating the issue of the Property's Grandfathered Status, and compromise the issues raised in the Lawsuit upon the terms, covenants, agreements and conditions contained herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The County agrees that, by virtue of the provisions of Tenn. Code Ann. § 13-7-208, the Property is entitled to Grandfather Status as an Adult Bookstore, as such term was defined in the Loudon County Zoning Resolution in effect on May 2, 2002, and such use may continue as provided in said statute, subject to the conditions Hays agrees to herein. The County and Hays agree to a judgment being entered in the Lawsuit recognizing that the Property is grandfathered for the use of sales and/or rentals of written, pictorial or audiovisual works of an adult nature, adult novelties and products, and clothing, but for no other adult purpose.

2. Upon the issuance of a license to operate from the Loudon County Adult Oriented Business Board, Hays agrees to execute and record a deed restriction on the Property prohibiting any future use of the Property as an adult nightclub/bar, adult cabaret, massage parlor, adult theater, adult motion picture theater, adult mini-motion picture establishment, escort agency, sexual encounter center, rap parlor, exotic dance studio, encounter studio, sensitivity studio or model studio as those terms were used in the Tennessee Code Annotated or were used in the Zoning Resolution of Loudon County in effect on May 2, 2002, so long as the Zoning Resolution of Loudon County prohibits the operation of such businesses on the Property. The deed restriction shall be binding on all subsequent owners of the Property.

3. Upon the execution of this Agreement, Hays will surrender his beer license for the sale of beer on the Property and the records of the County shall reflect that such license was in good standing at the time it was surrendered.

4. The County and Hays agree that the provisions of this Agreement will be binding on Hays, and all persons or entities claiming through him, and all persons or entities engaged in the operation of any activity on the Property.

5. Hays and the County recognize that there is a legal issue remaining regarding whether the provisions of Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-51-1402 apply to the type of business that would be operated on the Property under this Agreement. In order to avoid any litigation on the application of Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-51-1402 to such business, the County will promptly request that one of the state representatives for Loudon County submit to the Tennessee Attorney General a request for a written legal opinion, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 8-6-109(b)(6), on the following question: "Do the provisions of Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-51-1402 regulate the hours of operation of a business that offers, as its predominate stock or trade, sales and/or rentals of written, pictorial or audiovisual works of an adult nature, adult novelties and products, and clothing, but that does not offer, sell, provide or rent for a fee any of the type of material described in Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-51-1401(4)(A)(i), (ii) or (iii)?" Hays and the County agree that the opinion of the Tennessee Attorney General in response to that question will be binding on the parties, and that neither party hereto will seek any judicial determination of this question.

6. By the signature of the County hereto, the County warrants and represents to Hays that it has the requisite authority and approvals to enter into this Agreement.

7. By his signature hereto, Hays warrants and represents to the County that he has the requisite authority and approvals to enter into this Agreement.

8. The provisions of this Agreement shall become operative and enforceable upon due execution of it by the County and Hays, and upon Hays' performance of paragraph 2 above.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement to be executed by their respective representatives thereunto duly authorized as of the day and year first above written.
