PUBLIC HEARING

Proposed Budget for Loudon County Government Fiscal Year Ending June 30.

Mayor Doyle Arp stated that Mr Headlee had came by the office this morning and stated that they had been working on the Budget and have gotten within \$400,000 of what the County had offer to do. My Recommendation based on that statement is that the budget be passed tonight with the provision, once all the funding comes back to the schools. That we have the Teachers hold to the county money. Be careful of what you ask for – not a lot of money

Director of Schools, Edward Headlee, requested that in consideration of Workshop Monday evening, we ask that you do not set a tax rate until the Board is able to go thru the budget item by item.

Wendy Baustion, questioned how will you use the wheel tax money and what is our plans, goals, and priority.

Richard Truitt spoke on Salaries and Insurance. Requested to look at other counties that are of comparable size.

Shirley Harrison spoke against increasing the tax rate and a wheel tax; should be on the ballot. Also stated that for citizen 65 years and older, that there should be available a freeze on property tax.

Dana Zehner stated that the propose increase on the employee insurance has not been discussed in an open meeting. This should be brought up in a meeting with a representative from each department for discussion.

Sheriff Tim Guider would like to see the proposed increase on the employee insurance be tabled and a committee be brought together. Everyone needs to be informed.

Pat Hunter expressed concerns on the budget, county salaries and the use of county vehicles.

AGREEMENT REGARDING USE OF OFF-DUTY DEPUTY AND PATROL CAR

This Agreement regarding Use of Off-Duty Deputy and Patrol Car (this "Agreement") is entered into as of this ______ day of ________, 2008, by and between LOUDON COUNTY (the "County"), the LOUDON COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT (the "Sheriff's Department") and ______ ("Contractor").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Contractor desires to contract directly with one or more off-duty deputies employed by the Sheriff's Department (each an "Off-Duty Deputy") for traffic control and/or for security at a special event; and

WHEREAS, Contractor desires to utilize, as necessary, one or more Sheriff's Department patrol cars (each a "Patrol Car") in conjunction with the use of said Off-Duty Deputy(ies); and

WHEREAS, subject to the terms and conditions hereof, the Sheriff's Department is willing to supply the Contractor a list of deputies who are willing to be engaged by Contractor for traffic control and/or for security for special events; and

WHEREAS, subject to the terms and conditions hereof, the Sheriff's Department is willing to rent a Patrol Car to the Contractor for such Off-Duty Deputy's use during such engagements by Contractor.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of their mutual promises and undertakings and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties, intending to be legally bound, agree as follows:

- 1. Provision of List. The Sheriff's Department shall provide to Contractor, upon Contractor's request, a list of Sheriff's Department deputies who have indicated a willingness to be engaged by private companies for traffic control and/or for security at special events. Contractor acknowledges and agrees that if/when it engages an Off-Duty Deputy, (i) the Off-Duty Deputy is not serving as an employee or agent of the Sheriff's Department or the County but instead is serving as an employee, contractor or agent of Contractor, (ii) Contractor shall be solely responsible for compensation to the Off-Duty Deputy and issuance of either a Form W-2 or Form 1099, as applicable, to the Off-Duty Deputy for such compensation, and (iii) Contractor shall be solely responsible for any Workers' Compensation or liability claims incurred by the Off-Duty Deputy while engaged by Contractor.
- 2. <u>Use of Patrol Car</u>. Upon the reasonable request of Contractor and subject to availability, the Sheriff's Department shall provide a Patrol Car to Contractor for use by an Off-Duty Deputy during periods of engagement of such Off-Duty Deputy by Contractor. Contractor shall pay to the County <u>ONE HUNDED</u> Dollars (\$\frac{100}{000}\$) [to be completed by County] per diem for use of each Patrol Car. The checks shall be mailed to Loudon County c/o Finance Department, 100 River Road #109, Loudon, TN 37774-1042
- 3. <u>Insurance</u>. Contractor shall, at its expense, secure and shall at all times it is engaging an Off-Duty Deputy and/or using a Patrol Car, maintain a minimum of Ore Million Dollars (\$\frac{1}{2000,000} \cdots \
 - 4. Indemnification. Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold the County and the

Sheriff's Department and their successors and assigns harmless from and against any and all damages, claims, suits, liabilities, fines, penalties, costs, losses, diminution in value, deficiencies, and expenses (including without limitation reasonable counsel fees and litigation expenses) of any kind or nature whatsoever, whether or not involving a third-party claim (collectively "Damages") which may be sustained or suffered by the County or the Sheriff's Department arising from or related to Contractor's engagement of an Off-Duty Deputy, the services provided by an Off-Duty Deputy pursuant to such engagement and/or the use of a Patrol Car for the benefit of Contractor.

