Dear Mayor Brookshire:

The Loudon County Commission discussed the proposals in your letter regarding the negotiations toward resolving the County's lawsuit against Lenoir City's annexation along the Highway 321 corridor at its County Commission Workshop on Monday, October 18. On behalf of County Commission, I am pleased to relay to you the following official response adopted by County Commission at the November 01, 2004 County Commission meeting.

A. Recognizing that Lenoir City has an expressed policy against "forced" annexations, Loudon County agrees to the de-annexing of the White Wing Church of the Nazarene and Community Baptist Church. There are two other remaining properties opposed to the annexation, and the Commission asked that the properties owned by David M. Kerr and Vontella Kerr, as well as the properties owned by Donnie Ray Luttrell be de-annexed from the Highway 321 annexation.

The County agrees that all future annexations by Lenoir City must be contiguous to the then existing city limits. Annexations by request of a parcel owner must likewise be contiguous to the then existing city limits.

Loudon County differs with your proposal regarding parcel owners opposed to annexation. The County proposes that any parcel owner who objects to an annexation shall be taken out of the proposed annexation. In exchange for this exemption from annexation, Loudon County is willing to agree that any parcel of property taken out of an annexation plan as a result of the owner's objection will not disrupt the pattern of contiguous annexation for Lenoir City.

In all other aspects, annexations will comply with Public Chapter 1101.

Β.

The County agrees that this agreement between Lenoir City and Loudon County shall remain in effect for the duration of the Public Chapter 1101 Growth Plan approved by the Tennessee State Planning Advisory Committee on June 28, 2000, including any subsequent amendments or modifications, or until such time as both Lenoir City and Loudon County agree cooperatively to repeal, alter, amend or disregard this agreement. Loudon County and Lenoir City will both confirm and ratify the previously agreed upon and approved Urban and Plan Growth Boundaries between Loudon County and its municipalities as agreed upon and approved by the Tennessee State Planning Advisory Committee on June 28, 2000.

C. Loudon County Commission disagrees with your proposal that all municipalities within Loudon County execute this same agreement. This agreement, once approved by both Loudon County and Lenoir City by interlocal agreement and resolution, will put an end to the litigation between the County and Lenoir City with costs taxed equally to both parties, and each party to bear their own attorney fees. As such, this letter is an offer in an attempt to try to settle the litigation between the County and the City, as well as to reach a mutual agreement as to future annexations.

Please present this to the Lenoir City Council for their discussion and decision. If it is agreeable, our attorney, Rex A. Dale, will put this agreement in a form that will comply with the resolution and interlocal agreement for joint approval by both the Lenoir City Council and Loudon County Commission. If you so desire, Mr. Dale can be available to present this response to Lenoir City Council to answer any questions. The Loudon County Commission and I look forward to hearing from you. It is the hope of Loudon County Commission that both of us can reach an agreement on the current annexation issues as well as provide a means for agreement and guidance on future annexations.

#### **RESOLUTION 110104-B**

#### A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PARTICIPATION OF LOUDON COUNTY IN THE DOLLY PARTON IMAGINATION LIBRARY PROJECT

WHEREAS, Governor Phil Bredesen has set a goal for the State of Tennessee that every Tennessee child should be given a new book every month from their birth until they reach five years of age; and

WHEREAS, The Dollywood Foundation, a Tennessee nonprofit corporation, has created the Dolly Parton Imagination Library to promote early childhood educational development in communities across the United States that have agreed to join the Dolly Parton Imagination Library; and

WHEREAS, in those participating communities, The Dollywood Foundation mails a book each month to every child under the age of five whose parent or guardian has registered them to participate in the Dolly Parton Imagination Library; and

