





**SUBCONTRACT AGREEMENT
BETWEEN LOUDON COUNTY GOVERNMENT
AND
LOUDON COUNTY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL**

TOBACCO GRANT

This subcontract agreement by and between Loudon County Government, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and Loudon County Health Improvement Council Agency, hereinafter referred to as the "Agency", is for the provision of Tobacco prevention education as further defined in the "Scope of Services".

The County has entered into a grant agreement with the State of Tennessee for the implementation of a Tobacco Grant program. The grant agreement with the State is referenced by contract number **GG-08-23284-00**, and refers to the County as "the Grantee", and the State of Tennessee as "State". These references are hereinafter incorporated into this document. The grant agreement with the State is in effect **December 1, 2007 and ending June 30, 2008**. This subcontract agreement is a result of the County's prior agreement with the State, and legislative action by Loudon County Commission on **January 7, 2008**. Therefore, the Agency has been provided a copy of said agreement and agrees to comply with any and all portions related to the Tobacco prevention education program when fulfilling the terms of this subcontract agreement between the County and the Agency.

Scope of Services:

1. This Agreement shall be effective for the period commencing on December 1, 2007 and ending on June 30, 2008. The County shall have no obligation for services rendered by the Agency which are not performed within the specified period.
2. The County will reimburse the Agency for services rendered and travel for the Tobacco prevention education program. The sum total of reimbursements and materials will be an amount up to, but not to exceed \$15,789.00.
3. Adjustments to the sum total of reimbursements to the Agency will be commensurate with subsequent amendments to the education budget of the County's grant agreement with the State.
4. The Agency shall submit monthly reports to the County's Director of Finance and Budget by the end of the first week of the following month. The report shall include a completed Education Report Form and Monthly Time Sheet Report. The County will provide the Agency with copies of the Education Report Form and the Time Work Sheet.

5. The County's Director of Finance and Budget shall review and approve all monthly reports submitted by the Agency. The Director may object to or question any portion of monthly report submittals by the Agency. The Agency's request for reimbursement shall be subject to reduction for amounts included that are determined by the Tennessee Department of Health, not to constitute allowable costs.
6. The County shall purchase all supplies and materials for the Tobacco Education portion of the Grant Contract. Procurement shall be made on a competitive basis, including the use of competitive bidding procedures, where practical.
7. The County shall reimburse the Agency by the thirtieth (30th) day of the following month for approved disbursements.
8. This agreement may be modified only by a written amendment executed by all parties hereto.
9. This agreement may be terminated by either party with a thirty (30) day written notice before the effective termination date.
10. The Agency agrees that it is not the intent of this agreement to fund advertisement or solicitation for Loudon County Health Improvement Council. Requests for reimbursements must strictly adhere to the terms of this agreement for a program of Tobacco prevention education.
11. The Agency is assumed to be familiar with and agrees to observe and comply with any and all federal, state and local laws, statutes, ordinances and regulations in any manner affecting the provision of service in this agreement.
12. Conflicts of Interest. The Grantee warrants that no part of the total Grant Amount shall be paid directly or indirectly to an employee or official of the State of Tennessee as wages, compensation, or gifts in exchange for acting as an officer, agent, employee, subcontractor, or consultant to the Grantee in connection with any work contemplated or performed relative to this Grant.
13. Lobbying. The Grantee certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief, that:
 - a. No federally appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the Grantee, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any federal contract, the making of any federal grant, the making of any federal loan, and entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

b. If any funds other than federally appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the Grantee shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.

c. The Grantee shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-awards at all tiers (including sub-grants, subcontracts, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all sub-recipients of federally appropriated funds shall certify and disclose accordingly.