Miscellaneous. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the transactions contemplated by this Agreement and supersedes all prior written or unwritten arrangements or understandings with respect thereto. All parties represent that they are not relying on any representation, statement, or action by any other party except as expressly stated herein. The descriptive headings of this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not be construed to have any effect or meaning with respect to the content of such terms. In the event that any provisions of this Agreement shall be held invalid, unenforceable or void for any reason, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected, said provisions being severable. The failure of either party to require performance by the other of any provision hereunder shall in no way affect the full right to require such performance at any time thereafter, nor shall the waiver by either party of a breach of any provision hereof be taken or held to be a waiver of any succeeding breach of such provision or as a waiver of the provisions themselves. Neither party shall assign its rights in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns, heirs, beneficiaries, fiduciaries, personal representatives, and executors. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, and each such counterpart hereof shall be deemed to be an original instrument. This Agreement is made and delivered in Loudon County, Tennessee, shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the substantive, internal laws of the State of Tennessee without giving effect to conflict of laws principles thereof, and shall not be construed strictly against the drafter thereof. This Agreement may not be modified, amended, or revoked, except in a writing signed by all parties. In the event this Agreement is placed in the hands of an attorney for enforcement, or if the County or the Sheriff's Department incurs any costs incident to the enforcement of this Agreement, Contractor agrees to pay reasonable attorney's fees, all court and other costs, and the reasonable costs of any other enforcement efforts. This provision may not be orally waived.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties acknowledge that they have read, understand and agree to all of the provisions of this Agreement and have executed this Agreement on the day and year first above written.

County Vehicles

Section 6.15

Employees assigned or using a County vehicle must adhere to the following policy. County vehicles are to be used to conduct official County business only, except for minimum personal use (example: stopping for lunch or stopping at a store in route to and from work).

All employees assigned a County vehicle must meet the I.R.S. regulations and have a valid Tennessee driver's license. Any traffic violation or arrest in a County vehicle must be reported immediately to the Department Head, and employees may be disciplined or barred from driving County vehicles if the circumstances surrounding the arrest or violation indicate a possible threat to public safety. No passengers other than County employees are permitted unless they are being transported for County purposes, or as specifically authorized by the County Mayor or supervising County official.

Employees who are driving or riding in County vehicles must wear seat belts at all times. Should an employee be involved in an accident, the employee should secure all pertinent information at the scene of the accident and report it to the Department Head. Under no circumstances should liability be admitted or payment of any kind be made to any person or company. In case of bodily injury to anyone, an employee should immediately call his or her supervising County official or Department Head.

Any violation of this section may result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination.

Employees who operate County or personal vehicles or equipment as part of their job duties must be insurable under the County's insurance policies with the County's insurance carriers. Any traffic violation, criminal arrest or other action, on or off-duty, which results in the loss of insurance coverage for the employee or increased risk or premiums may result in termination of employment.

Employees of the Loudon County Sheriff's Department who are assigned or who operate a County vehicle may use such vehicle in secondary employment only upon the prior written approval of the Sheriff and only upon the execution by the secondary employer of a written agreement with the County setting forth the terms upon which a County vehicle may be used in the secondary employment. During times of engagement by a secondary employer, an employee is voluntarily working solely for the secondary employer and not as a County or Sheriff's Department employee. An employee's voluntary work for the secondary employer is not counted as hours worked for the County or the Sheriff's Department. The Sheriff's Department will not be responsible for any Workers' Compensation or liability claim incurred while an employee is engaged by a secondary employer. Furthermore, during periods of secondary employment, the employee shall not act in any manner which would imply that any services performed for a private individual or company are, in fact, being carried out as part of the employee's official duties.

WHEREAS, it now appears that the budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, of Loudon County, Tennessee will not be approved by the third Monday in July as required by T.C.A. 5-12-109 (b)(1);

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: the amounts set out in the budget for the 2007-2008 fiscal year, are hereby continued until the complete budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008 is adopted; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that, if applicable, the property tax rate as adopted for the prior fiscal year shall remain in effect until a new property tax rate is adopted; and,

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on tax anticipation notes, not exceeding 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund represented by the continuing budget, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenues for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, have been collected. Such notes shall first be approved by the State Director of Local Finance. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the authority of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. All of said notes shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30 of the fiscal year in which they are issued.
