Agriculture-Forestry District, to R-1, Suburban Residential District.

Mike Walters and Bob Bivens, neighbors of said property, came forward to speak in opposition of this rezoning.

Commissioner Franke cited concerns of rezoning property including questions of asbestos on property, actual acreage of property and additional traffic in that area.

Commissioner Franke requested that Item 6B1, "Consideration of adopting a resolution to rezone property containing approximately two acres, located at the intersection of Hackney Chapel and Long Roads, situated in the Third Legislative District, referenced by Tax Map 36, Parcel 94.00, from A-1 Agriculture-Forestry District, to R-1, Suburban Residential District" be removed for at least sixty (60) days due to questions regarding asbestos and the actual size of the lot.

## Resolution Opposing HB 619 and SB 745

Whereas, the Tellico Reservoir Development Agency (TRDA) and its partnership with the Tennessee Valley Authority, Blount, Loudon and Monroe Counties and private business and community residents, without question, represents a model for regional partnerships; and

Whereas, the success of this partnership has resulted in the creation of over 6,000 jobs, private investment in excess of \$1,500,000,000, and a tax base which exceed \$7 million per year to local governments; and

Whereas, the success of these initiatives has been a result of TRDA's ability to implement a comprehensive, flexible development plan; and

Whereas, the economic driver for TRDA's industrial and recreational properties is the Agency's ability to develop residential property, which provides the financial resources necessary in providing industrial and recreational infrastructure such as streets, water, sewer, etc.; and

Whereas, TRDA has a large amount of undeveloped land in Loudon County, a large part of which is designated Industrial under the TRDA land use plan but may not be suitable for industrial development; thus it may be desirable for TRDA to change its land's classification to Residential to realize its highest and best usage; and

Whereas, the development of these properties could potentially increase the tax base in Loudon County by a significant amount; and

Whereas, HB 619, sponsored by Representative Joe McCord, and SB 745, sponsored by Senator Jeff Miller, would amend TRDA's authorizing legislation and prohibit TRDA from any residential development activities on Agency property, which would be devastating to the mission of TRDA; and

*Now Therefore, Be It Resolved* that the Loudon County Commission meeting in regular session assembled this 7<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2005, by this resolution expresses their opposition to HB 619 & SB 745.

Be It Further Resolved that the County Clerk shall submit copies of this Resolution to our Loudon County Legislative Delegation as well as the Sponsoring Legislators urging them to also oppose this bill.

This resolution shall become effective immediately, the public welfare requiring it.

## Resolution Supporting Passage of 55 mph Speed Limit for Trucks on Interstate for Air Quality Improvement

WHEREAS, all or part of seven counties in the Knoxville Region, Anderson, Blount, Jefferson, Knox, Loudon, Sevier and a portion of Cocke, are in non-attainment of the US Environmental Protection Agency 8-hour ozone standard; and

WHEREAS, several additional counties in this region are threatened with non-attainment status for PM 2.5; and

WHEREAS, Loudon County is actively involved in the Regional Clean Air Coalition with 10 other counties working together to improve air quality in the greater Knoxville Region; and

WHEREAS, air quality is a regional and statewide issue and the strategies to improve air quality should be implemented on a statewide basis; and

WHEREAS, computer modeling shows that the reduction of truck speed limits on interstates to 55 mph will result in emission reductions; and

WHEREAS, Loudon County endorses the 55 mph speed limit for trucks traveling on interstates through non-attainment areas and will commit to help the State of Tennessee enforce the lower limits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LOUDON COUNTY COMMISSION, meeting in regular session, assembled this 7<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2005, that the Tennessee Department of Transportation should reduce truck speed limits on interstates to 55 mph in non-attainment areas to improve air quality.

# Loudon County Tennessee 3-Star Program Economic Development Strategic Plan 2005-2009

March 1, 2005

#### Introduction

Loudon County, Tennessee is participating in the Tennessee Three-Star Communities Program, administered by the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development (ECD). This program is designed to assist our community to achieve excellence in community and economic development. Participating communities must have a five-year strategic plan of criteria developed by local economic development professionals and various agencies.

As a required element of the program, the five-year strategic economic development plan is to be updated annually. This plan must include goals, a projected timeline for achieving the goals, and an agency responsible for coordinating the goals. The strategic plan must address agriculture, education, existing industries, infrastructure, manufacturing recruitment, retail/services, tourism, and workforce development. Other areas may be addressed at the discretion of the community.

The Joint Economic and Community Development Board (JECDB) is assisting in the preparation of the application for Three Star certification. A committee consisting of representation from the Loudon County Economic Development Agency, Loudon County Chamber of Commerce, Loudon County Education Foundation, Loudon County Planning Office, Loudon County Visitors Bureau, Loudon County Workforce Development and the Loudon County Agriculture Extension Service was formed to prepare the necessary strategic plan.