WHEREAS, in response to Governor Phil Bredesen's request and in furtherance of his early reading initiative that includes the expansion of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library to all counties in Tennessee, the Tennessee General Assembly appropriated \$2,000,000 in the 2004-05 fiscal year budget for the purpose of funding the initial costs associated with the expansion of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library to all counties in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Books From Birth Foundation (the "<u>Governor's Foundation</u>") has been organized as a private nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of Tennessee for the purpose of the promotion and encouragement of reading by the children of the State of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Foundation intends to seek grants from the State of Tennessee and donations from the citizens of Tennessee for the purpose of partnering with local sponsoring organizations in each county to offer the benefits of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library to all of the children of the State of Tennessee that are under the age of five; and

WHEREAS, prior to the award of such grants to the Governor's Foundation, the Tennessee Department of Education will manage the funds appropriated by the State of Tennessee for the purpose of funding the initial costs associated with the expansion of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library to all counties in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Board of County Commissioners of Loudon County would like to promote the early childhood educational development of all children in Loudon County by participating in the Dolly Parton Imagination Library; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Foundation, the State of Tennessee and Loudon County desire to set forth the terms under which the eligible children of Loudon County will receive the benefits of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Loudon County meeting in regular session, this the 4<sup>th</sup> day of October 2004, that:

**SECTION 1.** The Board of County Commissioners of Loudon County hereby approves of the participation of Loudon County in the Dolly Parton Imagination Library on the following terms and conditions:

1. <u>Description of the Program</u>. Every child that resides in Loudon County and that is under the age of five shall be eligible to receive a new book each month from the Dolly Parton Imagination Library (the "<u>Imagination Library</u>") after such child has been registered to participate in the Imagination Library so long as the requirements set forth herein are satisfied.

2. Local Sponsoring Organizations. Loudon County has arranged for the funding through the Loudon County Health Improvement Council of one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the costs of implementing the Imagination Library in Loudon County by contacting civic organizations, local businesses and governments, and other potential sources of funding within the County ("Sponsoring Organizations").

3. <u>Shared Payment Responsibilities</u>. The Dollywood Foundation will charge a fixed amount per child, per month for each child participating in the Imagination Library. The Governor's Foundation will be responsible for funding one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the total monthly amount payable to The Dollywood Foundation for the monthly cost of providing books to the eligible and registered children of Loudon County. The Sponsoring Organizations will be responsible for funding the remaining one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the total amount payable to The Dollywood Foundation for the monthly cost of providing books to the eligible and registered children of Loudon County. Notwithstanding the foregoing, prior to the Governor's Foundation receiving grants from the State of Tennessee, the Tennessee Department of Education will fund the one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) amount otherwise payable by the Governor's Foundation.

4. <u>Invoicing</u>. Prior to the Governor's Foundation receiving grants from the State of Tennessee, The Dollywood Foundation will invoice the Sponsoring Organizations for their one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) share of the monthly cost of Loudon County participating in the Imagination Library and will invoice the Tennessee Department of Education for the remaining one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) share of such cost. Once the Governor's Foundation has received grants from the State of Tennessee, The Dollywood Foundation will invoice the Governor's Foundation for one hundred percent (100%) of the monthly cost of Loudon County's participation in the Imagination Library and the Governor's Foundation will invoice the Sponsoring Organizations in Loudon County for their one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) share of such costs.

5. <u>Payment</u>. The Sponsoring Organizations shall remit payment to The Dollywood Foundation or the Governor's Foundation, as the case may be, by electronic funds transfer no later than the 25<sup>th</sup> day of each month.

6. <u>Registration of Participants</u>. The Sponsoring Organizations will be responsible for organizing and coordinating the registration of the eligible children of Loudon County to participate in the Imagination Library. The Sponsoring Organizations also will be responsible for arranging for the establishment and maintenance of a database that includes the name and address of each child in Loudon County that is registered to participate in the Imagination Library and for monitoring the eligibility of registered participants in Loudon County.

7. <u>Delivery of Books</u>. Prior to the 9<sup>th</sup> day of each month, the Sponsoring Organizations will provide The Dollywood Foundation with a written list of the names and addresses of all eligible children that are registered to participate in the Imagination Library for the following month. The Dollywood Foundation will arrange for the delivery of one book to each child so identified.