14. Nondiscrimination. The Grantee hereby agrees, warrants, and assures that no person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Grant or in the employment practices of the Grantee on the grounds of disability, age, race, color, constitutional, or statutory law. The Grantee shall, upon request, show proof of such nondiscrimination and shall post in conspicuous places, available to all employees and applicants, notices of nondiscrimination.
15. Public Accountability. If the Grantee is subject to Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 8, Chapter 4, Part 4 or if this Grant Contract involves the provision of services to citizens by the Grantee on behalf of the State, the Grantee agrees to establish a system through which recipients of services may present grievances about the operation of the service program, and the Grantee shall display in a prominent place, located near the passageway through which the public enters in order to receive Grant supported services, a sign at least twelve inches (12") in height and eighteen inches (18") in width stating:

NOTICE: THIS AGENCY IS A RECIPIENT OF TAXPAYER FUNDING. IF YOU OBSERVE AN AGENCY DIRECTOR OR EMPLOYEE ENGAGING IN ANY ACTIVITY WHICH YOU CONSIDER TO BE ILLEGAL, IMPROPER, OR WASTEFUL, PLEASE CALL THE STATE COMPTROLLER'S TOLL-FREE HOTLINE: 1-800-232-5454


16. Public Notice. All notices, informational pamphlets, press releases, research reports, signs, and similar public notices prepared and released by the Grantee shall include the statement, "This project is funded under an agreement with TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION." Any such notices by the Grantee shall be approved by the State.
17. Records. The Grantee (and any approved subcontractor) shall maintain documentation for all charges under this Contract. The books, records, and documents of the Grantee (and any approved subcontractor), insofar as they relate to work performed or money received under this Contract, shall be maintained for a period of three (3) full years from the date of the final payment and shall be subject to audit at any reasonable time and upon reasonable notice by the state agency, the Comptroller of the Treasury, or their duly appointed representatives. The records of not-for-profit entities shall be maintained in accordance with the Accounting Manual for the Recipients of Grant Funds in the State of Tennessee, published by the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury (available at

<http://comptroller.state.tn.us/ma/monprofit/momprofit1.pdf>). The financial statements shall be prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

18. This agreement is subject to the appropriation and availability of State and/or Federal funds. In the event that the funds are not appropriated or are otherwise unavailable, the County reserves the right to terminate this agreement upon written notice to the Agency. Said termination shall not be deemed a breach of agreement by the County. Upon receipt of the written notice, the Agency shall cease all work associated with the Agreement. Should such an event occur, the Agency shall be entitled to compensation for all satisfactory and authorized services completed as of the termination date. Upon such termination, the Agency shall have no right to recover from the County any actual, general, special, incidental, consequential, or any other damages whatsoever of any description or amount.

On November 8, 2007, the Executive Planning Council approved an increase in the starting salary for the Assistant Planner position in order to be more competitive with starting salaries for other similar positions in planning agencies in the region. The Council approved a starting salary up to \$35,000.

Additionally, the Council approved a \$2,000 salary increase for Debbie Hines, Executive Administrative Assistant, in the Loudon County Planning Office. This increase would adjust her salary from \$26,500 to \$28,500 and would take effect on November 8, 2007. Both salary adjustments were approved for funding out of the reserve fund balance of the Executive Planning Council and will not require additional funding from the County or the cities.

Ms. Hines has been with the Planning Office since January 2002, performs excellent work, and is a valuable asset to the office. She has not previously received a step merit increase.

Attached are minutes from the Executive Planning Council Meeting of November 8. Please process these budget amendments and let me know if I need to give you anything else or need to discuss this with the Budget Committee. Thank you.

DRAFT MINUTES

LOUDON COUNTY EXECUTIVE PLANNING COUNCIL

NOVEMBER 8, 2007

The November 2007 meeting of the Executive Planning Council was called to order by Chairman Harrison at 4:30 PM. Present were Mr. Harrison, Mr. Pope, Ms. Keller, Mr. Simpson, and Mr. Care. Mr. Ghormley arrived after the start of the meeting. Absent was Ms. Marcus.

Motion to approve the minutes of the May 2007 meeting was made by Mr. Carey, seconded by Mr. Pope and approved 5-0.

Agenda Item A: Review draft Inter-Local Agreement between Loudon County, Lenoir City, and City of Loudon for Loudon County Planning Office Services to Loudon County, Lenoir City and City of Loudon Planning Commissions

Mr. Newman provided each of the members of the Commission a copy of the proposed Interlocal agreement. He noted that this is the same agreement that has been in effect, and it is renewed every five years. The only change that is being proposed is an additional \$10,000 funding, which is based on the population of the Lenoir City, Loudon City and the county.

Motion was made by Mr. Pope to approve the agreement, seconded by Mr. Simpson, and approved 5-0.