The Committee, with input from several community agencies and with their own knowledge and insight, prepared the goals and actions in this document.

This plan is not a feasibility study, an economic analysis or forecast, a marketing plan, or a comprehensive community development plan. It is, however, a genuine attempt to determine key issues facing Loudon County and to outline an agenda for achieving a prosperous future. The purpose has been to stimulate ideas, build consensus, and generate support for action by a variety of public and private entities. Detailed implementation steps for the recommendations in this plan will have to be developed by the appropriate responsible entities. Also, this plan should be updated annually to monitor progress and identify new goals and actions. This plan should help local leaders to periodically ask: Are we making progress?

Purchaser, within 60 days following the agreement, shall submit to the Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as Board) of the Loudon County Economic Development Agency a conceptual plan describing a planned commercial center development containing not less than 100,000 square feet that must be approved by said Board within 45 days of receipt. The Board will review the plan for compliance with the recorded Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions of the business park. The Purchaser may submit site plans for Planning Commission approval simultaneously with the submittal of the conceptual plan to the Board. During the 9-month contract period Purchaser shall pursue site planning, marketing and secure prospective tenants. Purchaser is granted a 4-month extension beyond this time provided a \$25,000 nonrefundable

earnest money is deposited prior to expiration of the initial agreement. Within 180 days of closing, Purchaser shall commence the construction of a commercial center that shall not be less than 100,000. If Purchaser fails to commence the development plan within the time prescribed Seller may repurchase the property at the original sales price.

Following the sale of Group A and development of the site as noted above and subject to contingencies noted, Seller agrees to sell Group B for \$1,821,000 provided Purchaser closes within 180 days from the closing of Group A property. Purchaser shall pay to seller \$25,000 nonrefundable earnest money deposited upon execution of a satisfactory Purchase and Sale Agreement at the time of closing of Group A. The purchase price shall escalate to \$2,057,000 if closing occurs after 180 days and no later than 360 days from closing of Group A Property. The purchase price shall further escalate to \$2,293,900 if closing occurs after 360 days and no later than 18 months from closing of Group A property. If the Purchaser fails to close on Group B within 18 months after the closing of Group A, the contract for Group B shall terminate and all earnest money shall be retained by Seller. The purchase of Group B is contingent on the acquisition Group A. In no event shall the closing of Group B be more than 31 months from the contract date.

#### Conditions:

- Purchaser shall submit to the City of Loudon Planning Commission a preliminary site plan indicating the proposed development layout for Group A.
- Seller shall provide to Purchaser sufficient evidence the property is adequately zoned for the intended use.
- Seller shall provide access to the property for the purpose of conducting on site geotechnical studies, clearing of vegetation, surveying, or other engineering services customarily conducted onsite.
- Purchaser shall have the right to replat existing interior lot lines and create new interior access consistent with local planning regulations.
- Seller shall provide Purchaser with a clear and marketable title showing that there are no encroachments or other survey related matters that would interfere with intended use of the property excluding those indicated on the survey.
- 6. There are adequate utilities at the property for the intended use.
- Seller shall provide Purchaser with a certified survey of the property within 20 days of execution of the contract.
- Purchaser understands that certain flood plains exist along the property boundary. Said flood
  plains shall not interfere with the intended development. Seller represents there are no other
  wetlands on the property to their knowledge.
- 9. Seller, with consent of Purchaser, each agree to pay for ½ the cost of a traffic signal at the intersection of Centre Park Drive and Highway 72 upon approval by the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT). Seller shall apply to TDOT for a traffic signal as traffic warrants as defined in the Uniform Traffic Control Devices Manual
- 10. Purchaser and Seller understand that a Plantation petroleum pipeline encroaches Group A and that removal is probably not financially feasible. If it is determined that the pipeline is in conflict with the proposed development plan then purchaser may cancel the contract within 5 months of execution and all earnest monies deposited shall be returned to Purchaser.

- Seller, through the Loudon County Economic Development Agency, shall assist Purchaser in marketing the site to prospective tenants.
- Seller, through the Loudon County Economic Development Agency, shall assist Purchaser in obtaining all necessary permits and approvals at the state, local and federal level.
- 13. If underlying rock is present that prohibits the development plan, Purchaser may cancel the contract within 5 months from execution of the contract and all monies deposited shall be returned to Purchaser.
- 14. Seller shall grant Purchaser permission to gain access from Highway 72 and Centre Park Drive to Group A Property as indicated on the site plan prepared for the Loudon County Economic Development Agency.
- 15. If within 9 months from the date of the executed contract Purchaser, with the assistance of the Seller, has not leased at least a minimum of 60,000 square feet to third party tenants then Purchaser, at the Purchasers sole option may elect to have the earnest money returned to Purchaser and the contract shall become null and void. In the event of such termination Purchaser shall provide copies of all due diligence materials to Seller. Purchaser shall retain the right to extend the option for the additional 4 months as previously noted.