8. <u>Returned Books</u>. From time to time, a book addressed to a registered Imagination Library participant may be undeliverable due to an unknown addressee, or other reasons. The Sponsoring Organizations are responsible for ensuring that all Imagination Library books that are returned to a U.S. Post Office in Loudon County as undeliverable are picked up on a regular basis, not less than monthly, and arranging for the delivery of such books to the appropriate Imagination Library participant, or if all delivery efforts have proven unsuccessful, taking possession of such undeliverable books and disposing of such books in a charitable manner that furthers early childhood development. 9. Default by Sponsoring Organizations. If the Sponsoring Organizations fail to provide a written list to The Dollywood Foundation prior to the 9<sup>th</sup> day of any month, the children of Loudon County otherwise eligible to receive a book from the Imagination Library will not receive a book for the month following such failure. If the Sponsoring Organizations fail to remit the payment required of them by the 25<sup>th</sup> day of any month, the children of Loudon County otherwise eligible to receive a book from the Imagination Library will not receive a book for the month following such failure. If the Sponsoring Organizations fail to remit the payment required of them by the 25<sup>th</sup> day of any month, the children of Loudon County otherwise eligible to receive a book from the Imagination Library will not receive a book for the month following such failure. If any payment required of the Sponsoring Organizations has not been timely made for any month, the Governor's Foundation may, in its sole and absolute discretion, terminate the participation of Loudon County in the Imagination Library. If the Sponsoring Organizations fail to fulfill their payment obligations as specified herein, Loudon County will use its best efforts to arrange for payment from other Sponsoring Organizations.

**SECTION 2**. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all resolutions of the county legislative body of Loudon County, Tennessee that are in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 3.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the county legislative body.

#### AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into as of the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of January, 2005, by and between the **LOUDON COUNTY HUMANE SOCIETY**, a Tennessee non-profit corporation, (the "Humane Society") and **THE COUNTY OF LOUDON** (County).

#### WITNESSETH:

1. The County of Loudon and the City of Loudon own certain real property as shown on attached map and described as follows: 6.63 acres of Tax Map 33 Parcel 5 (the "Property").

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the property and the mutual covenants contained herein it is agreed between the parties as follows:

- a. The County of Loudon will make the said Property completely available to the Humane Society to build an Animal Shelter Facility (the "Facility") on the Property pursuant to the plans and specifications attached hereto as Exhibit "A", which has been reviewed by the Animal Control Director and deemed operational by current staffing allocation.
- b. Two months from the date of signing of this Agreement, the Humane Society shall begin construction of the Facility. Construction of the Facility shall be completed within a calendar year of the execution of this Agreement. Extension of this time limitation may be extended upon written agreement of the parties herein. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a limitation upon the Humane Society to procure construction financing for the construction of the Facility during this one year period as hereinabove provided. In addition, if the Facility is not completed within the one year calendar limitation, the Humane Society shall pay a construction penalty of Four Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$4,000.00) per month until the Facility is completed, which penalty amount shall be deducted from the purchase price described in Section (d) below.
- c. Upon completion of the Facility (pursuant to the above provisions), free and clear of all encumbrances, the County shall reimburse the Humane Society the price of Two Hundred Thousand and 00/100 (\$200,000).
- d. The Property shall be utilized as an Animal Shelter/Animal Control Facility for a period of at least ten (10) years upon completion pursuant to the above provisions. If at any time after the ten (10) year period, the County ceases to use the Property as an Animal Shelter/Animal Control Facility, the Humane Society reserves the right of first option to purchase the Property for a purchase price of the current fair market value of the VACANT property.