Agenda Item B: Discuss Planning Office staff salaries

Mr. Newman told the Board that Assistant Planner Mike Reynolds was leaving due to a job offer in Knoxville with an increase in salary. Before that happened, he was anticipating discussing this with the Council. That position's pay is not competitive with the market. To get someone with experience the salary needs to be about \$35,000. He recommended that that be offered as a starting salary. With Mr. Reynolds' new position he will be making more than that, in addition to being a different kind of work. This increase can be funded out of the Reserve Account.

Mr. Newman then discussed Ms. Hines salary. He has recently found out that the starting salaries for the clerical positions in the Accounting Department, which those jobs deal with only certain segments of the accounting department start at about \$2,000 more than her current salary, and she has been in this position full time for four years. He recommended raising her pay by \$2,000 which would come out of the reserve balance, and then in the future will be part of the budget. That would put her salary at the starting salary of the finance office positions, with her being full time for four years at this point,

AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION 010708-K

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE FINANCING OF THE CONSTRUCTION OF A WASTEWATER FACILITIES PROJECT, INCLUDING AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF APPLICATIONS, CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENTS, AND OTHER NECESSARY DOCUMENTS, AND MAKING CERTAIN REPRESENTATIONS, CERTIFICATIONS, AND PLEDGES OF CERTAIN REVENUE IN CONNECTION WITH SUCH FINANCING.

WHEREAS, the Loudon County is a public and governmental body in Tennessee (the "Local Government"); and

WHEREAS, the Local Government has determined that it is necessary and desirable to undertake certain activities or tasks in connection with a wastewater facilities project, Department of Environment and Conservation Number **SRF 2007-198** (the "Project"), in and for the Local Government; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 68-221-1001 et. seq., provide for the lending of moneys in the wastewater facilities Revolving Loan Fund to Local Governments for the purpose of providing funds for Project Loans; and

WHEREAS, the local Government has determined that it is necessary and advisable to borrow funds for the Project pursuant to these sections.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

Section 1. Local Government hereby approves the creation of indebtedness on behalf of the Local Government in the principal amount of FOUR MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHT THOUSAND THIRTY-FOUR DOLLARS (\$4,708,034) by the obtaining of a Project Loan.

Section 2. The execution and delivery of the Application for a Project Loan in the principal amount of FOUR MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHT THOUSAND THIRTY-FOUR DOLLARS (\$4,708,034) for the purpose of funding all or a portion of the total estimated cost of the Project NINE MILLION FOUR HUNDRED SIXTEEN THOUSAND SIXTY-EIGHT DOLLARS (\$9,416,068), by Doyle Arp, the County Mayor of Loudon County, is hereby ratified and approved in all respects.

Section 3. The form, terms, and provisions of the agreement for the Project Loan among the Local Government, the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation and the Tennessee Local Development Authority (the "Loan Agreement"), as presented at this meeting, are hereby approved.

Section 4. The Local Government hereby agrees to honor and accept the method of financing as may be determined by the Authority pursuant to the Loan Agreement.

Section 5. The Local Government hereby agrees to make the monthly payments on the Project Loan in accordance with the Payment Schedule to be attached to the Loan Agreement.

Section 6. The Local Government hereby agrees to levy fees, rates or charges for services provided by the Project and/or to levy ad valorem taxes sufficient to pay the interest on and principal of the Project Loan in accordance with the Loan Agreement. The Local Government also agrees to levy fees, rates, or charges and/or ad valorem taxes sufficient to pay the cost of operation and maintenance of the wastewater system of which the Project is a part, which cost shall include depreciation and all other debt service expense of the system.



Section 7. The Local Government assigns and pledges its State-Shared Taxes to the State and consents to the withholding and application of State-Shared Taxes in the event of failure by the Local Government to remit monthly payments in accordance with the terms of the Loan Agreement, as the Loan Agreement may be supplemented or amended from time to time.

Section 8. The Local Government hereby agrees that there are no local pledges of State-Shared Taxes other than those disclosed.

Section 9. The Local Government hereby agrees to obtain alternative methods of financing for all costs necessary for the completion of the Project which are in excess of the combined financing provided by any agency of the United States Government and by the Tennessee Local Development Authority.