This letter is not intended to be, and should not be deemed to be, binding upon either party but to serve as a basis for drafting a contract. Thank you for your interest and if you have any questions please feel free to contact me. I look forward to your response.

# RESOLUTION TO INCREASE LITIGATION TAXES FOR GENERAL SESSIONS COURT IN LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated § 16-15-5006 authorizes counties to levy an additional litigation of up to six dollars (\$6.00) in general session's court to help fund increases in compensation for general sessions judges required by 1988 Public Chapter 698; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated § 16-15-5006(a) provides further that, if during any fiscal year the amount of revenue generated by the local tax authorized by that section does not sufficiently fund the increase in general sessions judges compensation mandated by Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 16, Chapter 15, Part 50, the local litigation tax may be raised to an amount more than the six dollars (\$6.00) if necessary to fund the mandated increase; provided that such increase be adjusted annually; and

WHEREAS, prior resolutions of the Loudon County Legislative Body impose the additional litigation tax authorized by Tennessee Code Annotated §16-15-5006 at the six dollar (\$6.00) level; and

WHEREAS, Loudon County has determined that the six dollar (\$6.00) litigation tax no longer generates sufficient revenue to fund the increase in the general sessions judge's compensation mandated by Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 16, Chapter 15, Part 50.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Loudon County, Tennessee, meeting in regular session on this <u>7th</u> day of <u>March</u>, <u>2005</u>, in Loudon, Tennessee, that:

Section 1. On the effective date provided in Section 3, below, the local litigation tax in effect in general sessions court in Loudon County shall be increased by eleven dollars (\$11.00) in excess of six dollars (\$6.00), to a total of seventeen dollars (\$17.00), as authorized by Tennessee Code Annotated § 16-15-5006. Please see Exhibit A Calculation Information for Resolution to Increase Litigation Taxes for General Sessions Court in Loudon County, Tennessee for additional information.

Section 2. Taxes levied pursuant to this resolution shall be collected in addition to all state and other county litigation taxes in general sessions court and shall be chargeable upon filing in a civil case and upon conviction in a criminal case in general sessions court. The increase authorized by this resolution shall remain in effect in Loudon County until the end of the fiscal year during which this increase is enacted and shall be re-enacted, repealed or adjusted annually to ensure that the revenue generated by this resolution does not exceed the increase in general sessions judge's compensation mandated by Tennessee Code Annotated, Title16, Chapter 15, Part 50.

Section 3. This resolution shall be effective and the taxes imposed by this resolution shall take effect on March 21, 2005, the public welfare requiring it.

Section 4. The local litigation taxes collected pursuant to this Resolution shall be paid over to the County Trustee monthly and deposited in the county general fund.

Section 5. If any provision of this resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to that end the provisions of this resolution are declared to be severable.

Section 6. The presiding officer of this legislative body shall certify the passage of this resolution to the Secretary of the State as provided in Tennessee Code Annotated §16-15-5006.

# A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE GENERAL FUND 101, GENERAL DEBT FUND 151, SOLID WASTE/SANITATION/RECYCLING FUND 116, AND OUTLINING A TRANSFER FROM THE CAPITAL PROJECT FUND 171

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission adopted a 2004-05 Budget, and

WHEREAS, the estimated the Beginning Undesignated Fund Balance has been updated to reflect the Year End Report (unaudited estimates) or audit (if available); thereby a more accurate budget, and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that the General Fund 101, Solid Waste/Sanitation/Recycling Fund 116, and General Debt Service Fund 151 be hereby amended to reflect more accurately the anticipated revenues and expenditure from their operations.

**SECTION 1. NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the below funds are amended as follows and certain discretionary revenues are being amended to provide additional revenue for the County General Fund 101.

#### General Fund 101 Solid Waste/Sanitation/Recycling Fund 116 General Debt Service Fund 151

**SECTION 2. BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED** that the Capital Project Fund 171 shall receive the \$400,000 grant revenue as previously established as designates of \$100,000 and \$300,000 in the General Fund 101. Said monies intended to be used to make the later payments on construction of the Loudon County Health Department.

**SECTION 3. BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED** that the Capital Project Fund 171 account section used to pay construction cost on the Loudon County Health Department is complete and any remaining grant or loan funds up to \$400,000 shall be transferred to the General Debt Service Fund 151.

**SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that all Resolutions of the County Commission of Loudon County, Tennessee, which are in conflict with this Resolution, are hereby repealed.