- e. Upon completion of the Facility and acceptance by the County the Humane Society has no further obligations with respect to the Facility.
- f. The Humane Society and the County at all times and at their own expense, comply promptly with all laws and requirements of the United States, State of Tennessee, the County of Loudon, and the City of Loudon.
- g. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the other party.
- h. If any provisions of this Agreement is held to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable under present or future laws effective during the term hereof, such provision shall be fully severable and this Agreement shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision never comprised a part hereof, and the remaining provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect and shall not be affected by the illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision or by its severance herefrom. Furthermore, in lieu of such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision, there shall be added automatically as part of this Agreement, a provision as similar in its terms as such illegal, invalid, or unenforceable provision as may be possible and be legal, valid, and enforceable.
- i. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and there respective heirs, personal representatives, successors, and permitted assigns.
- j. The representations and warranties contained in this Agreement and delivered pursuant to this Agreement shall survive the Closing.
- k. All notices, consents, claims, and other communications given or made pursuant hereto shall be in writing and shall be delivered personally or by overnight courier or registered or certified mail (postage prepaid, return receipt requested) or by telecopy to the parties at the following addresses:

Notice delivered in accordance with the foregoing shall be deemed given at the time of delivery or of refusal upon attempted delivery.

- 1. Any waiver by any party of any of its rights under this Agreement or of any breach of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of any other rights or of any other or future breach.
- m. The rights and remedies in this Agreement provided, and available at law and in equity, shall be cumulative, and the exercise of one right or remedy shall not be exclusive of the right to exercise or resort to any rights or remedies.
- n. Time is of the essence of this Agreement.
- o. This Agreement will be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Tennessee applicable to agreements made and to be performed in such jurisdiction without reference to conflicts of law principles; and each of the parties irrevocably consent that any legal action or proceeding against it under, arising out of, or in any manner relating to this Agreement or any other agreement, documents or instrument arising out of or executed in connection with this Agreement may be brought only in the Chancery Court for Loudon County, Tennessee.
- p. This Agreement may not be altered, amended, changed, modified, waived, or terminated in any respect or particular unless the same shall be in writing signed by the party to be bound. No waiver by any party of any breach hereunder shall be deemed a waiver of any other or subsequent breach.



#### A RESOLUTION TO RELINQUISH REGIONAL PLANNING AUTHORITY WITHIN THE URBAN GROWTH BOUNDARY AND TO AUTHORIZE MUNICIPAL REGIONAL REGULATORY AUTHORITY OVER SUBDIVISIONS

WHEREAS, Loudon County has an approved growth plan adopted pursuant to Section 6-58-104, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, that establishes the City of Sweetwater growth boundary as a part of the Loudon County Growth Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Regional Planning Commission has been established by the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee and conducts planning and development controls pursuant to Section 13-4-101 through 13-4-309, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>; and

WHEREAS, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u> Section 13-4-103 provides for the establishment of planning regions adjacent to and outside municipalities, and within the approved urban growth boundary; and

WHEREAS, the Sweetwater Municipal Planning Commission has adopted a resolution requesting the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee, pursuant to Section 13-3-102, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>, to create a Sweetwater Planning Region congruent with and including the entire Sweetwater City urban grown boundary as shown on the attached map, and consents to the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee designation that the Sweetwater Municipal Planning Commission serve as the Sweetwater Municipal-Planning Commission for the entire planning region; and

WHEREAS, planning and control of development beyond the corporate limits and within its urban growth boundary is of vital interest to the City of Sweetwater, which has made a request of the Loudon County Commission to agree to relinquish regional planning authority to the City of Sweetwater within its urban growth boundary and approve subdivision authority for the newly created Sweetwater Municipal-Regional Planning Commission,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Loudon County Commission that the this body endorses the request of the Mayor and Board of Commissioners of the City of Sweetwater to the Local Government Planning Advisory Committee that the Sweetwater Planning Region, as shown on the attached map entitled the Sweetwater Planning Region, be created and that the Sweetwater Municipal Planning Commission be designated the Sweetwater Municipal-Regional Planning Commission for the entire region.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Loudon County Commission that the Sweetwater Municipal-Regional Planning Commission is allowed to enforce subdivision regulations within the Sweetwater Planning Region pursuant to Title 13, Chapter 3, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED**, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately, the public welfare requiring it.