Section 10. The Mayor of Loudon County is authorized and directed to execute the Loan Agreement, and any amendments or supplements to the Loan Agreement, in the name and behalf of the Local Government; to deliver such documents to the other parties to such documents, such execution and delivery to be conclusive proof of the approval of the Local Government of such documents; and to take such further action and to execute and deliver such further instruments or documents as such officer may consider necessary or advisable in connection with the Loan Agreement. Provided, however, this resolution shall not be deemed to grant authority to the named officer to approve any increase in the amount of the Project Loan.

Section 11. All orders, resolutions, or ordinances in conflict with this resolution be and the same are repealed insofar as such conflict exists. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.



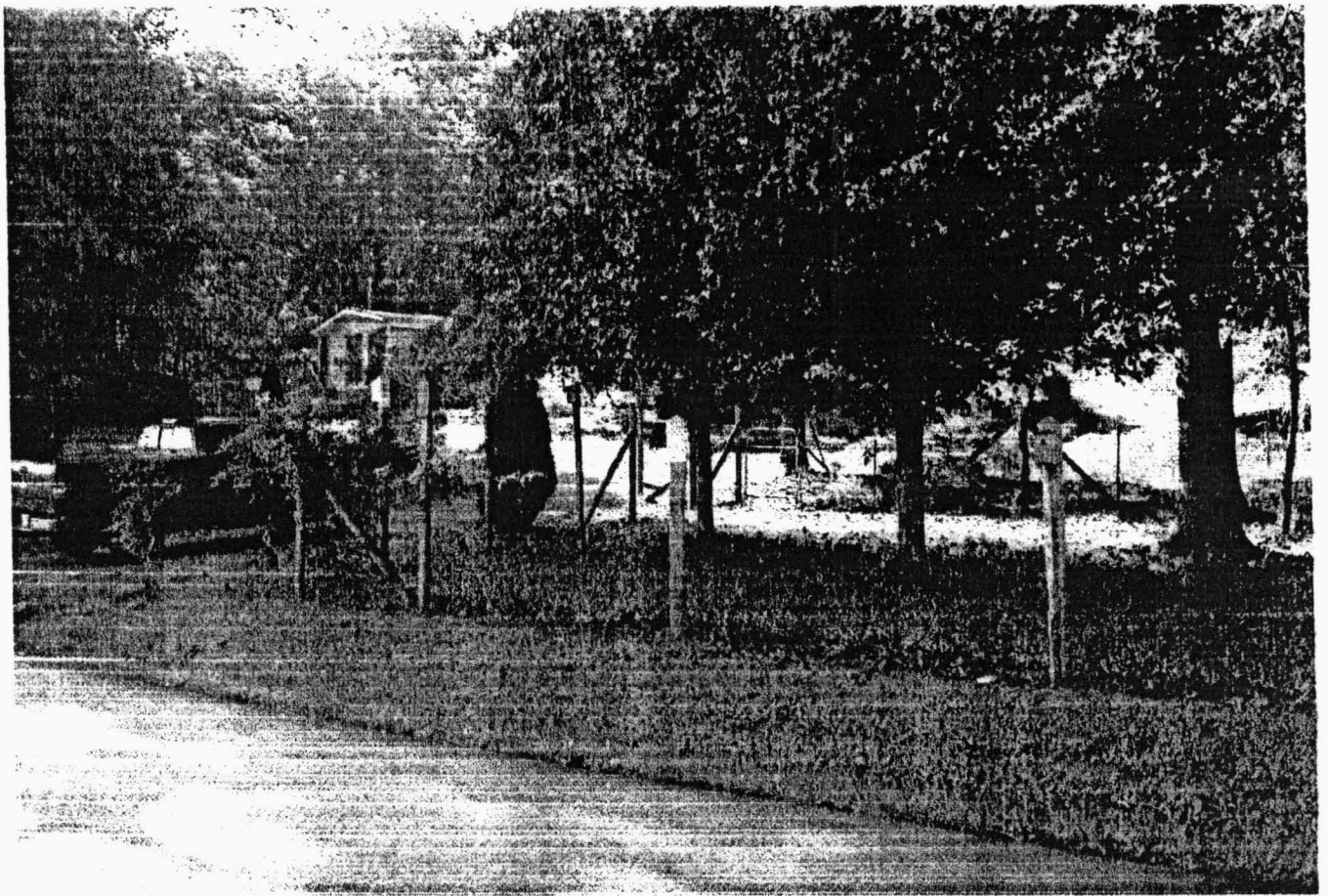
